

Go Ahead, Ask Me Anything! – How do I reach . . . ?

What **RISKS** are you willing to take for the sake of **OBEYING** God?

1. How do you explain Hebrews 10:26?

- **Deliberately keep on sinning = Apostasy.** Apostasy is a complete and public rejection of Jesus.
- **No sacrifice for sins is left . . .** If you turn from Jesus, what else is there?
- **Fearful expectation of judgment . . .** Your choice has eternal consequences.

2. Should we have non-Christian friends?

The only time you should cut off ties with a non-Christian friend is if they are a danger to you personally or because their presence in your life will cause you to stumble into sin.

If you are a Christian then you have something to share with people who are not.

- Your own personal story of how Jesus changed you.
- A simple Gospel message that can change them.

3. How do I find opportunities to share the gospel when everyone I know is already connected, except those on social media?

- **FAMILY** – Pray. Ask questions. Answer questions. Share personal stories. Talk about Jesus. Live consistent fruit before them.
- **FRIENDS** – The process is the same with family.
- **CO-WORKERS** – The process is the same here too.
- **INTENTIONAL STRANGERS** – Go to the same places and see the same people. Opportunities will come in time.
- **DIVINE APPOINTMENTS** – Pray for God to bring people across your path. Take action when He does.

4. (Reworded) What do Jews think of Jesus today?

5. How do I reach the angry, terminally ill person?

Psalm 13:1-2, Psalm 88, 90 See also: *The Art of Dying* by Rob Moll or *Don't Waste Your Cancer* by John Piper

Reaching a terminally ill person – especially an angry one – takes the patient endurance of a loving friend who ministers to them as if they were Jesus himself.

6. How does a Christian cope with Christians who become Jehovah's Witnesses or Atheists and stay friends?

1 Timothy 6:20-21

- Know Christianity yourself.
- Know what the other side thinks too.
- Keep the dialogue open and pointing to Jesus.

7. How do you handle the one who brought you to Christ being the furthest thing from Christ now? And how do you not doubt your own salvation?

How do we reach the wandering brother or sister? James 5:19-20; Galatians 6:1-2. Love prays. Love goes. Love reaches. Love perseveres. Love even takes rejection and goes again.

How do you stay secure in your own salvation? 1 John 2:1-2. You will stay secure when you always take YOUR SIN and JESUS' GRACE seriously. Life in Jesus always stays humble, repents when sin comes, and trusts in His goodness, not my goodness.
