


BRIAN PATTERSON SPORTS PERFORMANCE CENTER



An exciting new chapter in the storied history of Rice Stadium and Rice Athletics debuts this fall when the Owls move into their sparkling new end zone facility, the Brian Patterson Sports Performance Center.

The fully-funded \$33 million project includes a 60,000-square-foot, two-story structure that houses a weight room, a home team locker room, coaching and staff offices, an auditorium, a football team lounge and areas for training and sports medicine that include hydrotherapy, plunge pools and exam rooms. The weight room and sports medicine areas will be available to student-athletes from all sports at Rice.

The new building features a glass wall on the side facing the football field that offers a view of the weight rooms on the ground and second floors. The other three sides will be made of brick that complements the color of the brick on the rest of the stadium. White columns supporting the roof will be similar to the columns in other parts of the stadium. A concrete ramp will provide access to the football field.

Fans will also benefit from the dramatic upgrade in facilities with the installation of a new Daktronics video system

Rice Stadium will also feature two acoustically transparent video displays in front of the venue's speaker systems. These free-form LED stick applications will measure 29 feet high by 10 feet wide to provide additional video and graphics capabilities in a space typically used for fixed signage. These displays will provide flexibility to show multiple sponsorship messages throughout an event or additional graphics to pump up the crowd at key moments during the game.

Rice is the second school in the country to implement the new technology and this installation is the largest of its kind.

Rice alumnus and three-year football letterman Brian Patterson provided the naming gift for the facility.

Patterson joined the Rice football program from Fort Worth Paschal High School in 1980 and graduated in 1984. He twice led the Owls in interceptions, and his nine career interceptions are tied for seventh best in school history. In 1983 he was named to the Academic All-America Division I football team by the College Sports Information Directors of America.

The architect for the project was HKS, which built the AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas, and the Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis. Anslow Bryant has served as the general contractor.

As he enters his 10th year at the helm of the Rice Owls, David Bailiff will celebrate the dawning of an exciting new era as the program realizes a long-sought goal with the opening of the new Brian Patterson Sports Performance Center as well as continuing to deliver an unparalleled standard of success on the field and in the classroom.

Bailiff will become just the fourth head coach to lead the Owls for at least a decade, joining Jess Neely (27 years), Ken Hatfield (12 years) and Phillip Arbuckle (11 years) and he is just four wins away from passing Hatfield to move into second on the Owls career win list.

In nine seasons on South Main, Bailiff has built a program that has become one of the most consistent in Conference USA. Under his watch, the Owls have earned four bowl berths and won three bowl championships and have produced the most wins in school history over a two (18 three (25) and four (30) year period. Rice's 18-9 mark from 2013-14 was the second best of any FBS program in Texas. He has led the Owls to two of the three 10-win seasons in school history and has won eight or more games three times, matching Jess Neely for the most at Rice.

Bailiff has twice been honored by his peers as C-USA Coach of the Year (2008 & 2013) and after leading the Owls to their first outright conference championship in 56 years in 2013, he joined Art Briles (Baylor), Mark Dantonio (Michigan State), Gus Malzahn (Auburn) and David Shaw (Stanford) as finalists the Bear Bryant Coach of the Year award. He was also honored by the San Antonio Express News as its Co-Sportsman of the Year.

While reaching new heights on the field, Bailiff's teams continue to excel in the classroom while also making a profound impact on the Houston community. Twice in his tenure, the Owls were honored by the American Football Coaches Association with its Academic Achievement Award, having posted a 100 percent graduation rate. Rice has led Conference USA football teams in GPA in six of his nine seasons.

He was honored with the Greater Houston Football Coaches Association's John Kelley Distinguished Service Award and by the Conference USA Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) Coaches Choice Award winner for 2011-12. He was also cited by the Houston Press as "Houston's Best Sports Role Model" in its 2013 Best of Houston edition.

Bailiff's staff has made the state of Texas a priority in recruiting, solidifying relationships with high school coaches throughout the state and the result has shown itself both in the team success and in the number of players reaching the NFL as well as in his successful efforts to bring the Texas High School Coaches Association Convention to Houston in 2015.

The Owls have eight players taken in the NFL Draft during Bailiff's tenure, matching the output of the previous 22 years prior to his arrival. A total of six players from his first five recruiting classes have been selected. A record nine Owls recruiting by Bailiff saw action in the NFL in 2015 and a 10th., Jordan Taylor, was on the practice squad with Denver and became the second Bailiff recruit in the last three years to win a Super Bowl ring (Luke Willson, Seattle, 2014).

His efforts in Texas have also seen the Owls increase their walk-on program. Most recently, the walk-on program produced 2015 leading receiver Zach Wright.

He has also made good on his promise to keep the Owls active in community work, as the Owls have been tireless in their efforts with local schools as well as reaching out to Rice's diverse student population through an annual International Students' Clinic each August. In July of 2009, Bailiff accepted an invitation to join with four other college football coaches on a goodwill tour to visit military personnel stationed in Afghanistan and again honored our troops in 2011 by participating as a driver in the "Crossing of America" tour. The Owls also are regular participants in efforts to send care packages to members of the armed forced deployed overseas.

The Rice football team was honored by the Texas Association of Partners in Education with their TAPE's Crystal Award for the program the Owls conducted in 2007 with the students at Arizona Fleming Elementary School in Houston. The Owls support of Big Brothers helped Rice Athletics be honored in 2012 as one of the Houston chapter's Community Partners of the Year.

In 2008, the Owls endured a series of challenges as well as the aftermath of Hurricane lke and produced the first 10-win season for Rice since 1949 and the Owls' first victory in a bowl game since their memorable win over Alabama in the 1954 Cotton Bowl. For his efforts, Bailiff was honored by his conference peers with his first Conference USA Coach of the Year honor.

Bailiff came to Rice after three seasons as the head coach at Texas State University in San Marcos where he posted a 21-15 record while leading the Bobcats to their first Southland Conference championship and the semifinals of the NCAA Division 1-AA playoffs in 2005.

He produced a total of 14 All Southland Conference first team selections, and 13 players who were named to the academic all-conference squad in his last two years.

The 2005 season was truly a magical one. The Bobcats went 9-2 during the regular season and earned the school's first berth in the Division I-AA play-offs.

In their first game, the Bobcats stormed back from a 35-16 deficit against Division I-AA national power Georgia Southern to score 34 unanswered points and beat the Eagles 50-35. The Cats then defeated Cal Poly 14-7 to move on to the national semifinals. Only a 40-37 overtime loss to Northern Iowa stood between Texas State and an appearance in the Division I-AA title game.

Bailiff was named the American Football Coaches Association's Region 5 Coach of the Year and finished third in the voting for the Eddie Robinson Award presented annually to the top coach in Division I-AA. Prior to being named Texas State head coach, Bailiff spent three seasons on the staff at TCU. He served as the Horned Frogs' defensive coordinator in both 2002 and 2003 while working with the team's defensive lineman.

The 2003 Horned Frogs posted an 11-2 record and were ranked 25th in the final Associated Press writer's poll and 24th in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. Bailiff was part of a staff which built a tradition on defense at TCU. During his three seasons in Fort Worth, the Horned Frogs were ranked 24th, 1st and 38th in the country in total defense and 10th, first and ninth against the run.

In 2002, TCU allowed just 240.2 yards of total offense per game which led the country. The Horned Frogs surrendered an average 64.8 yards on the ground. During the year, the Frogs held Tulane to a school-record -53 yards rushing. TCU also ranked second in the country in pass efficiency defense, al-

lowing opponents to complete less than 39 percent of their passes.

Six TCU defensive players earned all-conference accolades in 2002 including Conference USA Defensive Player of the year and Second-Team All-American LaMarcus MacDonald.

While at TCU, the Horned Frogs played in a bowl game every season - the galleryfurniture.com Bowl (2001), AXA Liberty Bowl (2002) and the Plains Capital Fort Worth Bowl (2003).

He began his coaching career as the defensive line coach at New Braunfels High School (1982-84). He went into private business from 1984-88 before returning to the coaching ranks as a defensive graduate assistant coach at Texas State in 198. He was elevated to the Bobcats' defensive line coach in 1989.

