RUTGERS OPENS BIG TEN PLAY

Entering Big Ten play, the Rutgers women's volleyball team welcomes No. 18 Penn State on Wednesday, Sept. 21 at 7 p.m. ET before traveling to Illinois on Saturday, Sept. 24 at 8 p.m. ET. Both matches will be streamed live on BTN Plus.

RU'S LAST TIME OUT

- After starting the season 4-1, Rutgers (4-9, 0-0) has fallen in its last eight contests.
- The Scarlet Knights dropped matches to Princeton, Seattle and Seton Hall last weekend at the Rutgers Invitational. RU ended the invite with a thrilling five-set match against SHU.
- Senior right side **Lauren Cloyd** was named to the all-tournament team after posting 2.27 kills per set and 1.00 blocks per set across the three contests.
- Junior outside hitter **Meme Fletcher** posted a team-best in kills (27) and service aces (6), including her fourth double-double (16 kills, 10 digs) of the year against the Pirates.
- In the Big Ten standings, fifth-year senior **Mikaela Matthews** and freshman **Jasmine Stackhouse** rank ninth and tenth in blocks per set, respectively. Matthews is averaging 1.28 blocks per frame followed by Stackhouse with 1.27.
- Freshman libero **Karysa Swackenberg** ranks 13th digs per set with 3.22, as well as 15th in service aces per set with a total of 15 on the season.

SCOUTING PENN STATE

- Penn State (8-3, 0-0 Big Ten) is riding a six-match win streak into Big Ten play. The Nittany Lions ended nonconference action with a home invitational, earning wins over Rhode Island, Howard and Clemson.
- PSU's three losses came at the hands of No. 19 North Carolina, Colorado and No. 9 Stanford.
- As a team, PSU ranks first in the league and second in the nation in opponent hitting percentage (.091) while ranking sixth in the conference with a .290 hitting percentage of its own.
- Haleigh Washington owns a team-best .410 hitting clip to sit 19th in the country.
- Simone Lee leads the squad with 4.13 kills per set, ranking fourth in the league.
- The teams last met on Nov. 6, 2015, when the then-No. 1 ranked Nittany Lions earned the win in three sets. PSU owns a 27-9 lead in the all-time series.

SCOUTING ILLINOIS

- Illinois (7-4, 0-0 Big Ten) enters the week after capturing the Billiken Invitational tournament title.
- The Fighting Illini defeated Omaha, Murray State and host Saint Louis and extended their streak to five straight sweeps.
- UI is receiving votes in the AVCA Coaches poll.
- The Fighting Illini rank fourth in the Big Ten with 3.00 blocks per set.
- Ali Bastianelli leads the defense with 1.80 blocks per set to sit at second in the league and fourth in the nation.
- Katie Stadick is 10th in the conference with a .374 hitting percentage, while Jordyn Poutler sits at ninth with 10.15 assists per set.
- UI owns a 5-1 lead in the all-time series, most recently adding wins in the last two meetings in 2015.
- The Fighting Illini will travel to Purdue for a Wednesday matchup before hosting Rutgers.

Head Coach	Jeff "CJ" Werneke	The home of Rutgers volleyball was first built in 1892 on the site of the first collegiate football game, which was played between RU and Princeton on Nov. 6, 1869. The building burnt down in 1930, only to go back up even bigger and better in 1931. "The Barn" was also the home of Rutgers basketball for many years, including the 1975-76 season when the men's team last made the Final Four. The volleyball program started in 1977 and has played in the building ever since. The College Ave Gym has a unique seating arrangement with three sides looking over the court in the form of a balcony, creating a home-court advantage. The wrestling team competes in the facility during the winter.

CHALLENGING CAMPAIGN

Rutgers will cross paths with a total of 11 NCAA qualifiers and seven ranked opponents, including the 2015 National Champion Nebraska at home. It marks the second consecutive season RU will host the reigning NCAA Champion, after welcoming Penn State in 2015.

Additionally, the NCAA qualifiers include nonconference foes Cleveland State, the 2015 Horizon League regular season and tournament champion, and New Hampshire, the 2015 America East regular season and tournament champion. The conference foes to punch tickets to the Tournament include No. 4 Minnesota, No. 8 Penn State, No. 10 Wisconsin, No. 14 Ohio State, No. 17 Purdue, No. 21 Illinois, Michigan State and Michigan.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

The Scarlet Knights elected captains Mikaela Matthews, Lauren Cloyd, and Talia Holze to lead them through the 2016 campaign.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

Nine Scarlet Knights were named Fall 2015 Academic All-Big Ten, including returners Lauren Cloyd, Meme Fletcher, Talia Holze, Mikaela Matthews and Cole Trimble. Additionally, three were named Big Ten Distinguished Scholars, including Cloyd, Holze and Matthews.

To be eligible for Academic All-Big Ten selection, student-athletes must be letterwinners who are in at least their second academic year at their institution and carry a cumulative grade-point average of 3.0 or higher. Similar to the Academic All-Big Ten honor, Distinguished Scholar Award recipients must be letterwinners in at least their second academic year at their institution. However, the Distinguished Scholar Award encompasses only students with a minimum GPA of 3.7 or higher for the previous academic year, excluding summer school.

APR PERFECTION

The Rutgers volleyball team posted a perfect 1000 Academic Progress Rate (APR) for the third straight season in 2014-15, maintaining the Scarlet Knights' multi-year score at 995. The multiyear score ranks in the 70th-80th percentile among all sports, as well as amongst all Division I women's volleyball programs.

The report is based on NCAA Division I APR data submitted by the institution for the 2011-12, 2012-13, 2013-14 and 2014-15 academic years. The APR is an annual scorecard of academic achievement calculated for all Division I sports teams nationally. The APR measures eligibility, graduation and retention each term and provides a clear picture of the academic performance for each team in every sport.

BIG WIN

Rutgers made history with its first Big Ten victory, defeating Maryland in a five-set thriller on Wednesday, Oct. 21 at the College Ave. Gym. The Scarlet Knights started off slow in set one, but never let up to claim the first, 25-23. The Terps then evened the match at 1-1 with a 25-23 victory in the second, but RU recovered with a dominant performance in the third to register a 25-19 win.

Once again UMD tied the match with a 25-15 win in the fourth to push the match to the deciding fifth set. Although the Scarlet Knights fell behind, 7-2, at the start of the stanza, Rutgers redeemed its energy from the earlier sets to rally to a 15-12 win, sealing the match victory to make history at the College Ave. Gym.

Meme Fletcher registered her sixth double-double of the year with a match-high 25 kills and 10 digs to lead the team. The duo of Eden Frazier and Anna Sudbury paced the team at the front of the net with seven blocks apiece. Sudbury also posted a match-high in service aces (5) and a team-high in assists (49). Senior libero Ronnie Komisarek posted a career-high 22 digs in the win.

WE R BIG

Rutgers became an official member of the Big Ten Conference on July 1, 2014.

HAVE WE MET BEFORE?

The Scarlet Knights will add two new programs to their all-time opponent list as they will cross paths with Bryant and Seattle for the first time.

ALL AROUND THE WORLD

The Scarlet Knight roster represents nine states, including California, Colorado, Florida, Illinois, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan, New Jersey and Texas. A total of four hail from the Golden State to lead the squad. RU also has international representation from Israel.

HEAD COACH JEFF "CJ" WERNEKE NINTH SEASON, SAMFORD '96



Jeff "CJ" Werneke enters his ninth season at the helm of the Rutgers women's volleyball program in 2016 and will lead the Scarlet Knights into their second season in the Big Ten Conference.

After an extremely successful stint at Fairfield, Werneke arrived "On the Banks" in 2008 with hopes of building a strong volleyball foundation at Rutgers.

In 2014, Werneke led the Scarlet Knights through a historic season, as Rutgers entered its first year in the prestigious Big Ten Conference. Throughout the year, the squad adjusted to the grueling competition day in and day out experiencing constant growth as RU battled against the top programs in the country. Under his guidance, junior Ali Schroeter was named a Big Ten Sportsmanship Award honoree and freshman Meme Fletcher was selected for the Inaugural Big Ten Volleyball Foreign Tour Team.

Off the court, the Scarlet Knights upheld their dedication to excellence in the classroom, as 10 student-athletes of the squad were named to the Academic All-Big Ten Team. Rutgers also posted a perfect APR score for the second straight season and earned the AVCA Team Academic Award for the fourth consecutive year under the guidance of Werneke.

In 2013, Werneke guided the Scarlet Knights through an injury-ridden year to conclude the campaign with several notable accomplishments. Participating for their first and only season in the American Athletic Conference, the Scarlet Knights continued to display their defensive-minded style of play as the team and players ranked at the top of various statistical categories.

In 2012, Werneke helped Rutgers to double-digit wins for the fourth-straight season and an 18-12 (4-11 BIG EAST) record. The 18 wins for the Scarlet Knights marked the most since the 2000 squad recorded 23, while the four conference victories were

the most since the 2005 team totaled six. Rutgers also notched its first winning season since the 2004 team went 16-10.

The team picked up two conference road wins, one over Georgetown (Sept. 30) and one over St. John's (Oct. 28), marking the most since the 2005 Scarlet Knights also collected two. The win over the Hoyas was the first conference road win since Rutgers downed South Florida on Oct. 31, 2010.

In 2011, Werneke led the Scarlet Knights to their third-straight season with double-digit wins, compiling 10 on the season. The Scarlet Knights put together a 7-6 record at home. The 11 victories in the 2010 season were the most for RU since the 2005 season.

