ABOUT VALPARAISO



NORTHWEST INDIANA

Valparaiso is the seat of Porter County, which has the 7th highest percapita income in the State of Indiana.

Porter County is also one of the few counties in Indiana with a growing population, totaling over 160,000 and making it the 9th largest county by population in the state.

Valparaiso is located just 14 miles south of the Indiana Dunes National Park, the nation's 61st National Park, which gained status in early 2019.

The Porter County Regional Airport is located one mile southeast of Valparaiso City Limits. In 2010, there was an INDOT estimated 70,304 landings and departures from the airport. The airport features:

Valparaiso is a growing community located in the northwest corner of Indiana - just 50 miles southeast of Chicago. The City is home to over 32,000 residents and acts as a hub for an additional 15,000 living in surrounding areas.

Our award-winning downtown gathering spaces and year-round community events provide a thriving and vibrant place to call home. Central Park Plaza, Porter Health Amphitheater and Urschel Pavilion have acted as magnets, drawing our engaged community Downtown for events including Shakespearean plays, music concerts, food tastings, movie nights and ice skating in the winter months.

Valparaiso recently received recognition from the American Planning Association's (APA) "Great Public Places" award for its 2.5 Acre Downtown Park and Pavilion that transformed an underused parking lot into a vibrant gathering space, and made the Downtown a regional destination.

Valparaiso's Downtown maintains its character with renovated facades and green space, featuring 70+ distinct non-chain restaurants and artisan shops.

The City is also developing an Arts District to connect Valparaiso's Downtown to Valparaiso University's Campus through the Indiana Ave. Corridor. The vision helped the City make it into the Semi-finalist round of Frontier Communication's "America's Best Communities" competition. Valparaiso was 1 of 15 chosen out of a total of 350 communities.


NEIGHBORHOODS & COMMUNITY

Valparaiso has a thriving residential market, while still maintaining a strong sense of place within our neighborhoods. From our Historic Downtown Neighborhoods to our newly established subdivisions, our neighborhoods are active and engaged in the community.

The City was built to support neighborhood activity with the majority of our neighborhoods being within walking distance to elementary schools and neighborhood parks. When driving through the City, you will likely see families walking and enjoying time together on their way to a community event, park or school.

The City of Valparaiso partners with neighborhood groups through a Neighborhood Improvement Grant Program to bring funding to projects like park enhancements, way-finding signage and construction of sidewalk missing links. Valparaiso's engaged neighborhood groups help to create a more livable, vibrant and welcoming community for all.





PUBLIC TRANSIT & PATHWAYS





CHICAGO DASH

The ChicaGO Dash is an express commuter bus service from Downtown Valparaiso to Downtown Chicago. Lavatories, Wi-Fi, satellite TVs, free parking and bike storage lockers are some of the great features offered by the DASH.

SOUTH SHORE CONNECT

The Valpo South Shore Connect is an express bus service from Downtown Valparaiso to the Dune Park South Shore Train Station. Departing from the Valpo Transit Hub, and running directly to the Dune Park South Shore Train Station. The bus drops off and picks up around the South Shore Train Line schedule taking you anywhere from South Bend to Chicago!

V-LINE

The V-Line is a deviated fixed route bus service for the citizens and visitors of Valparaiso. V-Line routes can take you to popular locations and destinations around the City. The V-Line provides 5 colored routes - Brown, Yellow, Green, Red and Purple running throughout Valparaiso.

PATHWAYS & BIKE SHARE

Valparaiso has an interconnected park and pathway system across Valparaiso. The pathways system spans over 20 miles with 10 Zagster/Valpo Velocity locations and 3 miles of Bike Lanes. Valparaiso recently celebrated becoming a Bronze Level Bicycle Friendly Community by the League of American Cyclists.

EDUCATION OPPORTUNITIES





Valparaiso is filled with excellent education opportunities from Pre-K to post-graduate, adding to our creative and technical working class.

Valparaiso Community Schools are ranked 23rd out of 331 school districts in the State of Indiana by the US Department of Education and East Porter County Schools, the district to our direct east, is ranked 10th.

In May 2016, the Valparaiso Community voted by almost a 2-1 margin to invest over \$148 million in construction and renovation of our schools' facilities. This represented one of the highest margins of approval by any community in the State.

Valparaiso University is also central to the City's Identity

with an architecturally stunning campus and diverse student population located about half-a-mile from our Downtown.

This private liberal arts college has been ranked in the Top 10 of regional universities in the Midwest since 1990 and is nationally recognized for its College of Engineering and College of Nursing.







FIELD OF BACHELORS DEGREES FOR **POPULATIONS 25-64**





The Valparaiso City Utilities is governed by a five-member Board of Directors and encompasses drinking water treatment and distribution, wastewater collection and treatment and storm water collection. Valparaiso currently serves a population of 35,000 customers in and adjacent to the City of Valparaiso.



As of September 2017, the Insurance Service Office (ISO) has rated the City of Valparaiso a fire protection class 2. This ia tremendous accomplishment since Valparaiso is now only the 8th community in the State of Indiana to earn this rating.
