What's Happening?

No. 2 preseason Florida opens the program's 44th season with a road meet at Texas Woman's University. The Gators will make their second appearance in the Lone Star State in the last 35 years, with both coming in back-to-back meets. Florida closed the 2015 season by claiming its third consecutive team title at the NCAA Championships held in the Fort Worth Convention Center.

Since 1980, Florida has opened the season on the road 12 times and owns a road-season opening record of 20-16 in that span. That includes a 196.925-193.70 win at Ball State in Florida's first appearance in the state of Indiana to open the 2015 campaign.

The new season is also the debut for Florida head coach **Jenny Rowland**. UF quickly zeroed in on Rowland as a top candidate to replace Rhonda Faehn, who resigned after 13 seasons with the Gators to become Senior Vice President of USA Gymnastics. Sixteen days after Faehn's announcement, Rowland was named the seventh head coach in the program's 43-year history. Rowland came to UF after five seasons with Aubum, serving as associate head coach since March of 2013. She shared the 2015 National Assistant Coach of the Year honor after helping the Tigers reach their first NCAA Super Six team final in 22 years. During her gymnastics career, Rowland was a USA National Team member from 1985-90 and part of the U.S.'s 1989 World Championships team. As a collegiate, she earned uneven bars All-America honors in 1993 for Arizona State. Rowland is also a Category 3 International Brevet level judge and was on the judging panel for the past two U.S. Olympic Trials.

Last season, Florida won its third consecutive NCAA Championship, edging Utah 197.85-197.80. The winning margin of 0.05 equals the slimmest in the meet's 34-year history. Then senior Kytra Hunter won a NCAA title each day of the 2015 event. She shared her second NCAA all-around title with UCLA's Samantha Peszek on the meet's opening day, helped the Gators win the NCAA team title during the NCAA Super Six and won the floor exercise crown in the NCAA Individual Event Finals.

Texas Woman's University was 9-12 in 2015 and took fourth in the USA Gymnastics Collegiate National Championships held April 11 in Philadelphia, Pa. The Pioneers return nine in 2016, including sophomores Alyssa Kelly and Schyler Jones who both earned 2015 USA Gymnastics Collegiate All-America honors.

Texas is the home state for six Gators – junior Claire Boyce, sophomores Kennedy Baker, Ericha Fassbender and Grace McLaughlin plus freshmen Peyton Ernst and Ashley Hiller. The Lone Star state is known for producing some of the nation's top gymnasts. In the 2015 NCAA Championships, 31 of the competitors across the 12 teams were from Texas. Of the preseason top 25 teams, all but five have at least one resident of Texas on their roster. The top two teams in the preseason poll – Oklahoma and Florida – lead with six Texas gymnasts each.

The Gators return five gymnasts in 2016 (Kennedy Baker, Claire Boyce, Bridgette Caquatto, Alex McMurtry and Bridget Sloan) who own a total of 18 All-America honors. The Gators won the NCAA Morgantown Regional and NCAA Championship team titles last year. In 2016, Florida returns 17 of 24 routines it competed in the 2015 NCAA Championships. Boyce will sit out 2016 season after undergoing hip dysplasia surgery in the summer of 2015.

The Gators' 14-member roster includes five freshmen. **Peyton Ernst** (2013-14, 2012-13) is a former U.S. Senior National Team member. **Alicia Boren** won the Junior Olympic Level 10 all-around title each of the past four years and also accumulated five event titles. **Lacy Dagen** won the 2014 Junior Olympic balance beam title in 2014. She will be sidelined in 2016 with a tom anterior citate ligament. **Ashley Hiller** was runner-up to Boren in 2015 Junior Olympic – Senior D vault competition and **Amanda Cheney** took fourth on beam at the same meet. This class ranks No. 2 on the 2015-16 CollegeGymFans.com Top Recruiting Classes list. In the last seven years, Florida's recruiting classes have ranked No. 1 five times and No. 2 once.

