FIRST SERVE

» No. 18 Penn State opens the Big Ten slate this week with a pair of matches on the road to open league play. The Nittany Lions begin conference action against the Scarlet Knights of Rutgers at 7 p.m. ET in Piscataway, N.J., before taking to the courts again on Sunday, where the team faces off with Northwestern at 1 p.m. ET.

» PSU enters the week in the midst of a six-match win streak after sweeping Rhode Island, Howard and Clemson to take home the Penn State Invitational title.

» Junior middle blocker Haleigh Washington led the way for the Nittany Lions over the weekend, posting 27 kills on an impressive .610 clip while providing a team best 15 blocks in three matches. The performance garnered her Penn State Invitational MVP honors.

» Setter Abby Detering and right side Heidi Thelen also earned a spot on the all-tournament team. Detering guided the team to .354 hitting as a unit, notching 91 assists, 14 digs, seven kills and three aces. Thelen posted 21 kills with a team second-best .447 hitting and added four blocks.

» After the weekend, Washington ranks among the top 20 in the country in hitting percentage. Her .410 clip is good for 19th in the country.

» Junior outside hitter Simone Lee has led the offense this season, averaging a team-best 4.13 kills per set. Lee's proved to be an offensive power, ranking 38th nationally in kills per set and 39th in points per set (4.70).

» Penn State has excelled defensively this season, limiting its opponents to 0.091 hitting – good for first in the Big Ten Conference and second in the nation.

» The team also ranks among the country's best in two other categories. The Nittany Lions rank sixth in the Big Ten in hitting percentage with a .290 average, which ranks 15th in NCAA Division I. The team also ranks sixth in the Big Ten in blocks with 2.79 per set, good for 22nd nationally.

» Penn State climbed two spots to No. 18 in the latest release of the AVCA Top 25 Coaches Poll this week. The Nittany Lions have matches against 10 teams represented within the top 25. Including the Nittany Lions, a total of eight Big Ten teams are ranked in the top 25 with one additional squad receiving votes.

» Penn State holds a 27-9 edge over Rutgers, winning its last 18 matches against the Scarlet Knights, dating back to 1982. Last year PSU swept Rutgers (25-19, 25-17, 25-12) in the two sides' lone meeting.

» The Nittany Lions face Northwestern with a 49-9 advantage all-time against the Wildcats. Last season, the Wildcats upset PSU in five (18-25, 25-23, 24-26, 25-17, 12-15) before Penn State swept Northwestern in the second meeting of the season (25-18, 25-14, 26-24).

» Penn State hosts back-to-back matches next weekend inside the friendly confines of Rec Hall. The Nittany Lions will play host to Michigan State on Friday, Sept. 30, at 7 p.m. before hosting Michigan on Saturday, Oct. 1 at the same time.

NEWS & NOTES

PENN STATE INVITATIONAL ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

After three sweeps of Rhode Island, Howard and Clemson, the Penn State Nittany Lions placed three members of the squad in juniors Haleigh Washington, Abby Detering and Heidi Thelen on the All-Tournament team. Washington was named the most outstanding player after a phenomenal performance, notching 27 kills on .610 hitting and adding a team-high 15 blocks in three sets. Detering guided the team to .354 hitting as a unit, notching 91 assists, 14 digs, seven kills and three aces. Thelen posted 21 kills with a team second-best .447 hitting and added four blocks.

WHITE'S PASSING STANDS OUT

Making her rookie debut in the Blue and White, freshman Kendall White powered the team with 38 digs across three matches in the Penn State Classic, leading the team with 3.45 per set. Week two was no different as the Indianapolis native logged her first career 20-dig outing, posting a match-high 22 digs against No. 9 Stanford. In the most recent weekend of play, White notched 35 digs in nine sets of play. Leading the team with 3.71 digs per set, she ranks 10th in the Big Ten standings.

LEE'S KILLS AMONG NATIONAL TOP 50

With double-figure kills in all but one match this season, junior Simone Lee's 4.13 kills per set ranks fourth in the Big Ten standings and 38th nationally. With double figure kills in all three matches on the over the past weekend, her largest kill totals came in the match against Howard in which she posted 12, along with eight digs.

DETERING TAKING THE REIGNS

Junior transfer Abby Detering (Florida) and redshirt sophomore Bryanna Weiskircher have split time early in the non-conference slate at the setting position. Having started the last seven consecutive matches, Detering is beginning to emerge as a consistent presence at the position. Last weekend Detering strung together a strong performance, guiding the team to .354 hitting as a unit, notching 91 assists, 14 digs, seven kills and three aces as the starting setter in all three matches. The performance over the stretch resulted in a berth to the Penn State Invitational All-Tournament Team.

AVCA POLL UPDATE: RELEASE 5

Penn State climbed two spots to No. 18 in the latest release of the AVCA Top 25 Coaches Poll. The Nittany Lions opened the season ranked No. 9 in the Preseason Poll, before moving to No. 13 and No. 17 in last week's release. Penn State has matches against 10 teams represented within the top 25. Including the Nittany Lions, a total of eight Big Ten teams are ranked in the top 25 with one additional squad receiving votes.

PENN STATE CLASSIC ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

Junior Simone Lee and freshman Kendall White were both selected to the Penn State Classic All-Tournament team following their performances in a 2-1 opening week at home. Lee led the team with 3.73 kills per set while White averaged 3.45 digs per frame. White had at least 16 digs in two matches, while Lee posted double figure kills in two of three matches, including 23 kills vs. North Carolina.

PENN STATE RANKED NINTH IN AVCA PRESEASON POLL

Penn State women's volleyball earned the No. 9 ranking in the 2016 AVCA Preseason Coaches' Poll. The Nittany Lions are among seven Big Ten schools to be ranked within the AVCA Top 25 and one of four conference programs to be voted within the top 10.

Nebraska earned the No. 1 overall ranking with 60 of a possible 64 first place votes. Minnesota and Wisconsin are next at three and four, respectively. Outside the top 10, Illinois is ranked 14th and Ohio State is 15th. Purdue rounds out the group at No. 20. Michigan and Michigan State also represent the league in the poll, as both are receiving votes.

NITTANY LIONS PICKED FOURTH IN BIG TEN POLL

Penn State opens the season ranked No. 4 in the Big Ten Preseason Poll, released by the conference early this week. The Big Ten Preseason poll is selected by votes from all 14 conference head coaches.

PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN NITTANY LIONS

Juniors Haleigh Washington and Ali Frantti have been named to the 2016 Preseason Big Ten Volleyball Team. The pair of Preseason All-Big Ten honors are the second straight for Washington and Frantti, who each earned the honor in 2015. Washington is also among a group of just four honorees to be voted to the team by a unanimous decision.

ROSE ENTERS YEAR 38 ATOP THE NCAA ALL-TIME WINS LIST

With an all-time record of 1,194 - 189, few have come close to matching head coach Russ Rose's impressive win total. Rose and Hawaii head coach Dave Shoji went back and forth throughout the year, but Penn State's run to its seventh NCAA national championship in 2014 vaulted Rose 11 wins ahead of Shoji, placing him firmly atop the active division I career standings at the conclusion of the season with 1,161 wins.

A CLOSER LOOK AT 2016

WHO'S GONE AND WHO'S BACK

Perhaps Penn State's biggest challenge this year will be replacing the offensive power generated from All-American seniors Aiyana Whitney and Megan Courtney. While the offensive gap is just one piece of the puzzle, Penn State does return a few other key pieces in different areas. The Nittany Lions finished the 2015 season ranked third nationally and first in the Big Ten in blocks per set, led by First Team AVCA All-American Haleigh Washington, who led the team with 1.38 blocks per set, which closed out the year ranked third in the conference. A unanimous All-Big Ten selection, Washington also logged 13 double figure kill performances, finishing the year with .442 hitting efficiency that ranked third nationally and first in the league.

Other key offensive returners include AVCA All-America Honorable Mention Ali Frantti, and Simone Lee, who closed out the year starting 18 of the final 21 matches of the year. The Nittany Lions also received significant contributions from Bryanna Weiskircher, who helped set the team to a .295 hitting percentage in her first season at setter, good for fifth nationally in the final standings.

Despite the graduation of seniors Kendall Pierce and Lara Caraway, the Nittany Lions have the most depth in terms of numbers at defensive specialist. Keeton Holcomb is among a group of five returners at the position with the most experience. Holcomb played in 32 matches during her first season in the Blue and White, making 28 starts. She led the team with 3.05 digs per set, highlighting the season with a pair of 20-dig performance in the same day in wins against Mississippi State and Notre Dame.

TRANSFER TIME

Joining Weiskircher and Rivera at the setting position is Abby Detering and Caroline Graham. Both Detering and Graham transferred to Penn State having previously attended Florida and UCLA, respectively. Detering spent the last two seasons at Florida and enters 2016 as a junior on the Nittany Lion roster.

Graham transferred to Penn State after spending a year at UCLA, but did not play on the volleyball team. Graham attended Lycee Alexandre Dumas, serving as team captain from 2014-16. She played club volleyball with AS Tigresses (Tigers), helping the team to a national championship in 2015 and a second-place finish in 2014 and 2016.

Outside hitter Clare Powers rounds out the transfer group. Powers ranked third on the team in kills per set with 1.93 and finished fourth in digs per set with 2.19 in her first season at Saint Mary's before an injury cut her sophomore season short. She transfers to Penn State as a redshirt sophomore on the roster.

