What's Happening?

For the second consecutive season, the first match of the Southeastern Conference slate includes Florida. The Gators are at Kentucky on Thursday, Sept. 8 to kick off SEC Network coverage of league soccer. Match time is set for 7 p.m. at the Wendell & Vickie Bell Soccer Complex. Gator Great Heather Mitts and Jenn Hildreth will call the action.

In the opening week of September, Florida's two-match road weekend ended up with just a single contest. The anticipated No. 5 Florida at No. 1 Florida State match set for Friday, Sept. 2 was cancelled due to the impact of Hurricane Hermine on the Tallahassee area. The Gators' only match of the weekend was Sunday at Oklahoma State. After a scoreless opening half, Florida exploded with a school-record seven goal half to take a 7-2 win. Three Gators turned in a pair of goals Sunday – Melanie Monteagudo, Mayra Pelayo and Savannah Jordan. For the two sophomores, it was the first multi-goal match of their collegiate career, while Jordan turned in her 18th. Florida freshman Kit Loferski also scored her first collegiate goal Sunday.

Today's match is the fourth of a five-match road stretch for the Gators. Before the UF-FSU cancellation on Sept. 2, the road stretch was to be six matches, equaling the longest stretch in the program's history (also six straight road matches in 1999, 2002, 2014). During this now five-match road swing, the Gators will travel more than 11,400 miles.

When the two teams met last season, the Gators tied Kentucky 1-1 2OT at Pressly Stadium. Florida outshot the Wildcats 27-6, but couldn't find another goal to go with the header Jordan scored off a Christen Westphal corner kick in the 41st minute. The Gators will be looking for its first win in Lexington since 2010 on Thursday, as UF lost in its last two visits (2012, 2-1 and 2014, 2-0).

Already this season, Jordan has moved to the top three on two UF career charts. Her 71 goals advances her into a tie for second with Andi Sellers on Florida's career goals chart. Her six points at Oklahoma State moved her into sole possession of third with 166 career points.

The 2016 Gator team is made up of 39 players, making it the largest team in the program's 22-year history (previous high: 37 in 2010). Among the roster are 16 newcomers, including 13 freshmen, which is the program's fourth largest. Florida returns eight starters from the 2015 team that swept the Southeastern Conference titles and advanced to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen.

Three on the 2016 Florida team have earned All-SEC honors. Three-time All-American forward Savannah Jordan also is a three-time All-SEC first-team selection and has twice been named the SEC Offensive Player of the Year (2013, 2015). Fellow senior Meggie Dougherty Howard was a 2015 All-SEC second team selection at midfield. In addition, redshirt junior Gabby Seiler was a 2014 All-SEC first-team selection while with Georgia. She sat out last season due to SEC transfer rules.

Florida opened the 2016 season at No. 7 on the NSCAA preseason poll. It is the 20th consecutive UF appearance on the NSCAA preseason poll and the fourth straight top-10 listing. Florida faces five teams NSCAA preseason top 25, with four on the road – No. 1 Florida State (Sept. 2-cancelled), No. 5 Stanford (Aug. 26/1-0 OT loss), No. 22 Mississippi (Oct. 9) and No. 24 South Carolina (Oct. 16). Florida plays host to No. 12 Auburn on Sept. 22. UCLA was No. 15 for Aug. 28 match (4-3 OT win).

Kentucky and UF have met one common opponent, as the Gators defeated South Florida 2-1 in 2016 preseason action and Kentucky lost 3-2 in Aug. 25 home action. Last weekend, Kentucky won 3-1 at Louisville and won 3-0 Sunday versus High Point. Kentucky was picked to take seventh in the 2016 SEC Coaches preseason poll. Evangeline Soucie is current SEC Freshman of Week after 10 saves in last weekend's wins, including a career-high six saves at Louisville..

About the 2016 Gators

The 2016 Gator team is made up 39 players – an all-time high in the programs 22-year history. Among the 16 newcomers are 13 freshmen, which is the fourth-largest for the program. Florida returns eight starters from the 2015 team that swept the Southeastern Conference titles and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16.

Three on the 2016 Florida team have earned All-SEC honors. Three-time All-American forward Savannah Jordan is also a three-time All-SEC first-team selection and has twice been named the SEC Offensive Player of the Year (2013, 2015). Fellow senior Meggie Dougherty Howard was a 2015 All-SEC second team selection at midfield. In addition, redshirt junior Gabby Seiler was a 2014 All-SEC first-team selection while with Georgia. She transferred to UF after the 2014 season and sat out last season due to SEC transfer rules.

- Fourteen of the 17 Gators who earned points in 2015 return this season. Of the 178 points generated by the 2015 Gators, graduation claimed three players who contributed 24 points and three goals - Christen Westphal (3 goals, 13 assists – 19 points), Lauren Smith (3 a – 3 pts) and Claire Falknor (1 a – 1 pt).
- Jordan has led not only the Gators in goals and points the last three years, she's also ranked among the SEC and NCAA leaders. In the final 2015 NCAA stats, Jordan ranked No. 2 in goals (24) and points (55). Her three-year career total of 65 goals equals Gator Great [Abby Wambach's](#) freshman, sophomore and junior total.
- Dougherty Howard shared the Washington Spirit Reserves goals lead (5) in this summer's action. The team won the 2016 Women's Premier Soccer League (WPSL) East title. Sophomore Melanie Monteagudo (FC Surge) also led her team in goals (6). Other current Gators in 2016 WPSL action this summer included Nelson (Washington Spirit Reserves), Seiler, Brooke Sharp and Sarah Troccoli (Florida SOL FC) and Briana Solis (Florida Krush).
- Gators were busy in the off season with various national team activities. A total of seven returning Gators were called into U.S. Age-Group National Team or tournaments since the conclusion of last season. Sophomore Gaby Rivera also was called into Mexico Under-20 National Team events.
- Three join Florida as transfers (Erika Nelson/Maryland; Parker Roberts/Kansas; Gabby Seiler/Georgia) with Nelson and Seiler competing for the Gators in 2016.

Thirteen freshmen join the Gators in 2016

The 13 freshmen make up the fourth-largest class ever for UF. It is the second consecutive year Florida has brought in a large class, as the 2015 class of 15 was the third largest in the program's history.

- Sammie Better, Julia Lester and current sophomore Gator goalkeeper Kaylan Marckese teamed up on the Tampa Bay United 97 Premier to win the 2015 [US Youth Soccer National U-17 Championship in Tulsa, Okla.](#), last summer. Lester joined Marckese on the tournament's [Best XI team](#).
- Tess Sapone is the [2016 Virginia Gatorade Player of the Year](#). Lester is a 2016 NSCAA High School All-American.
- Among the 13 freshman are a pair - Alyssa Baumbick and Susi Espinoza – who have been called into U.S. age-group national camps over their careers. Baumbick attended several U.S. Youth Team camps, including each of the four Under-19 camps held in 2015. Espinoza was part of U.S. U14 Girls National Team in 2012 and part of 2013 U.S. U15 player pool.
- All have extensive playing resumes in Elite Clubs Soccer League (ECLN), Olympic Development Program or US Youth Soccer competition.
- Two graduated from high school early to join the Gators. Hope Hyde of Dallas, Texas, and Jocelyn Nelson of Barnsdall, Okla., each finished their high school studies in December 2015, allowing them to enroll at the University of Florida for the spring 2016 semester.
- Two graduated at the top of their high school classes and are enrolled in University of Florida Honors classes - Sammie Better and Danielle Van Liere.

The University of Florida is picked to defend its Southeastern Conference title in the 2016 league coaches' preseason vote.

The Gators received 165 points that included 10 first-place votes, topping Texas A&M's 154 points (four first-place votes).

Florida swept SEC regular-season and tournament titles in 2015. The Gators took their 14th SEC title with an 8-2-1 record and claimed the program's 11th SEC Tournament title with a 2-1 win over Texas A&M in the final.

