OVERVIEW

Loveland High School is a comprehensive, four-year high school serving the southwestern Ohio communities of Loveland, Symmes Township and Miami Township. Loveland High School also serves career-technical students through affiliation with the Great Oaks Career Campuses.

Approximately 20 miles northeast of Cincinnati, the community is rural and suburban. Loveland City Schools lie within one of the fastest growing areas in southwestern Ohio. Light industry, local businesses, decreasing farms and ever-increasing commuters to nearby cities create a diversified middle socioeconomic community.

The current Loveland High School building was completed in 1994. Additions have been placed on the original building over the past several years. Eleven classrooms were added in 1995. In 2000, 16 classrooms, a second gymnasium, additional science labs and expanded music rooms were completed. In 2012, a new fitness facility was added.

SCHOOL SCHEDULE

Loveland High School operates on a four block schedule. The school day consists of four 90-minute blocks. Students involved in music have one split block. These students have 45 minutes of music for the entire year and 45 minutes of an academic class for the entire year. Additional full year 45-minute classes are also used in certain areas. Students may have two 90-minute blocks and two blocks with 45-minute, full-year courses for a total of six classes per day.

COURSE CREDIT

One credit is granted for satisfactory completion of courses that meet four blocks per week, 90 minutes per block, for 18 weeks. Half credits are earned for courses that meet for nine weeks. Physical Education courses earn .25 credits and meet for nine weeks. Advanced Placement (AP) Calculus BC, Biology, Chemistry, and Physics C meet 90 minutes for 36 weeks, earning two credits. All other AP classes meet 90 minutes for 18 weeks or 45 minutes for 36 weeks, earning one credit.

HONOR ROLL

Honor roll is determined each quarter, based upon quarter grades. A student with a quarter GPA of 4.0 or higher earns High Honor Roll with Distinction. A GPA of 3.50 and above earns High Honor Roll. A GPA of 3.00–3.49 earns Regular Honor Roll.

CONCURRENT MUSIC ENROLLMENT

Students participating in Jazz Band or Show Choir must enroll in two Band or Choir classes for a minimum of two years.

CUMULATIVE GPA AND CLASS RANK

Cumulative GPA and rank in class are determined by averaging all semester final grades except Physical Education, Resource, and courses taken for credit recovery. All semesters in high school are computed in the GPA and class rank.

GPA CALCULATION

GPA values are based upon the final grade. Physical Education classes are not calculated in the GPA. Honors and AP classes are weighted in the GPA calculation. The following values are used in calculating student GPA:

COLLEGE CREDIT PLUS

State legislation allows students to enroll in post-secondary institutions. Courses taken may earn both high school and college credit. As defined by the State of Ohio, one Carnegie unit of high school credit is earned for each 3, 4 or 5 semester hours of college credit successfully completed.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Loveland offers AP courses in Studio Art, Art History, Music Theory, Biology, Chemistry, Physics C, Physics I, Statistics, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, US Government and Politics, United States History, Macroeconomics, Psychology, English Lit/Composition, English Lang/Composition, Spanish Lang/Culture, French Lang/Culture, and Computer Science A.