WHO'S NEW

Outside of the trio of transfers, Penn State's true freshman class features five newcomers including Emily DeMure, Allison Farrell, Kristin Krause, Emily Sciorra and Kendall White.

Emily DeMure » A four-year letterwinner at Granite Bay, DeMure helped the Grizzly Bears to a DI state championship during the 2013-14 season, as well as an All-League title in the same year. She also helped Granite Bay to a NorCal All-Section title in 2015, served as team captain. She was selected as team MVP at Granite Bay in 2015 and played club volleyball for Gold Cal Juniors.

Allison Farrell » A four-year letterwinner at Glenbard East, Farrell helped the Rams to a regional title during the 2014-15 season. She also earned Upstate 8 All-Conference and All-Area honors in 2015 and played club volleyball with Sports Performance.

Kristin Krause » Krause joins older sister Taylor on the Nittany Lion roster. A four-year letterwinner at Parkland High, Krause set the Trojans to back-to-back East Penn conference, district and Pennsylvania state championships in 2014-15. Selected as Pennsylvania's volleyball Gatorade State Player of the Year in 2015-16, she played club volleyball with East Coast Power, where she was coached by her father, Mike Krause.

Emily Sciorra » Sciorra was a four-year letterwinner at Chantilly, where she helped the Chargers to a Conference 6A championship in 2013 as the team's libero. Sciorra played club volleyball with Metro Volleyball Club of Washington D.C., helping her team to gold in the Sports Performance National Junior Classic Open.

Kendall White » White was four-year letterwinner at Cathedral, White helped the Irish become the first Indiana 4A team to post an undefeated record (36-0) in 2015 on the way to an Indiana Class 4A state title as the team's libero. Among numerous honors, she was named Indiana's volleyball Gatorade State Player of the Year in 2015-16 and selected as the Indy Star Player of the Year and Cathedral's High School Female Athlete of the Year.

MORE NEWS & NOTES

Prior to topping the list of DI winningest active coaches by victories, his .865 career winning clip has ranked first on the percentage chart for the last several years. Now at the top of both lists, he's one of just two active NCAA DI coaches to amass more than 1,100 career wins and one of four active coaches across all three divisions to join the 1,000 victories club.

On the list of winningest coaches of all time, Rose's 1,194-189 tally is unmatched at first place. Along with Shoji and former UCLA head coach Andy Banachowski, the three are the only DI coaches in NCAA women's volleyball coaching history to total 1,100 or more victories.

NIITTANY LION ALUMS EARN BRONZE WITH TEAM USA

Penn State women's volleyball All-American alums Alisha Glass and Christa (Harmotto) Dietzen earned a Bronze medal with the United States Women's National Team at the Olympic Games in Rio.

Having played key roles for Team USA throughout the event, Glass and Dietzen helped the United States to a 3-1 (25-23, 25-27, 25-22, 25-19) win against the Netherlands to clinch The Americans' second Bronze medal since the 1992 games in Barcelona, Spain. Team USA went 6-0 through Pool play before a close 3-2 loss to Serbia in the semifinals moved the United States to 6-1 heading into the Bronze medal match.

Penn State women's volleyball now has four Olympic medalists in Nittany Lion program history as Glass earns her first and Dietzen picks up her second consecutive. Having previously earned Silver with the U.S. at the 2012 Games in London, Dietzen is Penn State's first women's volleyball alum to win two Olympic medals as a member of the 12-woman roster.

From Hopewell Township, Pa., Dietzen was a two-time first-team All-American and the 2008 CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year in women's volleyball. From Leland, Mich., Glass also was a two-time first-team All-American for the Nittany Lions. Glass was a member of the initial three national title squads and Dietzen was a member of the first two squads, playing for Hall of Fame Coach Russ Rose.

PENN STATE IN SEASON-OPENERS

Penn State is 33-7-1 all-time in season-openers after sweeping past West Virginia Friday evening at Rec Hall. The win against the Mountaineers marks the fourth consecutive season-opening victory.

QUICK SETS

• From Oct. 16, 1996 to Nov. 9, 2001, Penn State won 139 consecutive matches when taking a 2-0 lead. Since joining the Big Ten conference in 1991, Penn State has played in 886 total matches, winning 785. Since 2008, Penn State has earned 217 of its 272 victories in three sets (80%), including 37-of-38 (98%) in 2008 and 32-of-38 in 2009 (84%). In 2015 Penn State won 22 of its 34 total matches by way of a 3-0 sweep.