Bailiff left Texas State in 1992 for an assistant coaching position at New Mexico. He returned to Texas State in 1997 as defensive coordinator and added assistant head coach responsibilities to his role in 1999.

It was in 1999 that Bailiff was selected the NCAA Division I-AA Assistant Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association. While at TCU, Bailiff was also honored as the Top Assistant Football Coach by the All-American Football Foundation following the Horned Frogs' 2002 season.

As a player, Bailiff was named All-Lone Star Conference as well as All-America honorable mention while playing at Texas State from 1977-80. He served as a team captain in 1980 and was named honorable mention to the Lone Star Team of the Decade.

Bailiff is married to the former Angie Daniels of Versailles, Mo. He has a daughter, Brooke and the couple has twin 19-year-old sons, Grayson and Gregory.

DARRELL PATTERSON ASST. HEAD COACH/RUN GAME COORD. LINEBACKERS 10TH SEASON

Darrell Patterson is back for his 10th season at Rice University and his fifth as Assistant Head Coach. After coaching the running backs during his first three seasons, he enters his seventh year of coaching the Owl's linebackers, his sixth as Special Teams Coordinator and his third as Run Game Coordinator.

Patterson enters the 2016 campaign with another deep group of linebackers, highlighted by consensus All C-USA pick Alex Lyons, who has led the team in tackles in consecutive years. He is joined by junior Emanuel Ellerbee at the top of the depth chart heading into fall camp. A pair of true sophomores, Jack Fox and Hayden Tobola are slated to handle the special teams kicking chores. Fox will again handle the kickoffs while taking over for James Farrimond at punter. Tobola enters fall camp as the favorite to continue handling all place kicks.

In his six seasons overseeing the Owls special teams, Patterson has produced one All-American (punter Kyle Martins) and one freshman All-American (kick returner Mario Hull) in addition to the most productive kicker in school history, Chris Boswell who departed with all the school records for field goals and kick scoring. Boswell took over as the Pittsburgh Steelers kicker in 2015 and set a club record for field goals by a first-year player (29) as well as records for more postseason field goals (7).

In addition to his coaching duties, Patterson also continues to spearhead Rice's recruiting efforts in Canada, where he had a playing career in the CFL for seven seasons (1984-90). The Owls have signed a total of eight Canadians in the past nine years, including All C-USA offensive tackle Scott Mitchell and All C-USA tight end Luke Willson. Two of those signees (Willson and Christian Covington) were drafted into the NFL. In 2016, Canadian product Peter Godber will enter his second year as one of the starters at offensive guard.

Patterson joined the Rice coaching staff on February 20, 2007 after two seasons coaching the linebackers at Stanford University.

Patterson's collegiate playing experience took place at Texas Christian University, where he was a standout linebacker from 1979-82. He is a member of the TCU Hall of Fame and remains the school's all-time leader in tackles (544), unassisted tackles (286), and assisted tackles (258).

He was selected in the sixth round of the 1983 NFL Draft by the New York Giants, but made his way to the Canadian Football League (CFL) for a seven-year career-playing for the Winnipeg Blue Bombers from 1984-88 and the Hamilton Tiger Cats from 1988-90. Patterson won a Grey Cup championship with Winnipeg in 1984 and was on the runner-up team with Hamilton in 1989.

Following his playing days, Patterson began his coaching career as an intern for the British Columbia Lions in 1991. His coaching career has, since then, led him to Akron (1992-94), Temple (1995-96), Kentucky (1997-00), Arkansas State (2001), Baylor (2002), Southern


Methodist (2003-04), and Stanford (2005-07). He also had a coaching stint with Ottawa of the CFL in 1995 as the defensive line and special teams coach.

While coaching at Southern Methodist, Baylor, and Arkansas State, Patterson coached the linebackers. At Baylor, he coached linebacker John Garrett, who went on to sign an NFL free agent contract. Patterson coached defensive tackle Larry Chester during his two seasons at Temple. Chester went on to sign an NFL contract with the Indianapolis Colts.

During his four seasons at Kentucky, Patterson was part of a staff that advanced to two bowl games: the 1998 Outback Bowl versus Penn State and the 1999 Music City Bowl against Syracuse. While at Kentucky, Patterson coached safeties Willie Gary and Anthony Wajda to All-SEC honors, as well as Freshman All-America David Jackson.

Patterson graduated with a bachelor's degree in Human Relations from TCU in 1984.

He and his wife, Julie, whom he met while playing professionally in Canada, have three children together: a son, Michael, who was a three-year letterman and 2012 Rice graduate, and two daughters, Monika and Meghan, who are both currently undergraduates at Rice. Meghan lettered with Rice volleyball team in 2015 and returns for her senior season this fall.



Larry Edmondson enters his eighth year with the Owls and his third as Co-Offensive Coordinator with Billy Lynch, while continuing to coach the Rice quarterbacks (sixth year). Edmondson joined the Rice staff on January 30, 2009 as the Owls' wide receiver coach.

In 2016, Edmondson's quarterback corps will be headed by strong-armed senior Tyler Stehling, who has averaged 13.3 yards per completion and completed 53% of his passes as a backup the past two seasons along with junior Nate German, redshirt freshmen J.T. Granato and Jackson Tyner and true freshman Sam Glaesmann.

Edmondson is entering his 28th year of college coaching, including 14 years of coaching wide receivers. He was the wide receivers coach at SMU from 2004 to 2007, Auburn in 1997-98, Mississippi State in 1996, LSU from 1991-94 and at Southern Miss from 1988-90. He has also served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at SMU (2002-03) and Louisiana-Lafayette (1999-2001).

While at SMU, Edmondson guided Bobby Chase to All-C-USA honors in 2005 and Emmanuel Sanders to All-Conference and fresh-

man All-America honors in 2006. As the offensive coordinator at Louisiana-Lafayette, he constructed an offense that set six school records in 2001 and was credited with the development of sophomore quarterback Jon Van Cleave, who led the Sun Belt Conference in passing yards per game.

In addition to coaching wide receivers at Auburn, Edmondson also oversaw the Tigers recruiting efforts. Auburn won the 1997 SEC West Division championship and went on to defeat Clemson in the 1998 Peach Bowl.

A 1983 graduate of Texas A&M where he lettered as a tight end and was a teammate of Denver Bronco's head coach Gary Kubiak, Edmondson began his coaching career as a graduate assistant with the Aggies from 1984 to 1986. He served as a GA at Arizona in 1987 before joining Curly Hallman's staff at Southern Miss as wide receivers coach in 1988.

In his first year at USM, the Golden Eagles went 10-2 including a 38-18 win over UTEP in the Independence Bowl. Southern Miss opened the 1990 season with a win over Florida State and played in the All-American Bowl that year, and also posted wins over both Alabama and Auburn during his time there.

Married (Cara) with two children, son Sean and daughter Taylor.



BILLY LYNCH CO-OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR WIDE RECEIVERS SIXTH SEASON

Billy Lynch enters his third year as Co-Offensive Coordinator and his sixth coaching Owls' wide receivers. Lynch shares offensive oversight with quarterbacks coach Larry Edmondson, but will take over calling the plays this year as Edmondson focuses on the development of the Owl's youthful quarterback corps.

In his first five seasons at Rice, Lynch has developed a productive unit of wideouts, including four who found their way into NFL camps (Mario Hull, Donte Moore, Dennis Parks and Jordan Taylor). Taylor earned a Super Bowl ring with Denver while spending the year on the practice squad and earning national acclaim from Peyton Manning as his training partner while the future Hall of Famer rehabbed from an injury before leading the Broncos to the NFL title. Taylor completed his career as the Owls ranked second in receiving yards (2,585) and receiving touchdowns (20) and third in receptions (175). Parks ranks 10th in receiving yards (1,507) while Hull's 2014 touchdown total (8) is tied for sixth all-time.

This season, Lynch has a deep and talented corps of receivers to choose from, led by former walk-on Zach Wright, who led the team in receiving in 2015.

Rice's drive to the 2013 C-USA Championship was highlighted by the big play production of Taylor and Parks. Three of Taylor's eight touchdown receptions were from 60 yards out or longer, including a 75-yard bomb from Taylor McHargue that set a C-USA Championship game record. Parks led the team by averaging 17.5 yards per catch while finishing second to Taylor in catches and receiving yards. Taylor emerged as a vital component of the Owls 2012 air attack, punctuated by his record-setting effort in the Armed Forces Bowl. He set a Rice bowl game record with 153 yards and three touchdowns on nine receptions to earn Rice MVP honors in the game. Lynch also guided the transition of Sam McGuffie from running back to receiver and the senior responded with 54 receptions and five touch downs.

