Today our children have grown up, and we have four beautiful grandchildren. We own a house in the Piedmont area of North Carolina, and I am now serving wonderful people as their pastors. Is that your beautiful and inspiring love story? Nothing interesting! that's right! Folks, readers, it may seem pointless, but for my wife and me, it's a brief overview of 35 happy years of marriage. This indicates a year full of the countless stories and memories we cherish, things that don't mean everything to us. The point is that there is no 'magic formula' to pattern your life after it will lead to a happy marriage. Each married couple is unique with their own hopes and dreams. In order for a marriage to be happy and successful, we share the story that God must be involved in marriage, and husbands and wives must include God as a partner in their marriage. But she is your companion and wife by covenant. 10:7-9 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and join his wife, and they will be one year old,' so they are no longer two years old, but one body. Therefore, let god not separate man from what he has gathered together. Marriage is a covenant that includes God! Do you faithfully promise and covenant with God to have these witnesses in many marriage ceremonies? contains words such as: If we make covenants with God, we are married on a much higher plane than simply agreeing to live together legally as husbands and wives. It means that we are willing to submit to the role That God must play in marriage. We will live by His rules. What is the purpose of marriage? 5:31-33 For this reason man will leave his father and mother to join his wife, and they will be one year old. This is a great mystery, but I say about Christ and the Church. Nevertheless, let each of you especially love your wife as you do, and let her see that she respects her husband. Evesian 5 shows how marriage is a kind of amazing love relationship between Jesus Christ, his bride, and the Church. No love can be greater! The Bible is the ultimate love story when it understands the whole concept and purpose. What is true love? 1 April 13:4-8 Love is long-suffering and kind. Love is not envious. Love is not bloated, the parade itself is not; They don't act rudely, they don't pursue themselves, they don't provoke, they don't think of evil. Rejoice in the truth without rejoicing in sin. Embrace everything, believe in everything, hope for everything, endure everything. Love never fails... Love is not an unbearable idea of being apart from a passionate desire for a lover. True love is based on an extroverted interest in the other. It's about self-sacrifice for the benefit of the person you love. Things go wrong in every marriage. What should I do if the problem is not my fault? Proverbs 14:12 There is a way to seem right to man, but the end is the way of death. Philip 2:3-5 Do nothing through selfish ambition or pride, but with a low heart, let each person have more respect for the other than he or she does. May each of you look not only for your own interests, but also for the benefit of others. This heart in Christ is in you. Jesus... Proverbs 15:1 The soft answer extants anger, but harsh words provoke anger. 1 Thessalonians 5:15 Behold that no one makes evil for anyone, and that they do not always seek good for themselves and for all. Over time, seemingly minor stimuli can get blown out of proportion, and before long, couples say or do unpleasant things with each other. The result? Controversy, conflict, and too often, shouting matches. It is often very difficult to see our own faults. We are always right in our own eyes, so we naturally place them in our condemnation. This mindset began to return to the Garden of Eden when Adam blamed Eve, who denounced the serpent (Genesis 3:12-13). But even if it's not really our fault, it doesn't help to loudly claim that someone else is all to blame. The optimal solution is instead to seek peace, not vengeance (Matthew 5:9; Romans 12:17-21). It involves pursuing a win-win strategy. The Bible sometimes shows that our good deeds can beat our pairs over time (1 Peter 3:1). Ideally, the two partners will eventually work together to solve their problems. Well-known marriage counselor H. Norman Wright gives the following advice: Some negative ways to deal with conflict are withdrawal, victory, concessions, compromises. The ideal way to handle disputes is to resolve them. It may take longer, but the relationship is strengthened and the needs are met on both sides (so you're getting married, 1985, p. 199). What should we say to help heal our relationships? Psalm 51:1, 10 (New Living Translation) Because of your unwavering love, O God, show me mercy. Because of your great compassion, I stain the stain of my sins... Create a clean heart in me, oh God. Renew the right spirit in me. Evesians 4:32 Be kind to each other, to forgive one other, to be sweet, and to forgive one other, just as God forgives you in Christ. Evesians 5:25 Husbands, love your wife as Christ loved the Church and gave himself for her... Titus 2:4 (New Life Translation) These elderly need to train young women to love their husbands and children. When we sin, first we must repent and be right with God. Then we can seek His help in restoring our relationship. In every marriage, there are a few phrases that can help heal the damage caused by conflict and controversy. The three main phrases are: 1. I'm sorry. Use this one often and mean it! Tell your spouse that you are sorry for saying or doing something that has upset him or her. Whether you're right or wrong, it doesn't matter. Your actions have had a negative impact on your beloved spouse and you should apologize for them. 2. Forgive me. Jesus Christ died to forgive our sins. His great sacrifice should motivate us to be willing to forgive others. 