

## Social Media for Dummies

Social Media is an incredibly useful tool for non-profit organizations. When used properly, it can improve communication and most importantly promote our organization.

Most of you likely already have a Facebook account. Facebook is a great way to keep in touch with other Jobies and to invite people to your Bethel's events. However it's important to remember that Facebook is a public form of Social Media and although your account is private, your personal profile is a reflection of our organization. Not everything that you do or participate in is appropriate to be shared amongst your fellow Jobies.

So how do you decipher what you should or should not post on your Facebook? We recommend that you use the "Grandma Rule". Do not post anything you would not be comfortable with your Grandma seeing. If you wouldn't feel comfortable explaining a post to your Grandmother it probably isn't worth the post.

However, we understand that your social media account is a way of expressing yourself and we don't want to infringe on that. It's important to remember that you are exposing others to your posts. What is appropriate for a 19-year-old to post may not be appropriate for a 10-year-old to see. If you feel that what you post may not pass the "Grandma Rule" then we suggest you make a Jobie Facebook account. Although we strive to be "All Jobie, All the time" this isn't always possible. By creating separate accounts you can post freely on your personal account without fear of misrepresenting our order or offending others. It's the best of both worlds.

## Glossary of Terms

- **Tagging-** Is a way of attaching the identity of someone to a photo or post. By tagging someone in the comment portion of a post you can direct them to a specific post as well.
- Handle (@)- A handle is an online alias or username. By including the @ symbol before a person's handle you are tagging them in your post. Make sure you tag us in your posts so we can find them!
- Hashtag (#)- A Hashtag is a way of connecting similar thoughts or ideas. Hashtags are the best way to get views or new followers on Twitter and Instagram. For example, by using our hashtag #BCJD anyone who clicks on that hashtag will be able to see all the other posts with that same tag. This is a great way of promoting Job's Daughters for free!
- The "Grandma Rule"- If you wouldn't want your Grandma to see it, we don't want to see it either! Please think twice before you post.