Lynch joined the Rice coaching staff on Feb. 22, 2011 after six seasons at Indiana where he developed some of the most productive receivers in Hoosiers' history.

In 2010 his top three receivers, Damarlo Belcher (78/832/4), Terrance Turner (67/681/3) and Doss (63/706/7 touchdowns) topped 60 catches and 700 yards and the unit set a school record with 3,446 total yards.

In 2009, Tandon Doss became Lynch's second All-Big Ten receiver as he earned first team honors (media) and second team recognition from the league's coaches.

As sophomores in 2009, Doss and Belcher became the first duo in IU history to each collect 60-plus receptions and 700-plus yards in a season. Their 138 combined catches rank first in Hoosier lore and 1,732 yards sit second.

Doss finished second in the Big Ten in yards per game (80.2) and third in the league and tied for 22nd nationally in catches per game (6.64). He closed out the year second on IU's single-season receptions list and fifth in the school's single-season yardage rankings.

The 2008 corps, led by Ray Fisher and Andrew Means, saw four receivers reach 25 receptions and post over 275 yards. It also featured one of the top true freshman duos in IU history - Belcher and Doss.

Fisher and Means, who signed a professional baseball contract with the Cincinnati Reds in 2008, became the 13th and 14th Hoosiers, respectively, to go over 100 career receptions and 1,000 career yards, joining Hardy as wideouts under Lynch to enter the elite club. Belcher (25/337/2) and Doss (14/186/1) combined

for the second-highest receiving yardage total by a true freshman duo in school history.

The 2007 season saw Lynch's wide receivers re-write the IU record books, as they recorded a school-record 3,073 yards. Hardy, who was selected in the second round (41st pick) by the Buffalo Bills, set new school marks with 16 receiving TDs and 79 catches. He finished his career as the school's all-time receiving yardage (2,740), receptions (191) and receiving touchdowns (36) leader. Hardy was a semi-finalist for the Biletnikoff Award, named All-America by five publications and selected first team All-Big Ten.


The 2006 Hoosiers finished third in the Big Ten in receiving yards per game. Hardy was second team All-Big Ten (51/722/10).

In 2005, Lynch tutored Hardy to one of the most prolific debut seasons IU has seen at wide receiver. Hardy finished with 61 receptions (fourth in school history), 10 touchdowns (tied for third all-time) and 893 yards (seventh all-time). In addition, his five 100-yard games were tied for the second most in a season in school history.

One of five assistant coaches that came from Miami (Ohio) University to Indiana, Lynch was the RedHawks' tight ends coach in 2004 and offensive graduate assistant in 2002-03. During his tenure in Oxford, Lynch assisted with a potent offense that led the nation at 43.0 points per game in 2003.

He spent his undergraduate years as a wide receiver and three-year letter winner at Ball State University, where he graduated with a bachelor's degree in education in 2002. He led the Cardinals with 40 receptions his senior year. He also lettered three years in basketball, including the 2000-01 and 2001-02 seasons for then-BSU head coach and current Indiana assistant basketball coach Tim Buckley.

Billy and his wife, Carla, have four children, daughter Lindsey (10), and sons, Max (8), Ryan (7) and Michael (3)



Chris Thurmond enters his fifth season as Rice's Defensive Coordinator and his fifth year overall coaching the Owls' cornerbacks.

In an era of astronomical passing numbers that have sent defensive averages spiraling, Thurmond's defenses have been a major factor in the Owls surge to the 2013 Conference USA Championship, three consecutive bowl berths for the first time in school history as well as the best win totals in school history over the past four seasons.

After a stretch of eight seasons when opponents averaged 465 yards per game, Thurmond's defense has held opponents to an average of 397 yards over the last three years, highlighted by a 364.1 effort in 2013. They finished 30th in the country in total defense in 2013, their highest finish since 1994 when they finished 25th.

They have held 13 opponents over the last three years to less than 20 points, matching the total for the Owls over the previous nine years. The 2015 Owls were one of the nation's best in 4th down defense, holding opponents to a 25% success rate (5/20) and ranked 21st by holding opposing passers to a quarterback rating of 148.7.

Two of Thurmond's most recent graduates have gone on to find success in the NFL. Bryce Callahan became a fixture at corner with the Chicago Bears, joining 2014 draftee Phillip Gaines (3rd round/ Kansas City). Thurmond saw Gaines finish

second in the country in pass breakups as a junior and enter his senior year as the preseason defensive player of the year in the conference.

Thurmond originally joined the staff on Feb. 22, 2011, after spending the previous three seasons at Kentucky. In his first year with the Owls, Thurmond guided his younger corners through the challenge of early-than-expected playing time due to injuries to the veterans. At the end of the season, Callahan had earned Freshman All-America and Conference USA All Freshman honors after picking off six passes to lead the nation and defending 15 passes.

In his three seasons at Kentucky, the Wildcats advanced to bowl games each season -Liberty Bowl (2008), Music City Bowl (2009) and the BBVA CompassBowl (2010).

Thurmond had student-athletes go on to sign National Football League contracts two straight seasons. Kentucky cornerback Trevard Lindley earned second-team All-America honors in 2008 and established a UK career record for pass breakups. Despite being sidelined for much of his senior season in 2009, Lindley repeated All-SEC honors in 2009 and was drafted by the NFL's Philadelphia Eagles.

Defensive backs coached or recruited by Thurmond have been a part of three Super Bowl championship teams. Both Anthony Madison (Pittsburgh Steelers) and Roman Harper (New Orleans Saints), who Thurmond recruited to the University of Alabama, were members of Super Bowl XLIII and XLIV championship teams in 2009 and 2010, respectively. Thurmond also coached Green Bay Packer Charlie Peprah, who was part of the Super Bowl XLV championship team in 2011.

Between stints at Alabama (2001-02) and Kentucky (2008-10), Thurmond coached five seasons in the state of Texas. Highlighted by a trip to the Cotton Bowl following the 2004 season, he was the cornerbacks coach at Texas A&M from 2003-05.

He coached cornerbacks and was the recruiting coordinator for two seasons at the University of Houston (2006-07). He helped the Cougars advance to the 2006 Liberty Bowl and in 2007 was the interim head coach for UH when the team played

in the Texas Bowl after head coach Art Briles became the coach at Baylor.

While at Houston, he coached cornerback Willie Gaston who was a secondteam All-Conference USA selection and went on to play for the Baltimore Ravens.

During his two seasons coaching the cornerbacks at Alabama, the Crimson Tide won the 2001 Independence Bowl. The 2002 Alabama team led the SEC and ranked third nationally in total defense, posting the best record in the SEC Western Division. Eight Alabama players he either coached or recruited signed National Football League contracts.

Thurmond has also worked at Tulsa (1983-91, 1994), East Carolina (1992-93), Texas Christian (1995, 1998-2000) and Oklahoma (1996-97), coaching the cornerbacks or entire secondary unit during each of the stints.

During his second term at TCU, Thurmond helped guide the Horned Frogs to the 2000 Western Athletic Conference co-championship. TCU led the nation in scoring defense and total defense while ranking third in pass efficiency defense.

While at Tulsa in 1991, the Golden Hurricane ranked among the nation's leaders in pass defense efficiency. Tulsa capped the season with a win in the Freedom Bowl.

Thurmond has coached in 15 bowl games during his career and has coached or recruited numerous athletes who have gone on to play in the NFL including Gaines, Madison, Harper, Peprah, Lindley and Mark Anderson (Houston Texans).

A native of Sand Springs, Okla., Thurmond graduated from the University of Tulsa in 1975. He spent seven years as a high school coach in Oklahoma including head coach at his alma mater, Charles Page High School, before entering the college ranks. In 2015 he was inducted into Sand Springs Athletic Hall of Fame.

Thurmond's wife Paula and daughter Paige live in Little Rock, Ark.



HOEFER **FIFTH SEASON**

Texas native and longtime defensive coach Larry Hoefer is in his fifth year of coaching the talented group of Rice safeties. He joined David Bailiff's staff on February 6, 2012.