• Since the 2001 season, the Nittany Lions have only lost 64 matches. And of those 22 teams that defeated Penn State – BYU, Colorado, Florida, Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Nebraska, North Carolina, Northwestern, Ohio State, Oregon, Oregon State, Purdue, Stanford, Temple, Tennessee, Texas, UCLA, Washington and Wisconsin – only nine of these teams (Nebraska, Stanford, Ohio State, Illinois, Wisconsin, UCLA, Minnesota, Michigan and Michigan State) have been able to beat Penn State three times. Since 2001, Penn State has compiled a 260-61 mark against all 21 teams to have beaten PSU within the stretch.

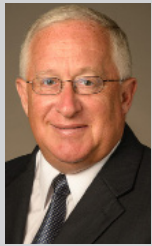

RUSS ROSE AT A GLANCE ...

It's been nearly four decades since Russ Rose arrived on campus. Entering his 37th season, the AVCA Hall of Fame head coaches' record-setting seven NCCA national titles and 16 Big Ten championships speak directly to the confidence and character he's passed along throughout his career.

As each year passes, his list of accomplishments continue to swell, but a quick snapshot of his legendary tenure might read something like this: The leader of a women's volleyball powerhouse who's kept his program among the nation's elite for nearly 40 years, guiding his teams to a record-setting seven NCAA national titles, including an unprecedented four consecutive championships from 2007-10. Along with 16 Big Ten titles, his program is one of only two women's volleyball schools to compete in all 34 NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball National Championship events. He's produced four AVCA National Player of the Year, 13 Big Ten conference Players of the Year and at least one AVCA All-American in 35 of 36 seasons. His student-athletes excel in the classroom as well, with an outstanding 156 Academic All-Big Ten selections and five Academic All-Americans.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 9 Penn State women's volleyball (1-0) opened the 2016 season with a sweeping 3-0 (25-13, 25-13, 25-17) win against West Virginia (0-1) Friday evening at Rec Hall.

"I thought we received a really good effort from two newcomers," head coach Russ Rose said. "I thought Kendall [White] did a good job passing and playing defense and Abby [Detering] did a nice job moving the ball around and getting a few kills at the net."

Penn State shot out to an 8-2 lead in the first set to take control of an early advantage. The Mountaineers looked to cut off the run with a kill, 8-3, but the Nittany Lions regrouped with a 4-2 stretch to make it 12-5. West Virginia looked to slow the momentum with a 3-1 spurt, 13-8, but back-to-back kills from Frantti opened up a 9-4 streak that sent Penn State surging ahead, 22-12.

A Nittany Lion service error cut off the run, but two kills from Lee in between one from Thelen wrapped up a 25-13 win in the first set to put PSU ahead, 1-0.

Penn State got out to another hot start in the second set, using an 8-3 run to build another comfortable cushion. The Mountaineers looked to get back on track, putting away a kill before a PSU attack error, 5-8. Penn State answered back with four unanswered points to pull ahead by seven, 12-5.

A Penn State service error broke up the rhythm, 12-6, but the Nittany Lions responded with a 7-3 run to bolster the advantage to double figures, 19-9. West Virginia looked once again for an opportunity following a kill, 19-10. The Nittany Lions did not let the Mountaineers get any closer though, using a 6-3 run capped off by two kills from Washington to close out a 25-13 win in the second set.

Trailing by one in the third set, 4-3, a kill from Frantti and two more from Washington opened up a 7-1 stretch that sent Penn State ahead by as many as five, 10-5. The Mountaineers came battling back with a 4-1 run to narrow the gap to two, 11-9. Penn State regrouped and followed with a 6-2 streak, capped off by a solo stuff from Gorrell to make it 17-11, forcing WVU to call its second timeout.

West Virginia made one final attempt to mount a comeback, using a 4-2 burst out of the break to arrive within four, 19-15. Penn State responded with a block from Frantti and Washington to spark a 5-1 run that carried the Nittany Lions to set point, 24-16. The Mountaineers held off one attempt before serving into the net to hand Penn State a 25-17 win in the third set to complete the sweep.

A total of 16 Nittany Lions saw the court in the win as Clare Powers and Jelena Novakovic made their debuts in the Blue and White.

Penn State got out to a fast start, using a 6-2 run to take over an early lead. The Eagles looked to stall the run, connecting on a pair of kills in between one from the Nittany Lions, 7-4. Penn State cut off the attempt with a kill before a Georgia Southern ball handling error widened the Nittany Lion lead to five, 9-4, causing the Eagles to call a timeout.

Georgia Southern followed with a 5-4 stretch in an attempt to keep within four, 13-9. Penn State continued to pull away though, using a 5-1 strike to bolster the advantage to as many as eight, 18-10.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 9 Penn State women's volleyball (2-1) fell short in 3-2 (25-16, 22-25, 25-21, 23-25, 9-15) loss to No. 19 North Carolina (3-0) Saturday evening at Rec Hall.