Three Gators have earned All-SEC honors during their careers. Three-time All-American forward [Savannah Jordan](#) is also a three-time All-SEC first-team selection and has twice been named the SEC Offensive Player of the Year (2013, 2015). Fellow senior [Meggie Dougherty Howard](#) was a 2015 All-SEC second team selection at midfield. In addition, redshirt junior [Gabby Seiler](#) was a 2014 All-SEC first-team selection while with Georgia. She sat out 2015 action due to SEC transfer rules.

Seven Goal Half Sets Florida Record

After a scoreless opening half at Oklahoma State on Sept. 4, the Gators got their first goal in the 48th minute. That goal from sophomore Melanie Monteagudo was the first of seven for Florida, as the Gators took a 7-2 win.

It was the first time that Florida scored seven in a half in the program's 22-year history. Eight times, Florida has scored six goals in a half, with the last coming in an Oct. 26, 2001 home win versus Mississippi State (6-0). Only once has Florida scored six goals on the road and that was a 7-2 win at No. 20 Maryland on Oct. 21, 1998.

Florida last scored seven goals in a match in a 7-2 win at Kansas on Sept. 18, 2011. The Gators have turned in seven or more goals in a match 19 times in the program's history.

Burleigh Career Wins Total Among Nation's Best

Becky Burleigh stands among the nation's top three active coaches for wins and winning percentage.

She enters the 2016 season with a 26-year record of 455-121-37 (0.772). She stands at No. 3 in both wins (455) and winning percentage (0.772) among the NCAA Division I Active Coaches.

She is the only woman among the top five on either chart.

Smart Gators

The University of Florida soccer program posted a 3.39 grade point average for the 2014-15 academic year, earning the squad a spot in the 2015 National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Team Academic Award. Programs with a 3.0 or better GPA are named to the annual list.

GAINESVILLE, Fla. – The 2016 season opened for the University of Florida soccer team with a 5-2 win over Iowa State Friday evening in front of a James G. Pressly Stadium crowd of 1,293.

Gators' 2016 scoring started with a give-and-go play. Sophomore Mayra Pelayo sent the ball to Savannah Jordan, who was standing with back to goal at top of the 18-yard box. Pelayo continued her run into the box, receiving the ball back off a one-touch from Jordan. She moved deeper in the box before sending a curling 10-yard shot which scored at the upper far post corner.

Florida's second goal came shortly before halftime. Senior Betsy Middleton received the ball off a throw-in at the top of the Cyclones final defensive third. She sent the ball across to sophomore Melanie Monteagudo, located just above the far side of the 18-yard box. She took a touch, looked up and launched a left-footed 22-yard shot that just went under the crossbar to score in the 42nd minute. It was her first goal as a Gator.

Two goals in less than two minutes pushed the Gators lead out to 4-0 early in the second half. Gabby Seiler sent the ball to Jordan, who was just inside the top of the Cyclone box. She immediately touched the ball back to just above the box to find sophomore Sarah Troccoli. The 20-yard shot off Troccoli's left foot dipped under the crossbar to score in the 48th minute.

A pair of senior combined to score the next Gator goal in the 49th minute. Pelayo passed the ball to Jordan in the middle of the ISU box. Jordan took a touch toward top of the 18-yard box and then sent it to Dougherty Howard, who had moved to just above the box. Dougherty Howard took a touch toward goal before scoring on a 16-yard shot.

The Cyclones closed the lead to two after scoring twice within a 10-minute span. Senior Koree Willer scored ISU's first goal of the season at 53:58 off an assist from Mia McAleer. Then Klasey Medelberg scored off a 26-yard shot in the 63rd minute.

Jordan scored on an unassisted goal from eight yards in the 68th minute to give the Gators the final margin. That goal was No. 66 of her career, moving her into a tie for third on the Gators career goal list with Danielle Fotopoulos. She also moved up one spot to a tie for fifth with Sarah Yohe on UF's Career Points list at 153.

Worth Noting

- Pelayo also scored the Gators' first goal in the 2015 opener at UCF. She used her left foot to score her first collegiate goal in the 32nd minute off a 22-yard shot.
- Jordan has scored a goal in each of her four season-opening matches. Her career total of 66 goals is the most among the nation's current players.
- Tonight is the 12th time a Gator has recorded three or more assists in a match. Jordan is the first with three assists since Annie Speese's trio versus Florida Gulf Coast on Sept. 11, 2011.
- This is the first time since the 2001 season that Florida has recorded 30 shots in a match.
- This is the most goals for the Gators in an opening match since Florida's 5-2 win over Utah in 2001.
- Florida's starting lineup included one true freshman – Julia Lester. At least one Gator freshman has started 17 of the program's 22 season openers. Also among the starting Gators are two other newcomers. Erika Nelson transferred from Maryland and will play her redshirt senior year at UF. Gabby Seiler joined Florida in the fall of 2015 after playing her first two seasons at Georgia. She sat out the 2015 season due to Southeastern Conference transfer rules.

With today's win at the James G. Pressly Stadium, the Gators now own a 200-32-12 record in home play in the program's 22-year history,

How the Gators Scored:

All the scoring of the match came in the opening half. Sophomore Melanie Monteagudo played a part in each of Florida's first two goals Sunday. She needed just 36 seconds to score after entering the match midway in the opening half. Savannah Jordan received the ball off a throw-in and her touch popped the ball to open space just above the six-yard box. Monteagudo pounced on the free ball and placed it in from eight yards in the 24th minute.

The Gators were awarded their first penalty kick of the season when Monteagudo was upended by FAU's Alex Mason. Senior Meggie Dougherty Howard successfully converted the penalty kick in the 29th minute.

Florida's final goal came with just a second left in the opening half. Jordan received the ball after making a run down the right side and she moved toward goal. FAU goalkeeper Sydney Drinkwater came out to make the stop and the two collided in the box. Drinkwater was given a red card and Jennifer Ocampo replaced her in goal. She deflected Jordan's penalty kick attempt, but Jordan put in the rebound to give UF a 3-0 halftime lead.

Worth Noting

- After this weekend's action, Jordan has moved into sole possession of third on Florida's Career Goals chart at 67. Her goal on Friday moved her into a tie for third with Gator Great Danielle Fotopoulos. Jordan's three points today (1 goal, 1 assist) now moves her into a tie with Fotopoulos for fourth on the Gators Career Points list at 156 (Jordan: 67g, 22a = 156 pts).
- All three Gator goal scorers today – Monteagudo, Dougherty Howard and Jordan - also turned in a goal in Friday's 5-2 win over Iowa State.
- Jordan's score with just one second remaining is the latest opening half goal in the program's history. The previous latest goal came at 44:58 off Nicky Kit's free kick goal at South Carolina on Oct. 29, 2010. That 1-0 win gave the Gators the 2010 Southeastern Conference title.
- For the second consecutive match, 21 players appeared in the game for Florida.
- Florida Head Coach Becky Burleigh has led the Gator program since its debut match on Sept. 2, 1995 (4-0 home win over Florida State). The Gator program is now 375-98-31 in the program's 22-year history.

LOS ANGELES, Calif. – A goal in the 96th minute put a successful finish on the University of Florida soccer team's California trip Sunday. That goal gave the Gators a 4-3 overtime win at UCLA in front of 1,018 fans at Marshall Field at Drake Stadium.

The Gators also went to overtime Friday at No. 3 Stanford, losing 1-0 when the Cardinal scored – also in the 96th minute.

How the Match Unfolded:

Gator senior All-American Savannah Jordan played a role in goals scored in each period Sunday – first, second and overtime.

The decisive goal started when Gabby Seiler sent a ball from the Gator half to Jordan's feet just inside the Bruin half. Jordan ran down along the right sideline, bypassing one defender and then evading another as she moved into the box. Jordan attempted a square ball to Sarah Troccoli who was making a run through the middle of the UCLA box. That pass deflected off a Bruin defender into goal to end the match.

Jordan scored the first goal early in the match. Freshman Julie Lester's cross from deep in the Bruins defensive third was headed in by Jordan in the third minute. She also scored on a diving header in the 73rd minute. Senior defender Erika Nelson sent a 35-yard ball into the box, which Jordan placed in with her head.