Hoefer's safeties have played a major role in the Owls defensive efforts that have sparked the Owls success over the past four years including three bowls, the most wins over the past four years in school history and capturing the 2013 Conference USA title.

Hoefer's safety corps in 2016 is bolstered by the move of linebacker Tabari Mc-Gaskey to strong safety where he will team with returning starters J.P. Thompson, Destri White and J.T. Ibe who all finished top six in tackles last season.

In Hoefer's first year on South Main, the Owls safety corps overcame the loss of two-year starter Corey Frazier at the start of the season as Paul Porras put together his best season and Julius White stepped into the void and finish third on the team in tackles. Porras led the Owls with 93 tackles while he and White shared the team lead with a pair of interceptions. The Owls safeties combined with the cornerbacks to hold opponents to only 21 touchdown passes, the fewest since 2005.

A veteran of 38 years of coaching, Hoefer came to Rice after eight seasons at Baylor where he coached both the safeties (2003-07) and linebackers (2008-10).

Hoefer, who came to Baylor in 2003 with Guy Morriss from Kentucky, served as

Baylor's defensive coordinator and safeties coach in 2007. He coached at least one All-Big 12 performer every year.

In his first year at Baylor, Hoefer coached the Bears' leading tackler in Maurice Lane, who had 129 stops at free safety en route to honorable mention All-Big 12 honors, and Derrick Cash, the team's fourth-leading tackler as a strong safety. Another pupil, weak safety Willie Andrews, led the team in interceptions and was third on the squad in tackles.

In 2004, Andrews earned first-team All-Big 12 honors as a safety from the Dallas Morning News and as a return specialist from the league's coaches, while Lane garnered first-team all-conference recognition from the San Antonio Express-News. Lane again paced the squad in tackles, while Andrews again ranked third in tackles and had a team-high three sacks. Lane led the Bears in tackles for the third consecutive year in 2005 en route to first-team All-Big 12 honors from both The Associated Press and the Dallas Morning News, Andrews earned first-team All-Big 12 recognition from the league's coaches as a safety and was later selected in the seventh round of the 2006 NFL Draft.

In 2006, strong safety Maurice Linguist and free safety Dwain Crawford both earned honorable mention All-Big 12 honors from the league's coaches. Jordan Lake was a consensus second-team All-Big 12 selection as a free safety in 2007 after leading the Bears with 120 total tackles.

In 2008, Hoefer coached linebacker Joe Pawelek, who ranked seventh nationally in both tackles (10.7 per game) and interceptions (0.5 per game) - the only player nationally ranked in the top 10 of both categories. Pawelek was named an All-American and consensus All-Big 12 player.

Hoefer spent two seasons as safeties coach on Morriss' Kentucky staff before making the move to Waco. He went to UK from Texas-El Paso, where he was defensive coordinator and linebackers coach for the 2000 season. The Miners posted an 8-3 regular season record, were WAC co-champions and played in the Humanitarian Bowl. The bowl game marked Hoefer's sixth as a coach, in addition to four at

Texas Tech and one (1988) during his previous stint at UTEP.

Using an eight-man front under Hoefer's guidance, UTEP reduced its rushing yards allowed from 208.2 yards per game in 1999 to 153.8 ypg in the 2000 season. UTEP held five of its league opponents under 100 vards rushing. The Miners also ranked 19th nationally in pass efficiency defense.

Hoefer worked for coach Spike Dykes at Texas Tech from 1994-99, where he coached the outside linebackers. Tech was bowl-eligible every season and played in the Cotton, Copper, Alamo and Independence bowls during Hoefer's tenure. Among his pupils were Marcus Coleman, a first-team All-American in 1995 and Ty Ardoin, each of whom played in the NFL. Hoefer also coached All-Big 12 picks Robert Johnson and Jody Brown. Tech ranked first in the nation for takeaways over a five-year period from 1993-97.

Hoefer had multiple responsibilities as an assistant at Missouri from 1989-93. working his way up from receivers coach to defensive coordinator and assistant head coach. His first term at UTEP, from 1982-88, was capped by a 10-win season and a berth in the 1988 Independence Bowl.

A native of Abilene, Texas, Hoefer stayed in his hometown and played defensive back at McMurry University, graduating in 1973. He was team captain and earned the squad's MVP honor.

Hoefer's first coaching stop was at Tarleton State from 1974-75 as a graduate assistant working with the defensive backs. He went on to coach at Big Spring (Texas) High School in 1976 and Abilene (Texas) High from 1977-80. Hoefer coached at West Texas State in 1981 before joining the UTEP staff for the first time.

Hoefer and his wife, Kathy, have three children and seven grandchildren.



Okam graduated from Texas in 3 1/2 years with a degree in Sport Management while minoring in Business. He attended Lake Highlands High School in Dallas where he was a Parade and US Army All-American and graduated in the top 5 percent of his class.

Frank Okam assumed the duties of defensive line coach in March of 2016 after spending two years as a graduate assistant with the Owls.

In his first year with Rice, Okam will guide a young group of linemen who were forced into immediate playing time in 2015 and showed continued growth throughout the season.

Okam was a four-year letterman at defensive tackle at Texas, where he earned All-America and All Big 12 honors. He earned freshman All-America honors from The Sporting News in 2004 and was an All Big 12 selection in 2006 (first team) and 2007 (second team). He was a starter for the Longhorn's 2005 BCS Champions and was credited with a pair of tackles, including a sack, in the National Championship game vs. USC in the Rose Bowl.

He was drafted in the fifth round of the 2008 draft by the Houston Texans and played with them for three seasons. He was waived during the 2010 season and was signed by Seattle. He also played with Tampa Bay and saw his final league action when he was in training camp with the New York Giants in 2013.



UAVID SLOAN TIGHT ENDS RECRUITING COORDINATOR SIXTH SEASON

Former All-Pro tight end David Sloan enters his fifth season of coaching the Owls tight ends in 2016, and his second year of overseeing the Owls recruiting efforts.

In 2016, Sloan welcomes a formidable due in senior Connor Cella and junior Robby Wells, who returns after a redshirt season. Cella, a member of the Mackey Award preseason watch list has been a fixture at tight end for the past three years. Wells used the redshirt year to add nearly 30 pounds to his 6-6 frame.

This is not the first time Sloan has had a potent set of veteran tight ends at his disposal.

In his initial campaign as tight ends coach, Sloan oversaw a loaded lineup that included a pair of draftees (Vance McDonald and Luke Willson) along with third (Taylor Cook) who earned a tryout with the Dallas Cowboys . McDonald and Willson allowed Rice to match Stanford as the only schools to have a pair of tight ends taken in the 2013 NFL Draft.

Willson helped spark Seattle to a return trip to the Super Bowl in

2015. He caught a game-winning touchdown in the final minute vs. Carolina and then a game-tying, two-point conversion from Russell Wilson during the Seahawks comeback playoff win over Green Bay.

Willson became the sixth Owl to win a Super Bowl ring, starting for Seattle in Super Bowl XLVIII and catching a pair of passes for 17 yards against Denver. Willson met McDonald in the NFC title game. McDonald was taken in the second round (55th overall) by the 49ers, the highest draft selection for Rice since Bert Emanuel (a former teammate of Sloan's) in 1994.

McDonald, who saw his 2014 playing time with San Francisco limited by an injury, finished his career ranked in the Owls top ten in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and became the first Owl since ND Kalu in 1996 to be invited to play in the Senior Bowl. Willson was a four-year starter who was drafted by the Toronto Argos of the CFL prior to his senior year and was a standout in the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl.

Sloan is in his seventh season overall at Rice, having come to campus as a graduate assistant and also serving in a quality control position . When Sloan joined the Owls in 2010, he reunited with Rice head coach David Bailiff, who was on the staff at the University of New Mexico in 1993 when Sloan signed with the Lobos out of junior college.

A two-time Academic All-Conference selection while playing basketball at Fresno City College from 1990-91, Sloan made the jump to football in the fall of 1992.

He caught the eye of Bailiff after catching 13 passes for 254 yards and 4 touchdowns. He signed with New Mexico and earned All-WAC Honorable Mention as a junior in 1993. He improved on that effort as a senior, earning first-Team All-WAC honors and was named one of the Lobos' team co-captains after catching 24 receptions for 320 yards and 1 touchdown during his senior campaign.

