The position also requires maintaining an active and published research program in a subspecialty of Adult Development and Aging. The preferred specialty areas are vast and can include, but are not limited to Socio-Emotional Development, Cognition, Health, and areas of Neuropsychology. Preference will be given to those applicants with strong evidence of research productivity as evidenced by publication in peer-reviewed Developmental, Cognitive, Health, and Neuropsychology or Neuroscience Journals, as well as evidence of high potential for external funding. The department encourages, supports, and rewards top quality research and publication.
