I will send you a break-down of the topics to be covered and roughly when tests are given by e-mail.

Grade breakdown:

(1) Three tests will be given. Each of these will count 22 percent of the final grade. The date of each test will be announced 2 to 3 days prior to the test.

(2) The final exam will count 24 percent of the final grade. If you make an 80 or higher on the final exam, 2 extra points will be added to your final average.

(3) Homework will be done via webassign and will count 10 percent of the final grade. The homework grade will be scaled with the highest homework grade in the class being 100. There MAY be additional problems assigned to be turned in which will be a part of this grade.

Grading scale: Plus and minus grades are given sparingly. The highest A is given an A+ and the lowest A an A-, with a similar distribution for B's, C's, and D's. The scales are: 90-100 gets you an A, 80-89 a B, 65-79 a C, and 55-64 a D. Grades below 55 result in an F.