After his senior year, he played in the Blue Gray All-Star Game, Senior Bowl and participated in NFL Scouting combine in Indianapolis.

Sloan was selected in the third round of the 1995 by the Detroit Lions and became a starter midway through his rookie season and the Lions won seven straight to earn a playoff spot. He enjoyed his best season in 1999, when he earned a spot in the Pro Bowl after catching 47 passes for 591 yards and four touchdowns as the Lions again reached the playoffs. Sloan started for the NFC in the 2000 Pro Bowl and was named as an alternate in 2001. He led the Lions with seven touchdown passes in 2001. He was signed by New Orleans in 2002 and retired after the 2003 season. He finished his NFL career with 199 receptions, for 2251 yards and 17 touchdowns in cluding seven catches for 100 yards and two touchdowns in three playoff games.

He has two daughters: Trinity (12) and Bentley (10) while he and wife Angela are expecting their first child this fall.



A.J. Steward enters his third year of coaching the Rice running backs. He was promoted to running backs coach on March 7, 2014 after spending the previous two seasons as an offensive graduate assistant.

Steward has a deep corps of running backs at his disposal in 2016, led by the senior tandem of Darik Dillard and Jowan Davis, who are the first pair of Owls' running backs to enter their senior years with over 1,700 yards and are one of four returning FBS duos who have topped that mark. They are joined by sophomores Samuel Stewart and Austin Walter, who combined for 800 yards on the ground and 1,700 all-purpose yards and powerful redshirt freshman Emmauel Esupka.

In his first year at Rice, Steward saw Davis and Dillard step into the void created by the departed Charles Ross, rushing for a combined 1,608 yards and 17 touchdowns.

Steward originally joined the staff prior to the 2012 season as a GA after graduating from the University of Kansas with a BSE in

Health and Physical Education.

Steward was a four-year letterman at Kansas. Originally recruited as a quarterback, Steward found his first playing time as a wide receiver before switching to tight end. He was a member of the 2008 Orange Bowl Championship team, earning the Otto Schnellbacher Scout Team Player of the Year as a quarterback, as well as the 2008 Insight Bowl champions.

He was a four-time member of the Athletic Director's Honor Roll. Steward and wife Virginia make their home in Houston.



VINKLAREK **OFFENSIVE LINE EIGHTH SEASON**

Ronnie Vinklarek enters his eighth season of coaching the Rice offensive line, having joined the Owls' football staff on February 28, 2009.

After a rebuilding year in 2015, Vinklarek welcomes a veteran unit in 2016 led by senior Connor Patterson, juniors Peter Godber and Trey Martin and sophomores Calvin Anderson and Sam Pierce.

Two of Vinklarek's three graduating 2014 seniors, lan Gray (Bears) and Nico Carlson (Cowboys), found their way into NFL rookie camps while 2015 senior Caleb Williams earned a tryout with the Denver Broncos

Vinklarek is no stranger to the Houston area or Conference USA. He coached the linemen at the University of Houston from 1988-93 and at SMU from 2004-07. He also coached at the high school level in Houston, coaching the defensive line at Spring Branch High School in 1983 and was the offensive coordinator at Clear Lake High School 1994 in a district championship season and at Conroe High School in 1996.

While at Houston, he mentored the offensive line that protected Andre Ware during his Heisman Trophy winning season (1989) and was selected to coach in the 1990 Blue-Gray Game after helping UH to a 10-1 season. He originally came to Houston as a graduate assistant under former Houston Oilers and Washington Redskins head coach Jack Pardee and was promoted to full-time assistant in 1990.

Vinklarek coached in the NFL for three seasons. He broke into the league in 2000 with the Tennessee Titans as their defensive quality control, linebackers and special teams coach. He moved on to the Buffalo Bills in 2001 and coached their offensive line for two seasons. In 2002 the Bills offensive line paved the way for a 4,359yard passer in Drew Bledsoe, a 1,439-yard rusher in Travis Henry and two 1,200-yard-plus receivers in Eric Moulds and Peerless Price.

Prior to joining the Owls, he coached the offensive line for the Edmonton Eskimos of the CFL. He broke into the coaching ranks as the seventh and eighth grade coach at Hill Country Middle School after graduating from Southwest Texas in 1981. From 1983 to 1984, was the defensive line coach for Spring Branch High School in Houston before becoming the defensive coordinator at Marble Falls (Texas) High School from 1984-86.

He also served as offensive line coach at Oklahoma State (1998 & 1999), Valdosta State (1997), Middle Tennessee State (2003) as well as with the CFL's Birmingham Barracudas (1995).

A Flatonia, Texas, native, Vinklarek is married to the former

Marianne Britz. The couple has two sons, Trevor, who is a freshman at Rice, and Trent.



JAYLON FINNER Defensive graduate assistant First season

A standout on three Rice bowl teams and the 2013 C-USA Champions, Jaylon Finner is in his first year as a defensive graduate assistant.

Finner was a four-year letterman for the Owls (2011-14) and started all 13 games at KAT for the Hawai'i Bowl Champions in 2014, finishing second on the squad with 68 tackles. He was credited with 124 tackles in his career.

He graduated from Rice in 2015 with a degree in Kinesiology and coached and taught at Houston's Episcopal High School in the fall of 2015.

Finner is single and lives in Houston.



Caleb Haynes is in his first year with the Owls and serves as a graduate assistant on offense.

Haynes joined the Owls after spending the last two years at Central Methodist (Mo.) University as the running back coach and the coordinator of the run game and special teams. He began his coaching career at Central Methodist in 2012 where he was a graduate assistant as well as the equipment manager, earning his Graduate Degree in Education (emphasis on Athletic Administration).

He played football at CMU from 2008-12, earning his degree in Physical Education & Health K-12.

John Simmons joined the Rice Football staff on August 1 as the Owls' Assistant Recruiting Coordinator and Events Specialist.

A 2014 graduate of UTSA with a degree in Public Relations, he was a member of the Roadrunners football team in their initial seasons. Ryan Tedford is in his first year with the Owls as their Strength & Conditioning Coach.

A four-year letterman in football at Sam Houston State in Huntsville, Tedford graduated from the school in 1995 and began his career as a graduate assistant at Texas from 1995-97, earning his master's degree in kinesiology in 1998. Jerry Pickle joined the Rice staff in June of 2008 as the Assistant AD for Football Operations.

He came to Rice after 24 years at Baylor, including the last 13 as the director of football operations. He joined the Baylor program full-time in 1986 as recruiting coordinator and administrative assistant to Hall of Fame coach Grant Teaff.

A veteran of 30 years on the Houston sports scene, Chuck Pool heads into his 11th year at the head of the Owls' publicity efforts.

He assumed his duties on August 23, 2006 when he became the third person to hold the Sports Information Director title at Rice, following Bill Whitmore (1950-84) and Bill Cousins (1984-2006). Pool guides athletic communications and publicity efforts for the Owls while serving as the primary contact for football as well as men's and women's tennis.

Pool and his staff were honored this past year by the Football Writers' Association of America as one of their Super 11 Sports Information staffs.

In his time at Rice, he has coordinated the Owls efforts to move their media information away from printed materials as well as developing a broader overall reach through sport-specific Facebook and Twitter initiatives with a heavy emphasis on video.

In 2011, he oversaw the redesign and relaunch of Riceowls.com while also writing and co-producing a five-part documentary on the 100th season of Rice Football. In 2010, he assumed administrative responsibility of the Owls' video productions and oversaw the creative aspects of *Owls Insider*, a half-hour show on Fox Sports Houston. That same year he was responsible for the expansion of OwlVision's baseball webcast production as well as the first-ever webcast of the C-USA outdoor track and field championship.

In 2006, his publicity efforts enabled a previously unknown sophomore wide receiver, Jarett Dillard, to become one of three finalists for the Biletnikoff Award finalist. Darik Dillard and Luke Turner each ran for a pair of scores as the Rice Owls weathered a pair of lightning delays during warmups to open a season in victorious fashion for the first time since 2008, downing Wagner 56-16.