2015 Notables...

- NCAA champions for third consecutive year.
 First program since Utah (1982-86) to win first three NCAA team titles in consecutive years.
- Winning margin of 0.05 over Utah equaled the narrowed in the 34-year history of the NCAA Championships
- 2015 marked the 33rd NCAA Championships appearance by UF in the 34-year history of the event
- Five gymnasts collected a meet-high 13 All-America honors in NCAA Championships
- Six earned 10 All-America honors in the third NACGC regular season awards
- Five (Kennedy Baker, Bridgette Caquatto, Kytra Hunter, Alex McMurtry and Bridget Sloan) advanced to NCAA individual event finals.
- For the fifth consecutive year, a Gator claimed a NCAA individual title. Senior Kytra Hunter won a share of the all-around title and became the first Gator since 1984 to claim the NCAA floor exercise crown. Her four NCAA individual titles set the Gator career record.
- Three Gators Kytra Hunter (vault, floor exercise), Alex McMurtry (vault) and Bridget Sloan (uneven bars, balance beam) – collected SEC event titles. They were joined on the All-SEC team by Kennedy Baker, Claire Boyce and Bridgette Caquatto.
- Hunter named Honda Award winner for gymnastics, marking the second time she was picked as a season's top collegiate gymnast (also in 2012). Also named SEC Gymnast of the Year – first such honor for Gators since 2000
- NCAA Morgantown Region champion (197.475).
- Gators turned in national leading marks in two individual events a total of four times: vault (10.0/Sloan & McMurtry) and uneven bars (10.0/Sloan).
- Finished the season ranked sixth in the nation with an attendance average of 5,850

Smart Gators

The Gators return seven this season who earned 2015 National Association of College Gymnastics Coaches (NACGC) Scholastic All- America honors – Claire Boyce, Bridgette Caquatto, Bianca Dancose-Giambattisto, Ericha Fassbender, Morgan Frazier and Alex McMurtry.

Florida returns five who earned spots on the 2015 Southeastern Conference Winter Academic Honor Roll –Boyce, Caquatto, Dancose-Giambattisto, Frazier and **Bridget Sloan**.

Meet Coach Rowland

Jenny Rowland, one of the nation's rising coaching talents, is in her first season as University of Florida's head gymnastics coach. Rowland is the seventh head coach for the Gator program, which begins its 44th season in 2015-16.

Rowland brings experiences from the sport's highest level to Florida. She is a former U.S. National Team member, a collegiate All-American and was named a 2015 National Collegiate Assistant Coach of the Year.

Rowland's Coaching Career:

At Auburn:

Rowland comes to Florida after spending the last five seasons at Auburn. She joined the Auburn coaching staff as an assistant coach in October of 2010 and was elevated to associate head coach in March of 2013. Rowland worked with all aspects of the Auburn gymnastics program, coordinating all of the program's community outreach efforts and interactions on campus as well as playing an integral role in recruiting and in-gym activities.

She was named co-National Assistant Coach of the Year in 2015 after helping Auburn reach the NCAA Super Six for the first time in 22 years.

She served as the lead balance beam coach, as the Tigers put up the top beam totals of 2015 Southeastern Conference and NCAA Semifinal II competition. Three Tigers earned beam All-America honors in 2015. She also worked with the Tigers' floor exercise and routine construction. Rowland, who is a Category 3 International Brevet judge, offered her judging expertise through video breakdown of Auburn's routines.

Coaching Career Start in Sooner State:
Rowland coached Elite gymnasts at Bart Conner
Gymnastics Academy in Norman, Oklahoma, for five
years and then joined the Oklahoma coaching staff
in June of 2001. At OU, she helped coach the
Sooners to the 2004 Big XIII title, three-time team
NCAA qualifiers (2004-06) and three Big XIII
Gymnasts of the Year.

As a Gymnast:

During her gymnastics career, Rowland was a USA National Team member from 1985-1990 and was part of the U.S.'s 1989 World Championships team. During her collegiate career, she earned All-America honors for the uneven bars in 1993 for Arizona State.

