Program Guidelines 2017-2018 Every Student Succeeds **Act Consolidated Application** Federal Funding: intent and purpose of the Title I, Part A program is to provide supplemental resources to LEAs to help schools hiah with concentrations of students from low-income families provide highquality education that will enable all children to meet the challenging state academic standards. Title I, Part A, funds must be expended for programs, activities, and strategies that are scientifically based on research and meet needs (identified in the campus' comprehensive needs assessment process) that are listed in the needs assessment.

In order to increase program effectiveness, eliminate duplication, and reduce fragmentation of instructional programs, the district coordinates federal, state, and local funds to provide appropriate programs, instruction, and services to all students while maximizing the impact of available resources by vetting resources through content coordinators/committees.

Title I, Part A allowable uses of funds to provide a well-rounded education typically include the following:

- Research-based mathematics programs, activities, or strategies
- Research-based reading or language arts programs, activities, or strategies
