

Working together to improve Transition

‘Ask Me Anything’ – New app in development ...

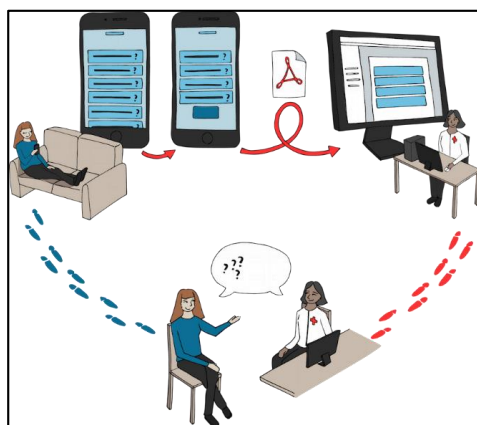
Last February, 8 members of ECHO Teen Club took part in a focus group, in partnership with the transition team at St. Thomas’ Hospital, to explore ways of improving the transition service from the Evelina to St Thomas’ Hospital.

In a repurposed shipping container, overlooking London’s Olympic Park, the group was run to understand what is important to young people during the transition process, from a young patient’s perspective. Over the course of a few hours, the group took part in activities using Lego people, lots of Post-it notes and role-play to talk about their thoughts and ideas.



The enthusiasm, thoughts and ideas from ECHO Teen Club members have contributed to the design for a website called ‘Ask Me Anything’.

Designer Emily explains more:



“The website and app will enable young people to send questions to their consultant before their appointment, ensuring the time covers what’s important to them.

The project team are now working closely with designers, app developers and the IT department to link this website with the electronic health records, and make this idea a reality!