With the score tied early, 3-3 Penn State used a 5-0 fun featuring two kills from both Frantti and Lee to take over a five-point lead, 8-3. The Nittany Lions came out of the break with two more kills from Lee and another from Gorrell to widen the advantage to as many as eight, 11-3.

North Carolina answered back with a 4-2 stretch to trim the gap to six, 13-7. Penn State earned an opportunity off a UNC service error, 13-6, but could not find momentum as the Tarheels continued to match the Nittany Lions point-for-point to remain with six, 17-11.

Penn State rebounded with a 4-1 stretch to make it 20-11, but the two teams continued to trade points until Penn State reached set point, 24-15 off a kill from Frantti. North Carolina held off one attempt before another Frantti kill secured a 25-16 win in the first set.

Trailing by two in the second, 17-15, Penn State called a timeout to regroup. The Tarheels came out of the break with a service error before a block from Thelen and Gorrell tied the score, 17-17. Two more North Carolina attack errors quickly put Penn State back in front by two, 19-17, causing UNC to call a timeout. North Carolina came storming back with three unanswered points, but Penn State followed with a kill and an ace from Lee to pull ahead, 21-20, forcing another UNC timeout.

The Nittany Lions looked to continue momentum out of the break following a Tarheel attack error, but Penn State failed to sustain the momentum as UNC rattled off the next five consecutive points to take set two, 25-22, evening the match at 1-1.

Trailing by four in the third set, 5-1, kills from Washington and Lee sparked a 5-2 run that pushed the Nittany Lions within one, 7-6. Penn State continued to fight point-for-point, using a 2-1 spurt to tie the score, 8-8. Penn State and North Carolina continued to trade points tying the frame three more times, 11-11, until a kill from Washington and an ace from Rivera lifted PSU ahead, 13-11.

From there, the Nittany Lions managed to maintain at least a two point edge, until a pair of late Tarheel kills brought UNC within two for the final time at 23-21. Penn State responded with a kill from Lee before a North Carolina ball handling error gave the Nittany Lions a 25-21 win in the third set to put PSU on top, 2-1.

The Tarheels jumped out to another 5-1 lead in the fourth set. A UNC service error opened a 4-1 streak that lifted Penn State ahead by one, 6-5. Unable to maintain the advantage, PSU and UNC traded points to tie the score, 8-8. UNC looked to pull away with a kill and a block, 10-8, but PSU followed with a 5-2 streak to maintain a one-point lead, 13-12. North Carolina followed with a kill to tie the score, 13-13, but Penn State put together a 7-3 run to expand the advantage to four, 20-16.

North Carolina looked to cut off the run with a kill, 20-17, but Penn State used another 3-1 strike capped off by kills from Thelen and Frantti to make it 23-18. Unable to sustain the momentum, things quickly turned for the Nittany Lions as the Tarheels charged back with seven unanswered points to force a fifth and deciding set.

Down by two, 4-2 early in the fifth frame, a UNC attack error and a kill from Lee tied the score at 4-4. BOULDER, Colo. - Redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell turned in a career-high 14 kills and five blocks, but it was not enough as No. 13 Penn State dropped a five-set (25-22,20-25,19-25,25-20, 3-15) decision at Colorado Saturday evening in the first match of the Big Ten/Pac-12 Challenge at the Coors Events Center.

After forcing a decisive fifth set with a come from behind 25-20 victory in the fourth Penn State had the momentum. However, it was Colorado who came out fired up and rattled off six consecutive points for the early 6-0 margin.

Lee stopped the run as she split the block with a kill, but the Buffaloes came right back with a kill and a service ace for the 8-1 lead. Lee added another kill, but Penn State could not silence the Colorado attack as they cruised to the 15-3 set victory and the 3-2 match win.

A back-and-forth opening set saw the teams trade momentum as early on Lee connected on an ace to tie the 8-7 and a few points later Washington skied for a solo block during a 4-point Lion spurt for the tie 8-8 edge.

Midway through the set Gorrell sparked the Nittany Lions with a huge kill to tie the score at 13-13. Gorrell had four kills in the opening set to pace the team while hitting at an 80 percent clip.

The teams continued to trade points with neither holding more than a two-point advantage at any time until PSU used a 4-0 spurt to close the set after an attacking error off a serve from freshman Kendall White for the 25-22 set victory. PSU hit .414 in the opening set.

The Buffaloes came out in the second set fired up jumping to an early 3-0 lead before Penn State came right back with three straight points of their own with kills by Lee, Gorrell and Washington, in that order. However, a pair of attacking errors by the visitors and some big kills for Colorado pushed the host lead to 10-4, the biggest of the game for either team.

The Lions came clawing back, however, following a timeout and were able to rattle off seven of the next nine points to cut the deficit to 12-11 after the soft touch of junior Heidi Thelen resulted in a kill and prompted a Buffalo timeout.

Colorado fought back again out of the break with a pair of quick points and wouldn't let Penn State get close enough to grab the momentum as a pair of late service errors and a closing block by Joslyn Hayes gave the Buffaloes the 25-20 second set win.

Behind Frantti and Washington the Nittany Lions came out of the ten-minute break and started the third set on fire jumping out to a 5-2 lead after a huge solo-block by Washington and a big swing by Frantti.

The Buffaloes regrouped and came surging back scoring 13 of the next 20 points to grab the 15-12 lead at the media timeout. CU continued to roll scoring two more quick ones out of the break on a pair of attack errors to grab their largest lead of the set 17-12.

Junior Lainy Pierce sparked a comeback off the bench as she served up a pair of points while Lee and Gorrell both hit the double-digit kill mark as PSU scored six-of-eight points prompting a timeout trailing just 19-18.

However, Colorado used the energy of the crowd and rattled off six of the final seven points for the 25-19 set victory.

Lee opened the fourth set with a big swing, but Colorado came back with five unanswered points for the 5-1 lead taking advantage of three attacking errors by Penn State. The Lions fought back taking advantage of Colorado errors and used back-to-back kills by Frantti for the 9-8 edge. A kill by Washington followed by a block-assist by Frantti and Washington pushed the lead to 11-8, their largest lead since the opening set victory.

The Nittany Lions continued to grow that lead grabbing their largest margin of the contest, 20-14, after back-to-back kills by Washington and Frantti. PSU continued to roll in the fourth set as Washington soared for back-to-back blocks for the 22-15 edge late in the frame.

BOULDER, Colo. - No. 13 Penn State women's volleyball (2-3) fell short in three sets (24-26, 18-25-22-25) to No. 9 Stanford (2-1) Sunday evening in the final match of the Big Ten/Pac-12 Challenge at the Coors Events Center.

Momentum began to shift in the opening set about midway through as a back-and-forth pace turned in favor of the Nittany Lions with Detering coming up with a big swing and redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell a big block for an 11-11 tie.

After Stanford rebounded for a pair of consecutive points it was the Lee sparking a four-point rally which included another Gorrell block and a 15-13 PSU advantage. The Cardinal fought back after a media timeout and used back-to-back service aces from Hayley Hodson to pull ahead 20-18.

Lee responded with a huge kill and both Detering and Gorrell skied for a block to knot the score again at 20-20. The teams continued to trade points before Penn State went on a mini three-point spurt to reach set point at 24-22. Stanford battled back, however, rattling off four straight points for the set victory, 26-24.

The first set saw 16 ties and five lead changes while Penn State hit .325 and Stanford just .237 with seven errors to the Nittany Lions' two.

The second set started with a fury of Lion points to grab a 3-1 lead before Stanford got back ahead at 5-4. PSU then ran off four straight points with a pair of kills by Frantti and one each by Washington and junior Heidi Thelen for the 8-5 edge.

The Cardinal again came back with another 3-0 run to pull even again, 8-8, before Penn State secured six of the next eight points to jump to a 14-10 lead, their largest of the match. Detering had a pair of huge kills while Lee had a big block and kill during the run.

Stanford again fought back into things going on a 7-0 run which included a pair of service aces to take the 17-14 lead. The Cardinal continued the pace as they scored 15 of the final 19 points to cruise to the 25-18 set victory.

PSU came out of the break to start the third set with some intensity using a Detering kill to grab a 3-1 lead and a few points late Detering combined with Washington for a block and the 5-3 lead. The Cardinal regained control for a brief portion maintaining a multiple point lead before a service error and a big block by Thelen knotted everything up at 18-18.

The Nittany Lions then took a two-point edge, 21-19, after kills by Washington and Frantti, but again the Cardinal came back to tie at 21-21 after a net violation. Out of a timeout the teams then traded points before Stanford collected the final three-straight for the 25-22 set victory.

Penn State held the slim 43-41 lead in kills and the 10-8 margin in blocks, but Stanford used eight service aces and only two service errors to their advantage while hitting .232 to PSU's .227.

SYRACUSE, N.Y. - No. 17 Penn State women's volleyball (3-3) opened the first day of the Syracuse Classic with a straight set (25-11, 25-10, 25-12) win against Siena (1-6) Friday morning at the Women's Building.

Four Nittany Lions registered at least four kills in the win, led by a match-high 14 kills from junior Simone Lee. In addition to her fifth double-figure kill performance of the season, Lee also added four digs and three total blocks.

Penn State jumped out to a 5-2 advantage early in the opening frame, helped out by two kills apiece from Washington and Lee. The Nittany Lions got out to another fast start in the second set, using a 9-3 run to build an early lead. Siena battled back with a 4-2 stretch to trim the gap to four, 11-7. Penn State regrouped with a 6-1 stretch featuring a pair of kills from both Lee and Detering to send the Nittany Lion advantage to nine, 17-8.