GAME

Driphus Jackson, Austin Walter and Nate German added touchdowns on the ground, while Jackson connected with Sam Stewart on a 35-yard scoring pass to lead the Owls to their highest point total in any game since they scored 62 against East Carolina in 2010 and their most in a home opener since they thrashed SMU 56-27 in 2008. Rice totaled 543 yards, including 401 on ground as they wore down their visitors from New York.

Opening at home for the first time since 2012 when they lost to UCLA, the Owls saw the start of the season delayed by more than an hour due a pair of stoppages during warmups because of lightning in the area. It was the first time Rice had seen a home game delayed since 2007 when David Bailiff's debut as the Owls head coach was twice stopped by strong storms. Ironically that game was the last vs. an FCS school before Saturday's meeting with Wagner, but unlike that stormy night which saw the Owls fall to Nicholls State, Bailiff's 2015 squad shook off the inconvenience and quickly took control of the game.

Rice marched to scores in five of six first half possessions, piling up 338 yards in the first half. Dillard scored on a pair of runs, his second capping a 16-play, 93-yard drive, while Turner and Jackson added rushing scores of their own.

Senior safety Zach Espinosa, making his first career start after 39 games as a reserve, set up the final score of the half with an interception which led one play later to Jackson's TD toss to Stewart. After a sluggish third quarter that saw Rice gain only 35 yards, the Owls exploded for nearly 200 in the final stanza, highlighted by Nate German's 66-yard touchdown run. Redshirt freshman Austin Walter capped the day's scoring with a 32-yard run to give him 107 yards on the ground in his collegiate debut.

In addition to picking up the win, the game also allowed a total of 71 players to see action, 26 of them for the first time in their careers.

The win was the Owls fifth straight at Rice Stadium and their 13th in the last 14 home games. Overall, Rice has won 23 of its last 32 games since October of 2012.

Driphus Jackson and Dennis Parks produced career days and the Rice defense forced three key turnovers that resulted in 17 points as the Owls opened their 2015 Conference USA slate with a 38-24 win over North Texas at Apogee Stadium in Denton Texas on Saturday.

Jackson set career highs from completions (29) and yardage (373) with Parks responsible for eight of the completions for a career-high 163 yards and two touchdowns as the Owls stormed back from an 10-7 deficit in the second quarter to present head coach David Bailiff with his 50th career win at Rice. After the Mean Green took a 10-7 lead early in the second

After the Mean Green took a 10-7 lead early in the second quarter, Jackson responded to lead the Owls 75 yards in six plays to retake the lead on a 30-yard scoring strike to Zach Wright.

North Texas appeared to be threatening to move back in front later in the quarter as running back Willy Ivery broke loose for a 20 yard gain to the Rice 33, but Destri White knocked the ball free and Emamuel Ellerbee recovered his second of two fumbles on the day to end the threat with 1:37 left in the half. Jackson was unwilling to run out the final moments of the half, hitting Parks for a gain of 43 and Luke Turner for 27 more to set up Jack Fox's first career field goal to push the margin to 17-10 at the half.

The turnover binge continued on North Texas' first possession of the third quarter as Zach Espinosa made a diving grab of an overthrown Andrew McNulty pass at the Rice 44. After a short run on first down by Austin Walter, Jackson hit Parks on a deep pass over the middle for a 54-yard gain to the UNT 8. Two plays later, Samuel Stewart slammed into the end zone to up the Owl lead to 24-10

After a three and out, Jackson and the offense were back on the attack. He hit Connor Cella for 24 yards and Darik Dillard for 25 to set up a five yard run by Luke Turner to extend the lead to 31-10.

A second straight three and out and an 18-yard punt gave the Owls the ball back at the Mean Green 43. Stewart converted a fourth down run to keep the drive alive and Jowan Davis followed by gaining 21 yards on the next two carries to move the ball to the UNT 21. Four plays later, Jackson found Parks in the back of the end zone for a nine-yard score to cap a 21-point explosion and seemingly put the game out of reach, but true Bailiff's words, UNT as not ready to concede anything.

McNulty needed just six plays to navigate 67 yards at the end of the third quarter to cut the lead to 38-17. The Owls appeared to be in position to answer that score with one of their own, but Turner was stopped on fourth down at the Mean Green seven and on the first play after the stop, Carlos Harris stunned the Owls and breathed life into the remaining crowd with a 93-yard touchdown reception.

But the Rice defense stiffened in the final 7:42, quelling the Mean Green's last threat when a McNulty pass fell incomplete on fourth down at the Rice 43.

Davis, who was making his first appearance after being injured early in the opener against Wagner, finished with 102 yards on the day, the fifth time in his career he has topped 100 yards in a game. It marked the third time in as many games the Owls have had a 100-yard rusher this season, joining Walter (Wagner) and Steward (Texas) and the first time since 2004 that three different players have topped 100 yards rushing in consecutive games.

Seth Russell threw a school-record six touchdown passes as the fourth-ranked Baylor Bears extended the nation's longest current home winning streak to 18 games, downing Rice 70-17 at McLane Stadium.

GAME 4

The Owls came into the game hoping to make a memorable debut in the Bears' sparkling new home along the Brazos River, but after taking an early 3-0 lead, they could not hold off Baylor's high-octane attack, which piled up 793 yards, the most ever allowed by the Owls in a game.

Rice opened the game on offense for the fourth time in as many games this year and for the first time since the opener against Wagner, the Owls took advantage of the opportunity to score the first points of the day.

Driphus Jackson's 35-yard completion to Dennis Parks highlighted a 60 yard march that ended at the Bears' 13 when walk-on kicker Hayden Tobola successfully converted his first career field goal attempt from 37 yards out.

Baylor responded with touchdowns on its first two possessions, but the Owls responded after the second score in lighting fashion.

Freshman Austin Walter darted and spun his way to a 74-yard kickoff return, and Jackson and Parks hooked up on a 24-yard touchdown pass on the first play from scrimmage. The touchdown catch was Park's third of the year and the eighth of his career.

But the Bear offensive attack could not be stopped, as the home team scored three times in each of the first three quarters on their way to tally the most points ever in the 80 meetings between the two old Southwest Conference rivals.

Rice's opened the scoring in the second half as

well as Darik Dillard sliced his way into the end zone five plays J.P. Thompson stripped the ball free from Baylor's KD Cannon and Alex Lyons recovered at the Bears' 24.

Jackson was 10-of-17 for 115 yards and a touchdown. Temi Alaka set career-highs of five receptions for 70 yards to lead the Owls. Destri White led the defense with a career-high eight tackles.

Brandon Doughty threw for 409 yards and four touchdowns and C-USA preseason favorite Western Kentucky looked every bit the part in a 49-10 win at Rice Stadium in front of a crowd of 20,124.

GAME 5

The first-ever meeting between the two schools in football was also a meeting of the early 2015 leaders in C-USA's divisions and the Hilltoppers took control early, scoring three times in the first and twice more in the second to take 35-10 lead at halftime.

The Owls, who came into the game as the conference's top rushing unit at 225 yards per game, were held to just 85 on the ground against a unit that was giving up just under 200 per game. The offense was also stymied by six turnovers, their highest total since they turned the ball over seven times vs. UTEP in 2007.

Those six turnovers resulted in 21 points, including a pair of scores in the first half.

After forcing a three and out on Western's first possession, Rice drove 50 yards to take the early lead on a 27-yard field goal by walk-on freshman Hayden Tobola. But the Owls' lone lead of the day lasted just 39 seconds as Doughty led WKU 75 yard on three plays, the last a 10-yard scoring strike to Taywan Taylor.

They followed that with an 84-yard scoring drive to go up 14-3 and then took advantage of Rice fumble to strike quickly to increase the lead to 21-3.

Tyler Stehling came on in relief of Driphus Jackson after the senior tossed an interception in the second quarter and the junior from Spring sparked a 74 yard scoring drive that was capped off when Luke Turner bulled his way in from the three on fourth down to close to 28-10.

Jackson was 5-10 for 87 yards and one interception in the first half. Stehling finished with career-bests by completing 11 of 19 for 150 yards and one interception.

Bailiff said the move was made to try and put a spark into the Owls, but Jackson's status as the starter was not in jeopardy.

Sam Stewart led the Owls with a game-high 60 yards rushing on 11 carries while Dennis Parks and Temi Alaka each had four receptions.

