

Supporting QIDPs & SSAs: OhioISP Made Easy

Assessment: This is not the place to list supports currently received, providers shouldn't be listed in the assessment. Focus on the person's skills, abilities, wants, and needs. Discover information about the person across their life.

Planning: Driven by the assessment. Identifies the supports/services for the needs identified in the assessment. Use the plan to identify the responsible provider/support.

Is it a risk, outcome, experience, or support?

<p>Risks</p>	<p>Communication, medical needs, or behaviors that create a risk for the person.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Immediate health & safety • Risk of harm to self or others • Potential legal sanction
<p>Outcomes</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Something important to the person • Something the person values and wants to accomplish. • Something to work towards – something different than how things are today. • Consist of the “what” and the “why”. • Meaningful and measurable • Drive services and supports
<p>Experiences</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lead the person to their overall outcome and as a result leads the person to their good life. • Are the ‘to do’ list to help the person reach their identified outcome. • May be important to or important for the person. • The path to help the person reach their outcome.
<p>Services & Supports</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Things the provider or support person is responsible for while assisting the person • ADLs, routines, supervision, community supports • Not all services need to be tied to an outcome • Specific to SSAs: If you have authorized a waiver service, there should be a paid support in the plan identifying what the provider is responsible for, if not an outcome or experience. • Specific to QIDPs: Everything the ICF does to support the person is a paid support if not an outcome or experience.



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