After retiring from competition, she returned to her home state, enrolling at the University of Oklahoma to finish her degree.

Florida Quick Hits

- ▶ Defending NCAA champion Florida is second on the 2016 Road to Nationals preseason poll. The Gators are among the nation's preseason top four for the 10th consecutive year. Florida faces eight opponents among Road to National's preseason list in 2016 regular-season action.
- ► Florida returns five gymnasts with a total of 18 All-America honors. Bridget Sloan earned four All-America honors in both 2013 and 2015 and added three more honors in 2014. She also is a three-time NCAA champion (2013 all-around, balance beam; 2014 uneven bars). Florida also returns All-Americans Kennedy Baker, Claire Boyce, Bridgette Caquatto and Alex McMurtry. Boyce is out for the 2016 season after summer hip dysplasia surgery.
- ▶ The only collegiate gymnast in the nation this season who has claimed a NCAA all-around title is senior **Bridget Sloan**. She became the second Gator to win the title in 2013, **Kytra Hunter** was Florida's first NCAA all-around champion in 2012 and she shared the 2015 title with UCLA's Samantha Peszek.
- ▶ Only two among the nation's 2016 collegiate gymnasts have won an NCAA Individual Event title. Florida's **Bridget Sloan** has won three NCAA titles 2013 all-around, balance beam and 2014 uneven bars. The other past NCAA event winner is Stanford's Elizabeth Price (2015 vault). 2015 was the final year for the NCAA Individual Event finals, as all event champions will be determined in NCAA semifinal competition.
- ➤ Six Gators have been a part of their senior national teams, including five for the U.S. Bridget Sloan was a six-time member of the U.S. Senior National team. Kennedy Baker (2013-14, 2012-13), Bridgette Caquatto (2011-12, 2010-11), Peyton Ernst (2013-14 and 2012-13) and Grace McLaughlin (2011-12) were part of U.S. Senior National Teams. Sophomore Bianca Dancose-Giambattisto also has been a part of Canada's national team.
- ➤ Senior **Bridget Sloan** is the first World Championships' all-around winner (2009) to compete as a collegian. She is the first in the sport to win World (2009), U.S. (2009) and NCAA (2013) all-around titles.

National Team Connections

Six members of the Gator gymnastics team have been a part of their senior national teams.

U.S. National Team

Bridget Sloan, the youngest member of the U.S.'s silver medal team at the 2008 Olympics, represented the U.S. in 15 international competitions. She was joined on the 2011 Pan American and 2010 World Championships rosters by a pair of current Gators. Bridgette Caquatto claimed the all-around gold at the 2011 Pan Am Games. Also on that team was sophomore Grace McLaughlin.

Sophomore **Kennedy Baker** was part of the U.S. 2013-14 and 2012-13 U.S. Senior National teams. Freshman **Peyton Ernst**, a two-time U.S. National Team member ((2013-14 and 2012-13), was part of the U.S.'s winning teams at the 20014 Pacific Rim and City of Jesolo Trophy events. She was all-around runner-up at the Jesolo Trophy meet and also was second in 2013 Mexican Open and Tokyo World Cup meets.

Canada

Bianca Dancose-Giambattisto competed at the 2010 World Championships and Pan American Games for Canada.

Texas Connections

More than 40 percent of the 2016 Gator gymnastics team hail from Texas. The Lone Star State is known for producing top gymnastics talent and with only one university in the state sponsoring the sport, those skilled athletes have spread out across the nation.

Of the preseason top 25 teams, all but five have at least one resident of Texas on their roster. The top two teams in the preseason poll – Oklahoma and **Florida** – lead with six Texas gymnasts each.



Florida among nation's women's attendance

Florida's 2015 season attendance average of 5,850 ranked sixth among the nation's gymnastics teams and No. 19 among all NCAA women's sports in 2014-15.

Gator gymnastics attendance has been building the last few years, as the team set its season average attendance (7,366) record in 2014.

What to Expect in 2016?