Neither team scored in the third quarter and the Hilltoppers added a pair of late touchdowns, one of them set up by the Owls' final turnover of the game.

Head Coach David Bailiff stressed to the team after the game that their destiny remains in their own hands and they have the opportunity to create a potential rematch with WKU in the C-USA Championship game. But he also noted that after the results of the past two weeks, there may be some alterations to the Owls approach as they prepare for a road contest with FAU next Saturday in Boca Raton, Florida.

Driphus Jackson connected with Darik Dillard on a 14-yard touchdown with 2:07 left to cap a furious comeback after a lengthy weather delay and hand the Rice Owls a 27-26 win over Florida Atlantic at FAU Stadium. Rice scored twice in the final 7:21 while outgaining FAU 227 yard to 57 in the final quarter to fashion its first double-digit comeback in the fourth quarter since 2009. The win evened Rice's record to 3-3 overall and 2-1 in Conference USA heading into an off week. FAU fell to 1-4 overall and 1-1 in the conference.

Jackson gained 164 of his 311 yards of total offense over the game's final 13 minutes, passing for 129 and rushing for another 35 while allowing the Rice Owls to overcome a 12-point deficit, their largest fourth-quarter comeback since 2009. He threw for three scores on the day to move past Tommy Kramer and Randy Hertel into third on the Rice career list with 39 touchdown passes. Dillard topped 100 yards rushing for the first time this year and added a career-high 44 yards receiving. The touchdown reception was his first this year and is 20th career touchdown (17 rushing, 3 receiving).

After taking an 14-7 lead in the first quarter, Rice found itself in danger of dropping a third straight game and the fourth in the last five after FAU took scored early in the fourth quarter on a nine-yard run by Trey Rodriguez as a heavy rain shower hit stadium. The teams were sent to their locker rooms before FAU could extend its 26-14 lead with the extra point to wait out what became a 90 minute delay. Rice had piled up 252 yards and ran 46 plays in the first half, but after being held to just eight yards on 10 plays in the third quarter as FAU surged to its lead, head coach David Bailiff said his team used the delay to great advantage.

Play resumed with a Florida Atlantic failed two-point conversion, keeping the deficit at 12 points. Jackson marched the Owls 43 yards to the FAU 32, but the drive stalled and Rice turned the ball over on downs with only 9:44 on the clock.

Rice's defense, which had been pierced by FAU's Jaquez Johnson for 334 yards in the first three quarters, forced their only three-and-out of the game to put the ball back in Jackson's hands.

Starting from his own nine, Jackson missed on his first two throws but FAU was called for holding on a third down incompletion to give Rice new life at its 19. Jackson took advantage of the second chance, finding Connor Cella along the Rice sideline and the junior from Katy broke free for a career-long 60-yard gain to the FAU 21. After an incompletion on first down, Jackson saw an opening and burst up the middle to score and cut the lead to 26-21.

The drive covered 91 yards in just 41 seconds, leaving Rice

7:21 to complete the comeback and the defense obliged by blunting FAU's next effort at the FAU 38.

Jackson took over at the Rice 17 with 4:51 to go and promptly hit Dillard for a gain of 25 on a spectacular catch in front of the FAU bench. Three carries by Dillard accounted for 28 more yards to take the ball to the FAU 30.

Four plays later Jowan Davis appeared to score from four yards out, but Rice was flagged for holding to push the ball back to the 14. But not even a 10 yard setback could stall the Rice momentum as Jackson found Dillard for the score to put Rice back in front with 2:07 left.

Rice failed on a two-point try of its own and after a Jack Fox touchback, FAU began one final dive at its 25. Johnson connected on a 29-yard pass play on first down to move to the Rice 41 but a third down pass was broken up by true freshman Justin Bickham and Johnson was sacked by Alex Lyons and Preston Gordon on fourth down to seal the victory.

Lyons led the defense with nine tackles, Gordon was credited with 1.5 sacks, the first of his career, while Bickham was credited with breaking up three passes.

at the goal line after a 22-yard reception.

Zach Wright should find a banquet to attend every night before a Rice Football game.

After attending the ceremony in which his mother was inducted into the Rice Athletics Hall of Fame on Friday night, the junior wide receiver from The Woodlands provided the kind of ending to his mother's special weekend that no screen writer would dare to concoct.

In a driving rain that signaled the arrival of the remnants of Hurricane Patricia to Houston, Wright gathered in a wobbling delivery from quarterback Driphus Jackson to cap a frantic 75-yard drive in the final two minutes to give Rice a 38-31 win over Army West Point.

Rice won its second straight in its final non-conference game of the year to improve to 4-3 on the season. Army fell to 2-6, with five of those six losses coming by a combined 23 points.

Holly Jones-Wright was introduced to the crowd of 24,490 along with her fellow honorees near the end of the first quarter as the Owls held a 14-0 lead, the second touchdown coming on a short run after Zach was stopped

As she settled back into her seat for the rest of the game, she saw Army trade scores with Rice over the next two quarters before tying the game up with 10 points late in the fourth quarter, setting up her son's game-winning heroics.

Jackson's game winning toss to Wright completed a day in which he completed 20 of 30 passes for 267 yards and two scores, and erased the sting of a fumble on the previous series on the Rice 10 which put the Black Knights in prime position to grab the lead with just over four minutes left in the game.

Linebacker Alex Lyons, who finished with a seasonhigh 10 tackles, personally stalled the scoring threat, having a hand in all three tackles to force a 19-yard field goal from Daniel Grochowski which knotted the game at 31-31 with 2:13 remaining.

Taking over at his 25, Jackson found Temi Alaka up the west sideline for a gain of 17. Two plays later, he converted a crucial third down by hitting Luke Turner for 11 over the middle. Darik Dillard followed with runs of 20 and 12 to reach the Army 12 and forcing a Black Knight time out.

As the rain that had been a steady presence throughout the day began to pound Rice Stadium, Jackson brought the Owls to the line of scrimmage and saw an opportunity.

Rice head coach David Bailiff praised Jackson for shaking off the earlier fumble and leading the Owls to the winning score.

Dillard led the Owls in rushing for the second consecutive week, finishing the day with 89 yards on 10 carries. He also shared a flair for celebrating the 2015 Hall of Fame class with Wright, as his 34-yard touchdown on the Owls' first possession allowed him and brother Jarett, who joined Jones-Wright as an inductee, to tie James and Jaquizz Rodgers for the most combined touchdowns by siblings in NCAA history with 81.

Alaka enjoyed a career day, matching Wright for the team lead with six catches on a career-high 98 yards.

Jeff Driskel threw for 320 yards and four touchdowns to spark Louisiana Tech to a 42-17 win over Rice on Friday night at Rice Stadium and keep the Bulldogs (6-3/4-1) on top of the standings Conference USA's West Division.

Driphus Jackson threw for 180 yards and two scores for Rice, but the Owls (4-4/2-2) were stymied by several key drops as well as several key penalties as they fell to 0-2 at home in league play, dropping two conference games at Rice Stadium for the first time since 2009.

After forcing the Owls to punt on their opening possession, Driskel marched the Bulldogs 62 yards in five plays to take the lead as he found Trent Taylor for a 42-yard score.

Jackson answered with an impressive drive of his own, leading the Owls 75 yards in eight plays. Five of the eight plays were pass completions, including a 33 yarder to Nate German to the LA Tech 23. Four plays later, he dumped the ball off to Samuel Stewart and the redshirt freshman found his way to the end zone to tie the game at 7-7.

After Carlos Henderson returned the ensuing kickoff

57 yards, Driskel needed just five plays to put the Bulldogs back in front 14-7 as he allowed Henderson to finish what he started by connecting on a 14 yard scoring toss.

After the Owls next possession ended with a short punt, Tech took over at the Owls 48, but a Derek Brown sack of Driskel ended the threat.

The Rice defense carried that momentum over to the early second period, forcing a three-and-out. The Owls offense responded by moving the Bulldog 45 where Jackson appeared to have found Dennis Parks behind the defense for an apparent touchdown, but the senior from San Antonio could not haul in the pass in. Jackson was sacked on the next play and the Owls were forced to punt.

