## What's Happening?

Florida continues road action Sunday when it is at Oklahoma State. Match time is set for 1 p.m. ET at Cowgirl Soccer Complex. The Gators' Friday night match at No. 1 Florida State was cancelled due to impact Hurricane Hermine made in the north Florida region.

Florida split its two overtime matches in the Golden State last weekend. The weekend opened with a 1-0 OT loss at Stanford. On Sunday, the Gators took a 4-3 OT win at No. 15 UCLA. **Savannah Jordan** played a role in each Gator goal scored in each period. Both of her goals in regulation were off headers, scoring the first goal of the match and then tying at 3-all in the 73<sup>rd</sup> minute. In overtime, Jordan took the pass from **Gabby Seiler** and drove through the Bruin half. Her cross in the box deflected off a Bruin defender, scoring in the 96<sup>th</sup> minute. **Sarah Troccoli** also scored in the first half.

Today's match puts Florida past the midway point of a five-match road stretch for the Gators. Before the UF-FSU cancellation, the road stretch was to be six matches, equaling the longest stretch in the program's history (also six straight road matches in 1999, 2002, 2014). During this now five-match road swing, the Gators will travel more than 11,400 miles.

The Gators and Cowgirls meet for the fourth consecutive season. In the 2015 meeting in Gainesville, Oklahoma State scored in the third minute but the first goals of the season from **Brooke Sharp** and **Liz Slattery** gave the Gators a 2-1 halftime lead. The Cowgirls tied the match in the 66<sup>th</sup> minute, pushing Florida to overtime. Sharp jumped on a deflected ball loose in the box to score the winner off a low, right-footed shot with just 19 second remaining in the first OT to give UF the 3-2 win. Sunday's match is a homecoming for Gators redshirt junior defender **Kristen Cardano**, who attending Jenks High School in Tulsa, Okla., which is 65 miles east of Stillwater.

Already this season, Jordan has moved to the top three on two UF career charts. Her 69 goals moved her past Gator Great **Danielle Fotopoulos** to third on Florida's career goal chart. She now is tied for third with **Melissa Pini** with 160 career points.

The 2016 Gator team is made up of 39 players, making it the largest team in the program's 22-year history (previous high: 37 in 2010). Among the roster are 16 newcomers, including 13 freshmen, which is the program's fourth largest. Florida returns eight starters from the 2015 team that swept the Southeastern Conference titles and advanced to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen.

Three on the 2016 Florida team have earned All-SEC honors. Three-time All-American forward **Savannah Jordan** also is a three-time All-SEC first-team selection and has twice been named the SEC Offensive Player of the Year (2013, 2015). Fellow senior **Meggie Dougherty Howard** was a 2015 All-SEC second team selection at midfield. In addition, redshirt junior **Gabby Seiler** was a 2014 All-SEC first-team selection while with Georgia. She sat out last season due to SEC transfer rules.

Florida opened the 2016 season at No. 7 on the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) preseason poll. It is the 20th consecutive Florida appearance on the NSCAA preseason poll and the fourth straight top-10 listing. Florida faces five teams NSCAA preseason top 25, with four on the road – No. 1 Florida State (Sept. 2-cancelled), No. 5 Stanford (Aug. 26/1-0 OT loss), No. 22 Mississippi (Oct. 9) and No. 24 South Carolina (Oct. 16). Florida plays host to No. 12 Auburn on Sept. 22. UCLA was No. 15 when the teams met Aug. 28 (4-3 OT win).

Oklahoma State has already faced two SEC opponents, defeating preseason No. 8 Texas A&M 2-0 in an Aug. 13 exhibition and then opened the season with a 2-2 2OT tie at Georgia. Friday, OSU lost 3-2 OT to Central Florida Friday in Stillwater. Oklahoma State is picked to take fifth in the 2016 Big 12. Two Cowgirl seniors appear on the Big 12 Preseason team – forward Courtney Dike and defender Natalie Calhoun.

#### What's Next?

Florida continues road action Thursday, Sept. 8 when it plays Kentucky (0-2-1) in Lexington, Ky. Match time is set for 7 p.m. ET at the Wendell & Vickie Bell Soccer Complex. This match kicks off SEC Network soccer coverage for the 2016 season.

Last year, the two teams tied 1-1 2OT in Gainesville. Florida has lost in its last two trips to Lexington – 2014 (2-0) and 2012 (2-1).

The match can be heard on ESPN 95.3FM/850AM.

#### About the 2016 Gators

The 2016 Gator team is made up 39 players – an all-time high in the programs 22-year history. Among the 16 newcomers are 13 freshmen, which is the fourth-largest for the program. Florida returns eight starters from the 2015 team that swept the Southeastern Conference titles and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16.