3. I love you. When sincerely said, this declaration cannot be overt. We need to know that we are loved by our loved ones. This short, serious phrase, backed by loving action, can put all our negative feelings, hurt, anger, and wrongs to rest and melt the hearts of those who hear these three beautiful words. Can the flames burn again? Some people may feel like romance and excitement have disappeared from their marriage. They stay together for convenience or for their children or other families, but as a well-known song asks, 'Where is love? Could my marriage be really happy? Proverbs 5:18-19 Your fountain is blessed, and you rejoice with the wife of the youth. With a lovely deer and an elegant doe, her breasts always satisfy you; Always hooked on her love. 9:9 All the days of vanity which you have given you in the sun, that ye live joyfully with a wife who knows all the days of your vain life; It's your part of life, and it's in the labor you perform in the sun. Yes, your marriage can be happy! The Bible reminds us that wives are God's blessings and reminds husbands to bring happiness to their wives starting in the first year of marriage (Proverbs 18:22: 24:5). In order to achieve happiness, it is important to maintain the perspective that we are not married, but our marriage. They are here together, and if they are lost, they must work together to return life and energy to marriage. If you've been married for years, find a way to rekindle the spark that sparked your marriage in the first days. What appeal did you give your spouse? Try dating your spouse again! Our useful booklet Marriage and Family: The Missing Dimension rekindled this desire by some marriage partners seeking love and modesty from God and doing things to show love to their partners. Many married people have found feelings they crave to return when they start working to unite the two (p. 19). Beyond romance, meds should also grow closer and become friendships. Consider this excellent advice: Enjoying your spouse as a friend and marriage partner will help you ignore many meds, such as financial or social relationships. Couples who almost inevitably remain in love should also be good friends. They will share the ups and downs that are common in marriage. (Gerald Aust, what is the key to a happy marriage? Did that mean I was really better or worse? As we saw in Malachi 2:14, marriage is a covenant, when we made our marriage vows, we probably repeated the same thing for better or worse; did we really mean it? No matter what happens in your marriage now, you can't work together to make things better; do you have the option to give up if things get worse? God says he hates divorce (Malachi 2:16) . His expectation is that you are committed to marriage for the rest of your life. Paul also instructed Church members not to divorce (7:10-11), and gave a narrow definition of the terrible circumstances under which Jesus Christ would allow divorce and remarriage (Matthew 19:3-9). The useful exercise to start regaining love in your marriage is to go back and watch a video of your wedding if you have it. Listen to what the pastor says, say that pledge to each other again. If you don't have Click this link to read the wedding. When you have tried everything you know to do, it can be helpful to seek wise counsel in difficult times (Proverbs 4:7, 11:14). Healthy, mature people are not afraid to seek help when needed. Can we learn love again? Ppsians 5:22-28 Wives are submissive to their husbands by the Lord. This is because the husband is the head of the wife, and because Christ is the head of the church; He is the Savior of the flesh and He is the Savior. So, just as the Church is the object of Christ, let your wives give everything to their husbands. Husband, love your wife, christ loves the church too and just as he gave himself for her, he can sanctify and cleanse her by washing water with words, he can present himself a glorious church, seat or wrinkles or nothing like that, but she should be holy and spotless. So a husband should love his wife with his body. A person who loves his wife loves himself. As we see, love should not be East Sea and soul. Love is an overt concern for others. True love builds the one you love, not tearing him or her apart. True love will want to give and serve others without selfishly ignoring the desires of the spouse. The husband should treat his wife like a queen, and the wife should treat her as a knight in shining armor. Or, as the Apostle Paul wrote in Evesian 5, we should treat each other like Christ and His Church. There's so much more to this section than we can handle.