Siena called a timeout and looked to stop the momentum with a kill out of the break, 17-9, but Penn State followed with four unanswered points to make it 21-9. A Nittany Lion service error broke up the rhythm, 21-10, but Penn State used another 4-0 run to close out a 25-10 win in the second set.

Trailing by one in the third set, 6-5, Lee sparked a 4-0 strike with a kill to lift the Nittany Lions ahead by three, 9-6, causing the Saints to call a timeout. Penn State continued to roll out of the break, widening the scoring streak to a 9-0 run as the Nittany Lions surged ahead, 14-6.

One more Hofstra kill gave the Pride a 25-22 win in the second set to tie the match, 1-1.

Penn State got out to a fast start in the third set, using a 6-2 run to construct an early lead, prompting Hofstra to call a timeout. Penn State continued to roll out of the break, using a 6-1 streak, capped off by kills from Lee to widen the advantage to as many as nine, 12-3. The Pride looked to break up the momentum with a kill, 12-4, but the Nittany Lions answered back with a 6-4 stretch to send the advantage into double figures, 18-8, causing Hofstra to use its final timeout.

A block from Washington and Detering out of the timeout sparked another 6-2 scoring streak that lifted the Nittany Lions to set point, 24-10. Hofstra held off two attempts before the Pride served into the net to give Penn State a 25-12 win in the third set to go up 2-1 in the match.

Leading by two in the fourth set, 8-6, Washington put away back-to-back kills to begin a 6-0 run that pulled Penn State ahead, 14-6. Hofstra looked to cut off the run with a kill, 14-7, but the Nittany Lions responded with five unanswered points to surge ahead, 19-7.

SYRACUSE, N.Y. - No. 17 Penn State women's volleyball (5-3) swept past Syracuse (1-6) in straight sets (25-22, 25-17, 25-12) to capture the Syracuse Classic title Saturday evening at the Women's Building.

Penn State and Syracuse kept it close in the early part of the first set. Trailing by one, 10-9, Lee sparked a 3-0 spurt with a kill to bring the Nittany Lions ahead by two, 12-10. The Orange answered with a pair of kills to tie the score again, 12-12. PSU and SU continued to trade points, 14-14, until a pair of Orange errors gave the Nittany Lions a two-point edge, 16-14. Looking to regroup, Syracuse called timeout.

Penn State came out of the break with a 5-2 run featuring a pair of kills from Lee to pull ahead by five, 21-16, prompting the Orange to call timeout. Syracuse came out of the break with back-to-back kills before a Nittany Lion attack error brought the Orange within one, 21-19, causing Penn State to call a timeout.

Penn State came out of the timeout with a 2-1 spurt to widen the margin to three, 23-20, but Syracuse followed with consecutive kills to arrive within one, 23-22. A Syracuse service error out of a Penn State timeout gave the Nittany Lions set point, 24-22. White followed with an ace to close out a 25-22 win in the first set.

The Nittany Lions jumped out to a 7-3 start in the second set, capped off by a block from Thelen and Gorrell to prompt the Orange to call a timeout. Penn State followed with a 4-2 stretch to widen the advantage to six, 11-5. Syracuse came storming back, using a 6-2 scoring streak to narrow the gap to three, 13-10. Penn State halted the run, using a 5-2 run to build the advantage back to six, 18-12.

A Nittany Lion net violation and an Orange block made it 18-14, but Penn State regrouped with kills from Lee and Frantti, sparking a 4-1 strike that made it 22-15. Syracuse looked to get back on track with a block following a Penn State service error, 22-17, but Washington, Detering and Frantti wrapped up a 25-17 win in the second set with three consecutive kills.

Penn State moved out to an 11-6 start in the third set, led by kills from three different Nittany Lions. The Orange called timeout looking to break up the streak, but Penn State followed with four unanswered points to bolster the advantage to as many as nine, 15-6. Syracuse called its final timeout of the frame and looked for an opportunity off a PSU service error out of the break, 15-7.

The Nittany Lions did not let the Orange any closer than nine as Penn State surged to a 25-12 win in the third set to complete the sweep.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - The No. 20 Penn State women's volleyball team (6-3) had a dominant performance Friday evening in a 3-0 (25-6, 25-18, 25-13) win against Rhode Island (4-6) inside the friendly confines of Rec Hall.

Penn State had an impressive performance on both ends of the net, hitting at a .375 clip over three sets while limiting Rhode Island to a negative percentage. The junior duo of Haleigh Washington and Simone Lee led the way for the Nittany Lions over the evening. Washington had 11 kills on 14 attempts for a blistering .786 hitting. She added five blocks.

Lee tacked on 10 kills for her eighth match this season in double figures. The Menomonee Falls, Wisconsin, native added five digs and a pair of blocks.