Three on the 2016 Florida team have earned All-SEC honors. Three-time All-American forward Savannah Jordan is also a three-time All-SEC first-team selection and has twice been named the SEC Offensive Player of the Year (2013, 2015). Fellow senior Meggie Dougherty Howard was a 2015 All-SEC second team selection at midfield. In addition, redshirt junior Gabby Seiler was a 2014 All-SEC first-team selection while with Georgia. She transferred to UF after the 2014 season and sat out last season due to SEC transfer rules.

- Fourteen of the 17 Gators who earned points in 2015 return this season. Of the 178 points generated by the 2015 Gators, graduation claimed three players who contributed 24 points and three goals - Christen Westphal (3 goals, 13 assists – 19 points), Lauren Smith (3 a – 3 pts) and Claire Falknor (1 a – 1 pt).
- Jordan has led not only the Gators in goals and points the last three years, she's also ranked among the SEC and NCAA leaders. In the final 2015 NCAA stats, Jordan ranked No. 2 in goals (24) and points (55). Her three-year career total of 65 goals equals Gator Great <u>Abby Wambach's</u> freshman, sophomore and junior total.
- Dougherty Howard shared the Washington Spirit Reserves goals lead (5) in this summer's action. The team won the 2016 Women's Premier Soccer League (WPSL) East title. Sophomore Melanie Monteagudo (FC Surge) also led her team in goals (6). Other current Gators in 2016 WPSL action this summer included Nelson (Washington Spirit Reserves), Seiler, Brooke Sharp and Sarah Troccoli (Florida SOL FC) and Briana Solis (Florida Krush).
- Gators were busy in the off season with various national team activities. A total
  of seven returning Gators were called into U.S. Age-Group National Team or
  tournaments since the conclusion of last season. Sophomore Gaby Rivera also
  was called into Mexico Under-20 National Team events.
- Three join Florida as transfers (Erika Nelson/Maryland; Parker Roberts/Kansas; Gabby Seiler/Georgia) with Nelson and Seiler competing for the Gators in 2016.

#### Thirteen freshmen join the Gators in 2016

The 13 freshmen make up the fourth-largest class ever for UF. It is the second consecutive year Florida has brought in a large class, as the 2015 class of 15 was the third largest in the program's history.

- Sammie Betters, Julia Lester and current sophomore Gator goalkeeper Kaylan Marckese teamed up on the Tampa Bay United 97 Premier to win the 2015 <u>US Youth Soccer National U-17 Championship in Tulsa, Okla.</u>, last summer. Lester joined Marckese on the tournament's <u>Best XI team</u>.
- Tess Sapone is the <u>2016 Virginia Gatorade Player of the Year</u>. Lester is a 2016 NSCAA High School All-American.
- Among the 13 freshman are a pair Alyssa Baumbick and Susi Espinoza –
  who have been called into U.S. age-group national camps over their careers.
  Baumbick attended several U.S. Youth Team camps, including each of the four
  Under-19 camps held in 2015. Espinoza was part of U.S. U14 Girls National
  Team in 2012 and part of 2013 U.S. U15 player pool.
- All have extensive playing resumes in Elite Clubs Soccer League (ECNL), Olympic Development Program or US Youth Soccer competition.
- Two graduated from high school early to join the Gators. Hope Hyde of Dallas, Texas, and Jocelyn Nelson of Barnsdall, Okla., each finished their high school studies in December 2015, allowing them to enroll at the University of Florida for the spring 2016 semester.
- Two graduated at the top of their high school classes and are enrolled in University of Florida Honors classes - Sammie Betters and Danielle Van Liere.

#### Florida Picked to Win SEC

The University of Florida is picked to defend its Southeastern Conference title in the 2016 league coaches' preseason vote.

The Gators received 165 points that included 10 first-place votes, topping Texas A&M's 154 points (four first-place votes).

Florida swept SEC regular-season and tournament titles in 2015. The Gators took their 14th SEC title with an 8-2-1 record and claimed the program's 11th SEC Tournament title with a 2-1 win over Texas A&M in the final.

Three Gators have earned All-SEC honors during their careers. Three-time All-American forward <u>Savannah Jordan</u> is also a three-time All-SEC first-team selection and has twice been named the SEC Offensive Player of the Year (2013, 2015). Fellow senior <u>Meggie Dougherty Howard</u> was a 2015 All-SEC second team selection at midfield. In addition, redshirt junior <u>Gabby Seiler</u> was a 2014 All-SEC first-team selection while with Georgia. She sat out 2015 action due to SEC transfer rules.