All-Around

Florida senior **Bridget Sloan**, 2013 NCAA all-around champion, owns a share of every Gator event record. She matched the UF all-around record of 39.825 in the 2014 regular-season road finale at Missouri. Her 18 all-around wins stands No. 5 on the Gators Career Chart.

Two sophomores competed as all-arounders in 2015. **Kennedy Baker's** best of 39.55 came versus Georgia. In her only all-around performance of 2015, **Ericha Fassbender** took the win at Arkansas (39.375). Freshman **Alicia Boren** is a four time JO Level 10 all-around champion.

Vault:

Florida ranked among the nation's top two on vault for five of the 11 ranking reports of 2015 and set its season-high of 49.625 at SEC Championships and again at NCAA Regionals.

Florida returns the two Gators who posted vault 10.0s in 2015 – sophomore **Alex McMurtry** and Sloan. The vault they earned a 10.0 for in 2015 – Yurchenko full – is now valued at 9.95 for the 2016 season.

There are three among the Gators who could perform a Yurchenko one and half (10.0) in 2016 – Baker, Boren and Sloan. Freshman **Lacy Dagen** was also a possible Yurchenko one & half performer, but is sidelined with an anterior cruciate ligament tear.

Boren won the 2015 Junior Olympic Level 10 – Senior D vault title and **Ashley Hiller** was runner-up.

Bars:

Florida ranked in the top two on bars for eight of the 11 ranking reports of 2015. Its season-best of 49.575 came in the regular-season finale.

Sloan turned in 10.0 bar marks in consecutive meets, including setting the SEC Championships record. She won the NCAA bar title in 2014 and was runner-up in 2015. Caquatto earned All-America second-team honors for bars in 2015.

Beam:

Florida ranked among the top three in the final three beam ranking reports of 2015. Its season-best total of 49.575 came versus Georgia.

McMurtry is the only UF returner from the 2015 NCAA beam final. Sloan won the 20013 NCAA beam title. **Claire Boyce** was a steady beam performer, but is out this season due to summer hip surgery.

Freshman **Peyton Ernst** took fourth in the 2013 P&G Championships beam competition and freshman **Amanda Cheney** was fourth on beam at 2015 Junior Olympics Level 10 Championships. Boren won the 2014 J.O. Level 10 beam title.

Floor:

Florida ranked among the nation's top three in five of the final six floor ranking reports of 2015, including appearing at No. T2 in the final report. UF's total of 49.725 set Feb. 13 equaled the nation's season high.

Three back for 2016 – Baker, Caquatto and Sloan – have earned All-America honors on floor. Baker and Caquatto both advanced to the NCAA floor event final and Sloan was a floor finalist in 2013.

Boren won floor in J.O. floor titles in 2014 and 2013.

The Gators' freshmen class stands No. 2 on the <u>2016</u> <u>CollegeGymFans.com rankings</u>. In the last seven years, Florida's freshmen class has ranked No. 1 five times and No. 2 once.

The five-member Florida freshman class tops CollegeGymFans.com's ranking of recruiting classes, released Dec. 31, 2015.

The class includes **Peyton Ernst** (2013-14, 2012-13), a former U.S. Senior National Team member. **Alicia Boren** won the Junior Olympic Level 10 all-around title each of the past four years and also accumulated five event titles. **Lacy Dagen** won the 2014 Junior Olympic balance beam title in 2014. She will be sidelined in 2016 with a torn anterior cruciate ligament. **Ashley Hiller** was runner-up to Boren in 2015 Junior Olympic – Senior D vault competition and **Amanda Cheney** took fourth on beam at the same meet.

LSU's class is No. 1, while Alabama, UCLA and Utah round out the top five.

Televised Gators

The SEC Network brings 24/7 coverage of Southeastern Conference sports on the new cable channel which started in August of 2014. The SEC-ESPN contract is set to run for 20 seasons, giving the conference unprecedented national exposure.

The SEC Network is the source for a total of 21 league gymnastics meets – including 15 live events.
