Suicide is a preventable public health problem and a leading cause of death in the United States. More investment in suicide prevention, education and research will prevent the untimely deaths of thousands of Americans each year.

SUICIDE – BASIC FACTS

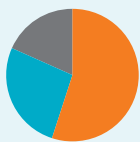
An American dies by suicide every **12.3 minutes**ⁱ



Americans attempt suicide an estimated

1.1 MILLION times annuallyⁱⁱⁱ

90% of those who die by suicide had a diagnosable psychiatric disorder at the time of their deathⁱⁱ



In 2014, firearms were the most common method of death by suicide, accounting for **49.9%** of all suicide deaths, followed by suffocation (including hangings) at **26.7%** and poisoning at **15.9%**



For every **woman** who dies by suicide, four **men** die by suicide, but women are 3x more likely to attempt suicideⁱ

Nearly **43,000** Americans die by suicide every year.ⁱ Suicide is the **10th leading cause of death**ⁱ in the United States

- **2nd** leading cause of death for ages 44 and under
- **5th** leading cause of death for ages 45-54
- The suicide rate among American Indian/Alaska Native adolescents and young adults ages 15-24 is **1.5 times** the national average



Veterans comprise **22.2%** of suicides^{iv}

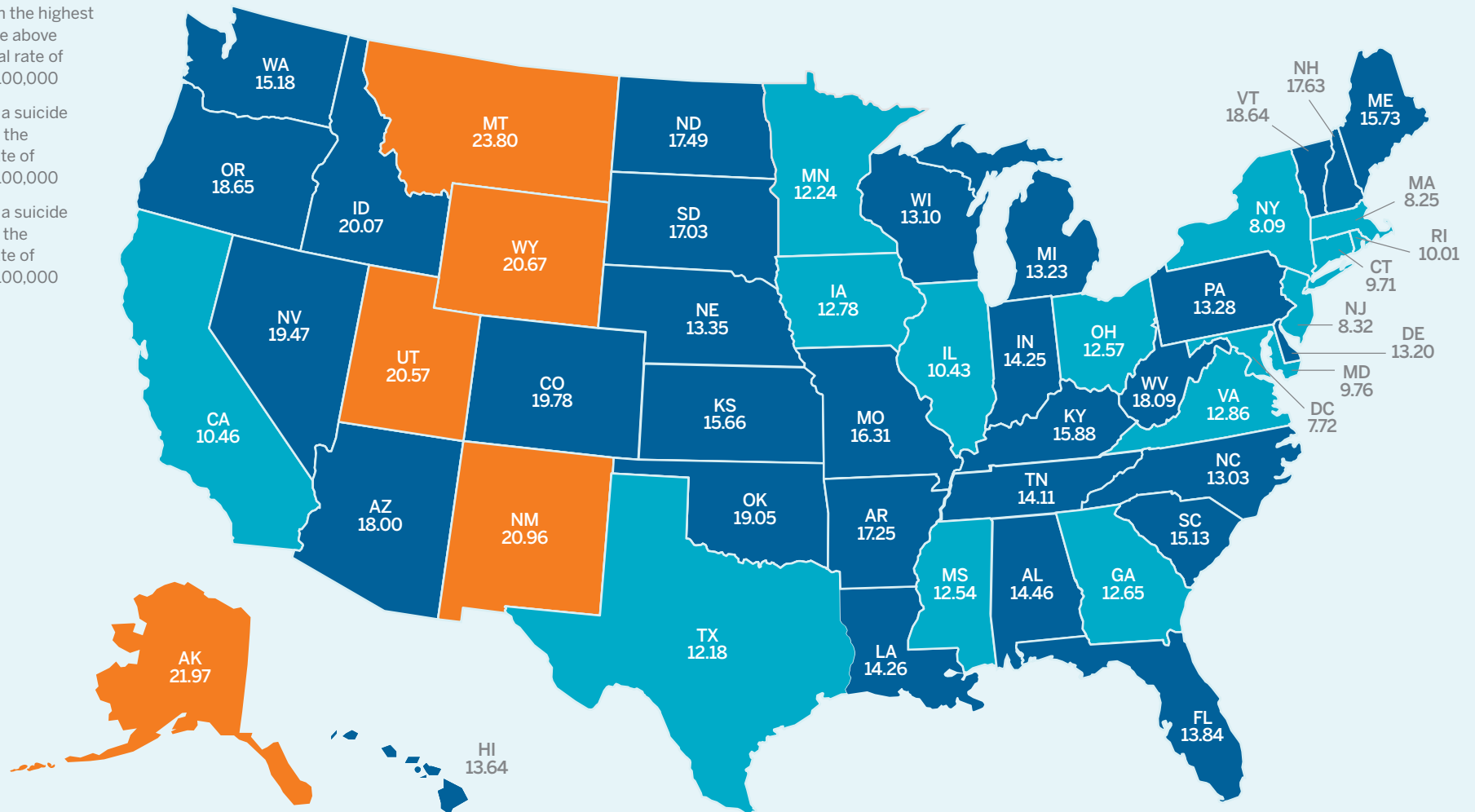
