I have been thinking about those who came by sailing ship and marvelling at all the attributes they must have had. Could I have done what they did?

When I popped into the Maritime Museum for a few minutes while I waited for the ferry I got as far as the immigrants section and stood rocking slightly and looking at all the bunks. I tried to imagine 100 days and several children in these conditions. There were the pots for their food and perhaps a lantern for light. Could I have done as most of my great grandparents did to start a new life? Perhaps those who came from London were used to the crowded conditions and all the sounds and smells. I know the smells would have turned my stomach. Maybe those from the country and crowded cottages were more used to those conditions. Now added to all that there would have been sea-sickness and storms. How would I have managed that as well?

I will go back to the Museum where I think they have done a great display and spend some more time there where they also have a cabin from the time of the

"ten pound Poms."

For anyone who has not been there for sometime you can take evidence of your address in Auckland (now we are part of Auckland super-city) to get in free.

Also from the "Age of Sail" I recently saw the clipper ship "City of Adelaide" in Port Adelaide where they are restoring it. Unfortunately we could not go on a tour of it as they were water blasting it that day. It was built 1864 and is the sister ship of the "Cutty Sark" which I saw in Greenwich. Tours of these boats would probably give a picture of the life of a merchant seaman.



According to family stories my only seaman jumped ship in NZ so no records of which boat or what type it was.

The team are well on the way with recording their "men" and have uncovered some very interesting stories on the way.

We have been joined by a representative from the RSA, Frank Rands, who has been invaluable with help on the military side as he is in the Navy. He has provided details of all the transport ships and also military abbreviations. He has gone through Navy records but has found no navy men amongst our fellows.

It has been very humbling to see the delight and appreciation relayed to us from the living descendants of the soldiers. They have been so helpful with family information and photographs,



and, understandably, emotional when seeing the final result. They have been so grateful that someone has taken the time to tell their ancestor's stories.

The website has now been developed but it is not yet live. We need to get more profiles fully completed before we activate it for viewing. Like all genealogy, there always seems to be another detail turn up just when you thought you had it completed!

We are grateful to club members and the Wainui Historical Society for the records they have collected and developed over the years as these have provided quite a bit of family background and is right at our fingertips up at the library.

Black Out Cover for the Fiche/Film reader at the Whangaparaoa Library.

We have moved the reader to the centre of the table to allow better viewing of the reader screen. In the right corner of the first image you can see two wooden braces with a piece of black cloth folded on top of it. Place the two wooden braces on the table as in the middle image and lastly drape the cloth over the top of the reader and the braces to allow optimal viewing when the library is too brightly lit. Not the most elegant solution, but it will work till we can figure out how to solve this problem. After use, please return the braces and cloth back in their resting place for the next user. (There are no air vents on the back, top or sides of the reader so the machine will not overheat when being used like this – air vents are on the bottom left below the actual screen need to be kept clear)

Suggested transport to the Auckland Library includes – Using your Gold Card to travel free on the Hibiscus Coast – City buses. Purchasing a Day Pass \$16.00 (you need an Athop card additional \$5 one off cost) Buses from Gulf Harbour and Waiwera to the city all arrive at Wellesly Street walk down the hill and across to the library which is in

Lorne Street. (see map) Saturday / Sunday buses leave 10 past the hour from Army Bay. Little Manly (odd hours) & Big Manly (even hours) routes alternate. Orewa (Opposite Centerway dairy) 15 minutes to the hour. Bus passes can be purchased from Centerway Dairy (Orewa) or Rishworth Dairy 5/15 Karepiro Drive. Or done on line with your hopcard. Cash trip to the city will be \$10.50 each way.
