The following are additional and/or specific requirements for the <u>BACHELOR OF SCIENCE</u> degree that may not be met by completion of the USP. Refer to your degree audit for a complete list of eligible courses for each category.

Communication 111 – required for all BS students
Humanities (HU): All Culture (XC) courses in the USP are considered Humanities.
English literature:
One course from at least two of the following areas: a) Fine Art (Art, Music, Theatre, RTF), b) Philosophy/Religious Studies, c) Foreign Language.
Area 1: Area 2:
One additional Humanities course from any area:
Social Science (SS) All Society (XS) courses in the USP are considered Social Science.
History course:
One course must be from a department other than History. For example: Anthropology, Criminal Justice, Economics, Environmental Studies, Geography, International Studies, Political Science, Public Administration, Psychology, Social Work, Sociology, or Women and Gender Studies.
Non-History course:
Two additional courses from any department:
Mathematics: One math course beyond USP. Your major may require a specific course. Consult with an advisor for options.  Higher level Math course:
<b>Natural Science (NS):</b> Four courses are required. All <b>Nature (XL)</b> courses in the USP are considered Natural Science. The following criteria must be met.
Two courses from the same academic department, where the first course is the pre-requisite of the second creating a sequence:  AND
One course from a different academic department than the one chosen above:
One course that is from a third academic department OR a course for which the one listed above is the pre-requisite OR a math course that is in addition to the courses chosen as your higher level math course in the Mathematics area:
