**The International Society for Behavioral Ecology.** The society was founded in 1986 to promote the field of behavioral ecology by organizing international meetings and publishing a journal and a newsletter. Through these activities, the society facilitates communication between workers in the field and stimulates research and related academic activities. The international meetings, which form a focus for the society's activities, are held once every two years. The next meeting will be in Princeton, NJ, USA, in August 1992.

**Memberships and subscriptions.** All individuals who are members of the society receive the journal as a benefit of membership. Memberships are available on a calendar year basis. The annual rate for members (including four issues of the journal) is \$39.50. The annual rate for student members (including four issues of the journal) is \$22.50.