Driskel led the Bulldogs to the Rice one on the next possession, but after a pair of tackles for loss, the Owls appeared to have stalled the drive when a third down Drisklel pass into the end zone was off the mark. But Rice was flagged for its second unsportsmanlike conduct penalty of the possession to refresh the downs and Kenneth Dixon took advantage, scoring from the one on the next play. Tech added another score just before the half to take a commanding 28-7 lead into the locker room and added to the margin by marching 75 yards on their first possession of the third quarter to extend the lead to 35-7.

Jackson personally drove Rice 50 yards to a field goal on the Owls first possession of the third quarter, continuously scrambling out of danger to gain 31 yards on eight carries before the drive stalled at the Tech 22. True freshman Hayden Tobola drilled a career-best, 40-yard field goal to end a run of 28 consecutive points by Tech.

After Driskel's fourth TD pass of the day extended the lead to 42-10, Jackson led Rice on a 75-yard scoring drive, culminating with a 15-yard touchdown toss to James Mayden, which allowed him to move into a tie for second on the Rice career list with 43 touchdown passes.

Senior defensive tackle Stuart Mouchantaf, who returned to action for the first time since the loss to Western Kentucky, said that any joy he felt in playing again was tempered by the results of the game. But he also had a reminder for his youthful teammates.

Nick Mullens threw for 386 yards and five touchdowns, four of them in a 35-point explosion in the second quarter to lead streaking Southern Miss to a 65-10 win at Rice Stadium.

GAME 1

The win was the Golden Eagles first in three tries at Rice Stadium and snapped the Owls 10-year Homecoming winning streak as well as the Owls' 15-game home winning streak in the month of November.

The teams traded punts on opening possessions before USM drove to the game's first points on a Mullens' 28-yard toss to Ito Smith. Rice forced a second punt on the Golden Eagles next possession, but the Golden Eagles offense found its footing over its next five possessions.

The outburst began when they converted a fake field goal for the second straight week, as holder Xavier Thigpen shoveled a pass to Tyler Sarrazin for a six-yard Mullens followed with scoring strikes of 50, 51, 13 and 16 yards to put the game away.

Rice was held to just 56 yards on 33 plays in the first half as quarterback Driphus Jackson was sacked five times. He was replaced late in the second quarter by Tyler Stehling, but returned in the fourth quarter to lead the Owls' lone touchdown drive.

He finished with 69 yards passing on 8-19 attempts and the one touchdown toss to Nate German. Darik Dillard led the Owls with 70 yards on the ground, followed by Austin Walter, who gained 65 on 10 attempts. Walter also returned nine kickoffs on the day, matching the second most in school history and finished with 176 yards, the seventh most in school history.

Senior punter James Farrimond finished with a

45.9 average and a career-high nine punts.

UTSA 34, RICE 24 Nov. 21, 2015 • Alamodome • San Antonio, Texas

The Rice Owls saw their hopes of extending Conference USA's longest active bowl streak come to an end as UTSA used a pair of second quarter turnovers to spark a 21-point explosion and hold on for a 34-24 win at the Alamodome in San Antonio.

The win was the Roadrunners (3-8, 3-4) first against Rice in four tries and also their first win at home in 2015, The loss was the Owls (4-7, 2-5) fourth straight and guaranteed they will finish with a losing record for the first time since 2011.

Rice started fast, taking an early 10-0 thanks to true freshman Hayden Tobola's career-long, 45-yard field goal on the Owls' first possession and a 58-yard touchdown pass from Driphus Jackson to Nate German.

After being held in check on their first series, the Roadrunners responded on their second series with a 71-yard drive to cut the margin to 10-7.

Jackson promptly moved the Owls to the UTSA 31, sparked by a 26-yar completion to Samuel Stewart, but two plays later, he saw his streak of 145 attempts

without an interception end at the UTSA 11.

UTSA took its first lead of the day eight plays later, 14-10, but Jackson and the Owls had a swift response of their own, moving 75 yards in eight plays to reach the end zone on a 26 yard toss to Zach Wright.

But that lead proved short-lived, as Jarveon Williams darted 78 yards on the first play from scrimmage. The Owls had held Williams to just 10 yards on his first nine carries, but he finished the night with 163 yards while becoming the first UTSA player to top 1,000 yards.

A sack and fumble gave UTSA the ball right back and four plays later they extended the lead to 28-17.

After giving up 167 yards in the second quarter, the Rice defense roared out of the locker room in the third, stopping UTSA's first three possessions for a combined eight yards, thanks in large part to sacks by Preston Gordon, Brian Womac and Derek Brown.

Womac's sack set up a short field for Rice after a Stewart punt return to the UTSA 46. A pair of Jackson passes to Parker Smith, who would lead the Owls with seven catches in his first career start, set up a three-yard touchdown run by Darik Dillard, which allowed the San Antonio native to combine with his brother Jarett to set an NCAA record for combined career touchdowns. It was his 22nd career score and the 82nd of their combined careers, one more than the Rodgers brothers (Jacquizz and James) of Oregon State.

But the Owls could not close any further. UTSA drove 96 yards on its fourth possession to extend the lead to 34-24, but a missed extra point gave the Owls an opening.

On their next possession after the touchdown, Rice moved to the UTSA nine, thanks in large part to a 43-yard completion by Jackson to German, but UTSA stopped the Owls on fourth and one from the UTSA five.

Jackson finished with 359 yards through the air and added 36 on the ground to finish with a career-high 395 yards of total offense. German topped 100 yards receiving for the first time in his brief career at wide receiver, finishing with 138 on four catches.

RICE 27, CHARLOTTE 7 Nov. 28, 2015 • Rice Stadium • Houston, Texas

With 30 minutes remaining in their college careers, faced with a scoreless first half and the prospect of ending the season with five consecutive losses for the first time in over a decade, the senior members of the Rice football team rallied their teammates as they have done so many other times in their careers, leading the Owls to 27-7 win over Charlotte on Senior Day at Rice Stadium.

The Owls fashioned a dominating third quarter in which they held Charlotte to 29 yards on just seven plays while scoring on each of their first five possession of the second half to record the 30th win since 2012, matching the 1949 senior class for the most wins over four years in Rice history. It also snapped a four-game losing streak for Rice (5-7, 3-5).

Senior Luke Turner led the Owls resurgent second half, rushing for 49 of his season-high 54 yards and throwing his first touchdown pass since 2013 to lead the Owls to their eight consecutive Senior Day win.

After the Owls honored 18 seniors in pregame ceremonies, the two teams battled to a scoreless draw in the first half. The teams entered the locker room at the half dead even in total yards (175) while Charlotte held a 41-38 advantage in plays.

Austin Walter provided a quick spark to the second half, returning the second half kickoff for 30 yards. Six plays later, Jackson found Nate German deep down the middle on a 34-yard pass play to set the Owls up the 49er three. Three carries by Turner netted just one yard and freshman Hayden Tobola came on to connect on a 19-yard field goal to break the scoring ice.

The Owls defense forced a quick three and out, and Turner took the helm for most of an 11-play, 66-yard scoring march that ended when he hit fellow tight end Cole Hunt on a jump pass for a four-yard touchdown. The scoring pass was the fifth of Turner's career, but his first since he threw a pair of scores in the Owls' 42-24 win over Marshall in the 2013 C-USA Championship game.

The second of his two tosses that day was to thenfreshman tight end Connor Cella for his first career score and his last as an Owl was Hunt's first career score.

Redshirt freshman Preston Gordon's tackle for loss force a punt on Charlotte's next possession and Turner and Jackson combined to lead the Rice on another 66-yard scoring march, with Jackson covering the final three yards.

After another ineffective series, Charlotte gambled on a fake punt, but a pair of seniors, Chandler Watkins and Garrett Fuhrman foiled the effort, setting up a second Tobola field goal from 23 yards to increase the margin to 20-0.

A fourth consecutive punt by Charlotte set the stage for the Owls' final scoring drive of the year, a six play, 59-yard effort that saw Jowan Davis carry the ball five times for 54 yards, the final 11 on his first touchdown of the year.




2016 RICE HONOR JERSEYS

to Rice as an assistant under Al Conover in 1971 and in 1978 he became Rice's first homegrown head coach when he succeeded Homer Rice. He coached the Owls from 1978-1983 and later coached at Lamar from 1986-90.
