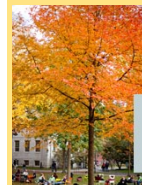

HARVARD RUNNERS TAKE PART IN 8TH ANNUAL BRIAN HONAN 5K

Approximately 350 Harvard runners raced to the finish line in the Brian Honan 5K Run/Walk on Sept. 25. Many participants gathered at the Weld Boat House on the Charles River and jogged together to the starting line in Allston Village.

Following the race, the runners enjoyed the day's festivities celebrating the rich diversity of the neighborhood at the Allston Village Street Fair and Allston-Brighton Day parade.

The annual road race raises money for scholarship funds for the Allston Board of Trade and the Brighton Board of Trade, and the Brian J. Honan charitable fund, which aids local and national programs supporting education, recreation, housing, and health care. Harvard has participated in the race since it began in 2004. Harvard has made annual donations to the race and sponsored slots for runners from the Harvard community.



STUDENTS ENGAGE IN COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECTS IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD

In August, a number of community service projects were completed by members of the Harvard community in Allston.

Students from the Harvard First-Year Outdoor Program (FOP) gathered for a team-building event and community service project in North Allston-Brighton.



An enthusiastic group of about 60 undergraduates picked up trash and removed brush along Lincoln Street and adjacent streets in the neighborhood.

Harvard Kennedy School students, staff, and faculty also took to the streets, schools, and neighborhood centers across the region as part of a school-wide day of service on Aug. 26. A group of students volunteered at Cradles to Crayons in Brighton, helping the organization in its mission to provide children up to age 12 living in homeless and low-income situations with the essentials they need to feel safe, warm, ready to learn, and valued.

Harvard students will volunteer again at Cradles to Crayons in October as part of a coordinated day of service with other local universities.
