The Corona-Norco Unified School District offers no bus transportation for students residing in the seven neighborhoods in the north end of the Temescal Valley community. Parents must drive their children to and from Santiago High School and/or El Cerrito Middle School, located in Corona and El Cerrito, respectively. Because of the early-morning commuter gridlock on the I-15 freeway, the preferred route is Temescal Canyon Road.

As Temescal Valley grows – now an estimated population of 27,000, that narrow twolane stretch between Tom Barnes Street and El Cerrito Road becomes as gridlocked as the freeway. It often takes parents 45-minutes to drive their students to school, a distance of less than four miles.

On behalf of the Riverside County Board of Supervisors we write in support of Riverside County's request to secure an earmark for the Temescal Canyon Road Widening Project- El Cerrito Segment under the Congressional 2021 Surface Transportation Authorization Funding process. Dear Representative Calvert,

The County of Riverside proposes to widen the last segment of a 5.5-mile long improvement effort to Temescal Canyon Road between State Street and Interstate 15; in the unincorporated Riverside County that has not been widened to four lanes. The project under consideration will widen Temescal Canyon Road from two to four lanes, including constructing curb, gutter, sidewalk, ADA ramps, and bike lanes, from north of El Cerrito Road to Tom Barnes Street (0.7 miles); plus a 200-foot segment of widening north of Cajalco Road.

The proposed project will provide congestion relief, reduce response time of emergency service providers, provide a safe route to school for children, improve access for persons with disabilities, increase safety for pedestrians and bicyclists, promote active transportation, reduce vehicle emissions, and improve the quality of life for residents, businesses, and visitors along the Temescal Valley corridor.

The County of Riverside requests \$5 million in Surface Transportation Program funding for this \$45 million project to complete the Preliminary Engineering and Environmental Document phase and begin the right-of-way acquisition phase. If funded, both of those phases can be completed, and the funding expended by the end of September 2026.

The project will enhance the quality of life in Temescal Valley and have a positive impact on the health and safety of residents, businesses, and visitors.

The goals of the project are to:

- Provide congestion relief by widening the 2-lane rural road to a 4-lane highway
- Improve response time for emergency responders
- Provide enhanced safety for children walking to El Cerrito Middle School by providing sidewalks
- Improve mobility for disabled persons traversing through the area by providing accessible sidewalks, curb ramps, and pedestrian traffic signals
- Promote active transportation and enhance public health and safety by providing marked on-street bike lanes, resulting in a continuous 5-mile long bike lane corridor along Temescal Canyon Road
- Provide an improved circulation route for trucks hauling material from the quarry on Minnesota Road
- · Reduce vehicle emissions
- Accommodate planned infrastructure improvements consistent with the County of Riverside General Plan Circulation Element

Summary of Project

The County of Riverside proposes to widen 0.8 mile of Temescal Canyon Road from two lanes to four lanes with a center turn lane and on-street bike lanes. The limits of the project are from north of El

Cerrito Road to Tom Barnes Street, plus a 200-foot segment of widening north of Cajalco Road. The project includes full road reconstruction with added curb and gutter, sidewalk, accessible curb ramps, street lights, and relocated utilities. The project also includes reconfiguring offset intersections at two locations to improve traffic operations.

Located along 11 miles between the City of Corona and the City of Lake Elsinore, Temescal Canyon Road traverses the unincorporated area of Temescal Valley serving as the primary north-south arterial through the valley and often serving as an alternate route for motorists to bypass congestion on the I-15 freeway during peak commuting hours.

Currently, several segments of Temescal Canyon Road exist as a rural two-lane road and are currently loaded beyond the road's capacity due to increases in regional growth over the years. This congestion is having a negative impact on the quality of life of local residents. By widening Temescal Canyon Road to provide extra travel lanes, relief can be provided to residents. A future project to add express lanes to I-15 between Cajalco Road in Corona to Lake Street in Lake Elsinore is part of a larger goal to provide regional congestion relief.

In 2020, the County of Riverside completed the widening of two segments of Temescal Canyon Road totaling 1.3 miles between Dos Lagos Drive and Dawson Canyon Road. This next 0.8-mile segment of widening would provide a continuous 4-lane arterial highway for 5 miles between Diplomat Avenue and the Temescal Canyon Road interchange at I-15.

The proposed improvements will increase safety, reduce vehicle emissions, improve access for emergency service responders, promote active transportation, and improve the quality of life for residents, businesses, and visitors along the Temescal Valley corridor.

For these reasons, the City of Corona supports the County of Riverside's Temescal Canyon Road Widening Project (El Cerrito Segment). We respectfully request that this project be prioritized along with the top projects in the district.