The Bruins also scored early Sunday. Darian Jenkins' high cross was scored at the lower corner off Annie Alvarado's diving header in the fifth minute.

Sarah Troccoli's goal in the 17th minute started with a free kick. Meggie Dougherty sent the ball to just above the six-yard box where it deflected off Gabby Seiler and then Troccoli placed it in.

Two scores by Jessie Fleming within a four-minute span put the Bruins in the lead. Fleming headed in a cross from Zoey Garalski in the 65th minute. Shortly later, the Bruins were awarded a penalty kick and Fleming placed it in to give UCLA a 3-2 lead at 68:35.

Early in the second half, the Bruins looked to knot the score when they were awarded a penalty kick in the 52nd minute. Gator goalkeeper Kaylan Marckese dived to her right and made the stop on Lauren Kaskie's attempt.

Worth Noting

- Jordan's two goals Sunday gives her four in 2016. With the Sunday goals, Jordan moves into a tie for third with Melissa Pini (1995-98) at 160 on Florida's Career Point chart. She is third on Florida's Career Goals chart at 69.
- Troccoli's goal was her second of 2016. Two defenders recorded their first assist as a Gator Sunday. Lester received the assist on Jordan's first goal and Nelson assisted on Jordan's second goal.
- The Bruins received two penalty kicks Sunday. The first came in the 52nd minute. Florida goalkeeper dived to her right and made the stop on Lauren Kaskie's attempt.
- This was the fourth consecutive overtime match for Florida when it visited the Golden State. The other three all came at Stanford – 1-0 OT loss (2014), 2-2 2OT tie (2014-NCAA Quarterfinal – SU advanced on penalty kicks) and 1-0 OT loss (2016).

STILLWATER, Okla. – Goals were aplenty Sunday afternoon as the University of Florida soccer team put in seven goals to take a 7-2 win over Oklahoma State at the Cowboy Soccer Complex.

How the Match Unfolded:

It was a tale of two halves. After a scoreless opening half, sophomore Melanie Monteagudo put in her first goal of the day in the 48th minute. Just under five minutes later, senior All-American Savannah Jordan used a 20-yard shot to score her first goal of the day. Less than three minutes later, Monteagudo put in a ball mishandled by the OSU goalkeeper to put the Gators up 3-0 after an eight-minute scoring flurry.

OSU Courtney Dike scored at 63:06, but Gator freshman Kit Loferski scored her first collegiate goal just 50 seconds later to push the lead back out to three goals.

Jordan scored her second goal of the day in the 68th minute. That goal was the 71st of her collegiate career, moving her into a tie with Andi Sellers (1997-01) for second on the Gators Career Goals Chart.

Another Cowgirl goal, this time from Haley Woodard, finished the OSU scoring in the 79th minute. OSU's Elise Hawn received a red card at 79:11, forcing the Cowgirls to play the final 10 minutes a man down.

Sophomore Mayra Pelayo scored the final two goals of the match. Her first goal in the 80th minute was a 19-yard free kick awarded on the red card and then she hit an angled shot in the 88th minute.

Worth Noting

- Seven goals in a half is a first in the 22-year history of the Gator program. Eight times, Florida has scored six goals in a half, with the last coming in an Oct. 26, 2001 home win versus Mississippi State (6-0). Only once has Florida scored six goals on the road and that was a 7-2 win at No. 20 Maryland on Oct. 21, 1998.
- Three Gators turned in a pair of goals Sunday – Monteagudo, Jordan and Pelayo. It was the first multiple goal matches of Monteagudo and Pelayo's collegiate careers, Jordan has turned in multi-goal matches 18 times as a Gator.
- Jordan's two goals and two assists Sunday moved her into sole possession of third on the Gators Career Points Chart at 166 (71 goals, 24 assists). She is also tied for second on the Gator Career Goals Chart at 71. The Gators' career leader for goals and points is Abby Wambach (1998-01, 96 goals, 242 points).
- Today's match is the third of a five match road stretch for Florida. The Gators were to play at No. 1 Florida State Friday, but Hurricane Hermine's impact on the Tallahassee area caused the match to be canceled.