GAINESVILLE, Fla. - The 2016 season opened for the University of Florida soccer team with a 5-2 win over Iowa State Friday evening in front of a James G. Pressly Stadium crowd of 1,293.

Gators' 2016 scoring started with a give-and-go play. Sophomore Mayra Pelayo sent the ball to Savannah Jordan, who was standing with back to goal at top of the 18-yard box. Pelayo continued her run into the box, receiving the ball back off a one-touch from Jordan. She moved deeper in the box before sending a curling 10yard shot which scored at the upper far post corner.

Florida's second goal came shortly before halftime. Senior Betsy Middleton received the ball off a throw-in at the top of the Cyclones final defensive third. She sent the ball across to sophomore Melanie Monteagudo located just above the far side of the 18-yard box. She took a touch, looked up and launched a left-footed 22-yard shot that just went under the crossbar to score in the  $42^{\rm nd}$  minute. It was her first goal as a Gator.

Two goals in less than two minutes pushed the Gators lead out to 4-0 early in the second half. Gabby Seiler sent the ball to Jordan, who was just inside the top of the Cyclone box. She immediately touched the ball back to just above the box to find sophomore Sarah Troccoli. The 20-yard shot off Troccoli's left foot dipped under the crossbar to score in the 48th minute.

A pair of senior combined to score the next Gator goal in the 49th minute. Pelayo passed the ball to Jordan in the middle of the ISU box. Jordan took a touch toward top of the 18-yard box and then sent it to Dougherty Howard, who had moved to just above the box. Dougherty Howard took a touch toward goal before scoring on

The Cyclones closed the lead to two after scoring twice within a 10-minute span. Senior Koree Willer scored ISU's first goal of the season at 53:58 off an assist from Mia McAleer. Then Klasey Medelberg scored off a 26yard shot in the 63rd minute.

Jordan scored on an unassisted goal from eight yards in the 68th minute to give the Gators the final margin. That goal was No. 66 of her career, moving her into a tie for third on the Gators career goal list with Danielle Fotopoulos. She also moved up one spot to a tie for fifth with Sarah Yohe on UF's Career Points list at 153.

### Worth Noting

- Pelayo also scored the Gators' first goal in the 2015 opener at UCF. She used her left foot to
- score her first collegiate goal in the 32nd minute off a 22-yard shot.

  Jordan has scored a goal in each of her four season-opening matches. Her career total of 66 goals is the most among the nation's current players.
- Tonight is the 12th time a Gator has recorded three or more assists in a match. Jordan is the first with three assists since Annie Speese's trio versus Florida Gulf Coast on Sept. 11, 2011.
- This is the first time since the 2001 season that Florida has recorded 30 shots in a match
- This is the most goals for the Gators in an opening match since Florida's 5-2 win over Utah in 2001
- Florida's starting lineup included one true freshmen Julia Lester. At least one Gator freshman has started 17 of the program's 22 season openers. Also among the starting Gators are two other newcomers. Erika Nelson transferred from Maryland and will play her redshirt senior year at UF. Gabby Seiler joined Florida in the fall of 2015 after playing her first two seasons at Georgia. She sat out the 2015 season due to Southeastern Conference transfer rules.

PALO ALTO, Calif. - The University of Florida soccer team lost 1-0 in overtime Friday evening in front of 1,240 fans at Laird Q. Cagan Stadium.

It was the third consecutive meeting between the two teams that went to overtime, with the Cardinal taking two wins and one match ending in a tie

#### How the Match Unfolded:

Midfield play was prevalent Friday, as each team looked for an opening to reach their opponent's defensive third. Gator sophomore Kaylan Marckese made some key saves Friday, including five in the second half.

One of the Gators best opportunities came in the 76th minute when sophomore Melanie Monteagudo brought the ball down the left side. Her endline cross tried to find Savannah Jordan, who was making a near post run. Stanford goalkeeper Jane Campbell came out but couldn't gather the ball in and it was free just above the sixyard box. Senior Meggie Dougherty Howard was just a fraction away from getting to loose ball.

On the game-winning goal, a lofted ball was sent to the top of the Gators' box, SU's Kyra Carusa headed it forward to Jordan DiBiasi, who was located just above the six-vard box. A sliding Marckese stopped that shot but DiBiasi's right footed shot on the deflection scored at the far corner in the 96th minute.

#### Worth Noting

- These two teams have met three times at Cagan Stadium since the 2014 season. All three matches have gone to overtime, with the Cardinal taking the win twice. The 2014 NCAA Quarterfinal meeting ended in a 2-2 double overtime tie, but Stanford advanced to the NCAA College Cup on penalty kicks.
- Six saves equals Marckese's collegiate best. She also turned in six saves in the 2015 regularseason home finale versus Arkansas.