In 2009, Rutgers finished with a 10-19 record. RU's 10 wins equaled the total amount of victories the squad had in the three previous seasons combined. RU also won its first tournament title since the 2004 Patriot Invitational when it won the Bucknell Invitational Title.

In his first season at RU, Werneke led an extremely young Scarlet Knights squad through a demanding schedule that included 17 road games and 14 BIG EAST contests. Although the Scarlet Knights garnered only two wins on the year, the youthful squad gained valuable experience.

The Scarlet Knights have also excelled in the classroom under Werneke's tutelage. In three of Werneke's seasons, the Rutgers University volleyball team was recognized for its outstanding academic achievement as the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) awarded RU with an AVCA Team Academic Award for posting a combined team grade point average of above a 3.30.

Prior to his first season as head coach at Rutgers, Werneke had a successful tenure at Fairfield, where he left as the school's all-time winningest coach.

In 2007, Werneke broke the 100-win plateau for his career. He was named the 2006 and 2007 MAAC Coach of the Year, and led the Stags to four consecutive MAAC regular season titles. In 2007, Fairfield finished with a 21-13 overall record and a 17-1 mark in conference play.

Werneke also coached 11 All-MAAC honorees, two MAAC Rookies of the Year, a MAAC Offensive Player of the Year and back-to-back Setters of the Year while with the Stags.

Before heading to Fairfield, Werneke served as an assistant coach at Rutgers from 1999-2001 under Anne Leonard-House. While an assistant at Rutgers, Werneke served as the recruiting coordinator, handled all scouting, game day and travel operations.

Werneke graduated from Samford University in 1996 and has also coached at East Tennessee State, Samford and the University of Montevallo.

Werneke married the former Jennifer Smith on January 20, 2007. The Wernekes are the proud parents of three children – daughters Rylie and Parker, and son Noah.

ASSISTANT COACH LINDSEY LEE NINTH SEASON, FAIRFIELD '08



Lindsey Lee returns for her ninth season with the Scarlet Knights coaching staff in 2016. Prior to taking the job as an assistant coach at Rutgers, Lee had a decorated career playing under CJ Werneke at Fairfield.

"I have known Lindsey since she was a junior in high school and after coaching her for four years at Fairfield, she has been great to work with as a colleague," said head coach CJ Werneke. "Not only does she bring her knowledge and passion for the game to our staff, but her competitiveness has been a major asset to our program."

Lee was a four-year standout at the outside hitter position for Fairfield. The Hilo, Hawaii native was the MAAC Rookie of the Year and named First

Team All-Conference during her first year in 2004. During her junior campaign, Lee was named the MAAC Offensive Player of the Year and was once again a First Team All-Conference selection. She ended her career holding the Fairfield records in both digs (1,647) and digs per game (3.88). She was only the fifth Stag in school history to record 1,000 kills and 1,000 digs.

Additionally, Lee has gained valuable coaching experience working with girls, ages 12-17, at Nike Volleyball Camps in Fairfield, Conn. She has also worked with junior players in her hometown of Hilo and has been coaching at the club level at the Atlantic Valley Volleyball Club in New Jersey the last two years.

ASSISTANT COACH PHUONG LUONG THIRD SEASON, FERRIS '95



Phuong Luong enters his third season with the Scarlet Knights in 2016.

In 2014, Luong was selected as an assistant coach for the Inaugural Big Ten Volleyball Foreign Tour, where he accompanied Scarlet Knight Meme Fletcher and student-athletes from all Big Ten schools on a tour through Europe. The team competed against various national teams, including Slovenia, Hungary, Croatia and Italy and hosted a youth volleyball clinic, in addition to community outreach activities.

Luong helped lead the DePaul to a historic season in 2013, as the squad finished with its most wins since the 2001 slate. DePaul opened the season with a 13-0 mark to establish a new program record for most consecutive victories to begin a campaign. Additionally, several Blue Demons earned individual BIG EAST conference honors, while the team as a whole posted its best marks in recent years in various statistical categories.

Prior to arriving in Chicago, Luong had stints at Gardner-Webb University (2006-2011), East Tennessee State University (2003-2006), the University of Wyoming (2000-2002), Northeastern University (1998-2000), Wentworth Institute of Technology (1998-2000) and the University of New Hampshire (1996-1998).

At Division III Wentworth, Luong served as the head coach of the men's volleyball team, leading the squad to the 1999 North East Collegiate Volleyball Association Conference Championship. Additionally, he guided Wentworth to a No. 11 ranking in the American Volleyball Coaches Association national poll during the 2000 campaign, marking the Leopard's highest rank in program history.

Luong has also held several roles as a coach at the high school and club level, in addition to serving as a head court coach and camp technician at various institutions' summer camps. A 1995 graduate of Ferris State University in Michigan, Luong was a four-year member of his alma mater's men's club volleyball team.
