• <u>Health Reference Center Academic</u>—provides searchable full text information from medical reference books and articles from refereed periodical literature

including full text of journals such as Topics in Geriatric Rehabilitation, Rehab Continuum Report, and Topics in Geriatric Rehabilitation

- <u>Health Source: Nursing/Academic Edition</u>—provides articles from more than 500 scholarly full text and abstracted journals such a Clinical Rehabilitation,
   Occupational Therapy International. Also contains a medical dictionary.
- <u>CINAHL</u>—Cumulative Index to Nursing and Allied Health Literature covers nursing, biomedicine, health sciences librarianship, alternative/complementary medicine, consumer health and 17 allied health disciplines. Contains abstracts or full text, depending on the publisher.
- <u>STAT!Ref</u>—is an electronic medical library that enables users to cross-search more than 35 full text medical reference and textbooks covering physiology, pharmacology, internal medicine, obstetrics, psychiatry, pediatrics, urology, dermatology, geriatrics, emergency medicine and more.