Penn State rounds out its non-conference slate tomorrow, Saturday, Sept. 17, in a doubleheader. The Nittany Lions will take on Howard (10-3) tomorrow at 10 a.m. before closing out the Penn State Invitational with Clemson (4-6) at 7 p.m. Fans can gain entrance to the second match for just \$4 dollars with a ticket stub from the Penn State-Temple football game.

The Nittany Lions fired out the gates in their first set, opening the match on a 7-0 run, powered by Lee with a trio of kills. Penn State allowed just six points in the entire first frame, as PSU followed Rhode Island's first score with a 6-1 run of their own. Back-to-back kills from Washington were followed by a URI timeout when Penn State led, 17-4. URI scored twice more before kills from Washington, Lee and junior setter Abby Detering closed out the first set, 25-6.

The second set proved a tougher challenge. Both sides traded points to 10-10 before the Nittany Lions found their stride. A pair of Washington kills and errors from Rhode Island made it a five-point set and led Rhode Island to call for time at 17-12. The sides traded points once again before a pair of kills from junior Heidi Thelen turned the tide. The two scores gave Penn State a 22-17 advantage, forcing Rhode Island's second timeout. Washington notched one more kill before an error gave PSU a 2-0 advantage headed into the break, taking the second set 25-18.

Detering took hold in the final frame, guiding Penn State to .345 hitting while adding a trio of kills en route to the decisive 25-13 victory. After PSU and URI tied at six-all, Washington, Detering and junior outside hitter Ali Frantti each posted kills to lead a 4-0 run and force the Rhode Island timeout. The team never looked back, with Simone and Thelen providing a combined three kills to take a 19-10 lead. Washington and Detering closed out the set with kills to complete the sweep.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - The No. 20 Penn State women's volleyball team (7-3) strung together another straight-set performance on Saturday morning, taking down Howard (10-4) 3-0 (25-16, 25-12, 25-16) inside Rec Hall.

The Nittany Lions had a balanced attack, with four players posting seven or more kills in the match. Once again, junior outside hitter Simone Lee led the way for Penn State, this time with 12 kills. UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - The No. 20 Penn State women's volleyball team (8-3) swept both the Clemson Tigers (5-7) and the Penn State Invitational in Rec Hall on Saturday night after a 3-0 (25-14, 25-17, 25-12) win over its final opponent of the non-conference season.

The trio of Abby Detering, Haleigh Washington and Heidi Thelen earned all-tournament team honors after exceptional performances over the weekend. Detering guided the team to a .354 hitting clip in three matches, dishing out 91 assists while adding 14 digs, seven kills, six blocks and three service aces. Washington led the team in both kills (27) and hitting percentage (.610) over the weekend while also posting a team-best 15 blocks. Thelen's transition to right side proved a wise decision, as she came second on the team in kills with 21 while hitting at a .447 clip. She added four blocks, a pair of digs and an assist.

The Blue and White now enter the Big Ten Conference portion of its schedule. The Nittany Lions will kick off league play with a pair of road trips, first taking to Piscataway, New Jersey for a bout with Rutgers on Wednesday at 7 p.m. ET before flying to Evanston, Illinois to face Northwestern on Sunday, September 25 at 1 p.m. ET.

Penn State saw the majority of its offense come from Ali Frantti, Simone Lee and Washington in the first set, with each of the players notching three kills in the opening frame. After a 7-7 tie, the offense erupted for a 4-0 spurt with both Lee and Frantti making their presence known in the burst for an 11-7 lead. A few points later PSU took off for another 4-0 run, with a kill from Tori Gorrell and an ace courtesy of Detering making the score 17-10 when Clemson called its lone timeout of the set. It wouldn't slow the Nittany Lions who expanded the run to 8-0, grabbing a 21-10 lead. Clemson fended off two set points before Penn State took the first, 25-14.

Lee and Thelen posted four kill apiece while Washington added three kills and three blocks in the second frame. PSU did not trail throughout the second set after opening on a 4-2 run. Clemson came within one multiple times before a 4-0 run capped by Thelen's second kill of the scoring session made it 17-12. Clemson came within three at 18-15 before three consecutive kills from Washington launched a 7-2 outburst to win the second, 25-17.

The team held Clemson to -.075 in the final frame of action in a dominant 25-12 victory. The Nittany Lions opened on a 4-0 run and never looked back. Clemson came within one after a 3-0 spurt of their own before a pair of kills from Lee grew the score to 8-4. After kills from Thelen and Washington the crowd erupted in its loudest response of the night as freshman defensive specialist Kendall White struck a back row kill to force a Clemson timeout with a 12-5 edge. From there the lead only grew. PSU closed out the match on an 8-2 run, clinching the win and the perfect weekend.
