#### What does the law say?

- Copyright law grants authors and artists the exclusive right to make and sell copies of their works, the right to create derivative works, and the right to perform or display their works publicly.
- Basically, copyright law says the owner of the work controls what can be done with that work...in most cases.



#### **Public Performance License:**

- Music broadcast on radio (terrestrial and satellite), live venues, and other public places
- Royalties are collected and paid by Performance Rights Organizations (PROs) like ASCAP, BMI, and SESAC
- Each venue/broadcaster secures a blanket license from each performing rights organization in exchange for a royalty fee



#### Mechanical (Sound Reproduction) License:

- Compulsory license = No permission required from rights holder
- The Statutory Mechanical Royalty Rate in the U.S. is currently set at 12 cents per track or 2.31 cents per minute of playing time or fraction thereof, whichever amount is greater
- Sound Recording is distributed in physical or digital form
- Royalties are generally collected and paid by Harry Fox Agency, though some rights holders choose to collect mechanicals directly



#### Synchronization ("Sync") License:

- Music used in Film, Television, Commercials, Music Videos, etc.
- Permission from rights holder required



#### Print (Sheet Music) License:

- Music published in written form as music notation (with or without lyrics), as sheet music, bound music folios, online lyric and tablature/chords, etc.
- Permission from rights holder required


