New Buildings for cutting-edge research at the University of Geneva: The Campus Biotech and the Carl Vogt Building Campus Biotech



Since last year, Campus Biotech is a new initiative that drives forward the biotechnology sector in the Lake Geneva region, creating new opportunities for scientists and entrepreneurs. The Center uses novel approaches to create transformative products to improve people's lives and help create a more sustainable world. This Center was created by the University of Geneva, the Ecole Polytechnique Fédérale de Lausanne, the Wyss Foundation and the Bertarelli family. It follows the same principles and model of the Wyss Center for Biological Inspired Engineering at Harvard University in Boston.
